A WORD FROM THE PASTOR

Happy Mother's Day to our moms and all the wonderful women who have shown us a mother's love. Each of us has our own unique relationship with our mother. The virtues they teach us are many and varied love, patience, endurance, and sometimes

even courage. As a person who is not a parent, I often stand in awe at the strength mothers show for their family. I have seen tremendous sacrifices for the good of children and perseverance when the marriage relationship is sometimes hard.

And how many skills do we learn from our mothers? Cooking, sewing, folding clothes, making a bed, organizing, home economics, juggling appointments—- the list goes on! These are not exclusive to moms but often they are the ones who teach these skills.

My mother, Lillian, died when I was six, leaving behind a broken-hearted husband and four children. My memories of her are too few. Some, I have to admit, I'm not sure really happened as I recall them. But the snapshots I have in my mind are those of joy, a certain unpretentious casual elegance, and patience. When she was about to lose her temper, she would bite the side of her thumb. With us four, I'm surprised she still had it! I also remember her sickbed in our dinette, and my brother David jumping out of bed when he could hear her in distress. We learned at an early age that cancer is cruel.

She encouraged my father to remarry, and I feel certain she had a hand in bringing a wonderful woman to be my father's wife and a gift we would always call "Mom." My stepmother, (we never use that term) Marilyn, continues to be a source of joy and love, including having two more girls with my father. From her, I have learned patience, commitment and unwavering loyalty.

If your mother is still around, cherish her. If not, cherish her care from her place in heaven. To all our dear mothers, we love you! May our Blessed Mother Mary pray for us!

Creation Care Corner

"Celebrating the Anniversary of Pope Francis' transformational encyclical, Laudato Si'.

"Care for Creation" and Laudato Si' (Part 2)

The Pope's encyclical, Laudato Si', challenges us to rethink our relationship with nature.

- He reframes the environmental dialogue from a political discussion into language of faith. Creation, the natural world around us and all living things in it, is recognized as a precious gift from God to be revered by all.
- Our pervasive "throwaway" culture, combined with deforestation, and massive industrial and agricultural pollution is seriously degrading the earth, our common home.
- Francis also points out the solid scientific consensus that human activity is the main contributor to a warming climate and warns of a worsening crisis.
 Without change, additional harmful sea level rise, droughts, water shortages and negatively impacted crop yields are expected.
- Since the livelihoods of the poor will be most impacted, it becomes a moral imperative to take action.
- Pope Francis urges us to take action to mitigate these outcomes by working to protect our common home and by eliminating wastefulness in our lives.

Backgrounder on Immigration Reform, February 2021

"So then you are no longer strangers and sojourners, but you are fellow citizens with the holy ones and members of the household of God' (Eph 2:19). It is not just about migrants: it is about building the city of God and man." –Pope Francis, 105th World Day of Migrants and Refugees (2019)

Why is immigration reform important?

An estimated 10.5 million undocumented immigrants live in the United States and could be deported because of their lack of legal status. These individuals and their families have lived in the United States many years, participate in the workforce, and contribute to local society. However, they are at risk of mistreatment from local and federal law enforcement – including racial profiling – and exploitation by their employers, primarily due to their undocumented status. Immigration reform would include a legalization process that would provide protections for these vulnerable individuals and their families.

While the existing immigration system is majority family-based with procedures that help reunite and keep families together, currently immediate family members of legal permanent residents often must wait ten years or longer to legally join their loved ones in the U.S. In recent years, there have been efforts to dismantle the family-based immigration system which the Catholic Church opposes. It is critical to maintain an emphasis on family unity in the immigration system and craft legislation that will protect and strengthen family-based immigration.

Sister Eleanor was a member of the Mantellate Sisters, Servants of Mary, for 70 years. She died on May 2, 2021, at the age of 93, at Marian Lake Convent in Plainfield.

She was the principal of Saint George School in Tinley Park, Seven Holy Founders School in Calumet City and Saint Bridget's School in Hobart, Indiana.

She became the first Provincial of the newly formed American Province, and then volunteered to go to the Mantellate mission in Swaziland, South Africa.

She returned to work at Saint George School until 2004.

Sister Eleanor had a warm, sincere smile, abundant energy, and a passion and enthusiasm for educating children. Students knew she loved them. Sister Eleanor was always ready to hear or tell a good joke, and she brightened any room she entered.

BAPTISMS will take place at 11:30 AM Sunday Masses. The family must be registered. A baptismal preparation program is obligatory in advance; please call the parish office to register and for more information.

CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS is a program for anyone inquiring and seeking information about entering the Catholic faith. Contact the parish office.

WEDDING arrangements must be made four months in advance of the wedding date. You must be a registered parishioner for six months prior to making arrangements. Please schedule your church date before reserving your hall.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK / RECONCILIATION can be arranged by contacting the Parish Office to have a priest celebrate the sacraments with the person who is seriously ill or homebound.

ADORATION AND PRIVATE PRAYER: In church every Wednesday from 6:00 PM to 7:00 PM. (Please note that the schedule may change as more Masses resume.) You may come and go as is convenient for you during this time, but total attendance is limited to a maximum of 50 people, so please reserve your place using the link on the parish website or call the parish office at 708-532-2243.
