#### A DIFFERENT WORD FROM THE STAFF



Happy Advent!

We celebrate the season of waiting in anticipation before the Season of Christmas. This First Day of Advent is filled with hope. At least that is how most of us feel, or are expected to feel. In our present world of confusion and fear we know that Jesus is with us, and we are reminded that He will come again. But don't we see Jesus each time we come to receive Eucharist. Why do we have to wait... again?

Our scripture this week affirms that waiting brings hope, joy and peace. But it doesn't tell us it will be an easy

wait. Isaiah, the vigilant optimist, is ready to destroy weapons and rebuild them into farming tools to grow a sustainable future of promise and hope. Paul is very clear about telling us what we can do and what we shouldn't do, straightforward "conduct yourself properly." If we really looked into the message Paul has for us, we know what he means by that statement. Paul doesn't sugar coat anything with us today. What the Prophet Isaiah and Saint Paul have in common for us is that it is not easy being people of faith. When life throws us those unexpected curve balls, we duck, or we get hit square on and it takes us out. Paul and Isaiah are both giving us the tools we need to be prepared and have hope. We can survive life's challenges, because we look forward to Christ's coming.

As we begin the Season of Advent in the year of Matthew, Jesus is quite clear that we must stay awake, and be prepared for the time when the Son of Man will come. In Matthews Gospel, we will often see some sort of reference that Jesus makes to the Old Testament. Here He uses the story of Noah and the Ark. While Noah prepared for the flood, the others were unprepared or unwilling to prepare, and as a result, they were carried away by the waters. The message to stay awake is often repeated to the apostles whom we know tried, but often gave into sleep. Advent shows us the way to look at our own lives, at our own faith journey. Jesus coming as a child reminds us that we have an opportunity to be renewed, to look toward the future. With the message to stay awake and be ready, we know that we cannot live without hope. It is the hope in Christ that gives our faith journey purpose.

This past week we hope for new events on the horizon. Women of the parish came together and shared hopes and ideas on what could be possible for the future of creating a new Women's Group here at Saint George. We are looking with anticipation for the upcoming "Advent By Candlelight" event where we will pray together, share our faith together and have a pleasant evening with good people. Our young disciples preparing for Confirmation pitched in and helped create the gift tags for our Giving Trees, decorated the trees and had an unexpected lesson as they learned the details on what it takes to be a Minister of the Eucharist. Our hope is that one day they too will be serving in this beautiful ministry. On Wednesday, our 5th Grade Children's Faith Formation students led their community in prayer honoring the saints, with the hope that we will work to become saints with a capital "S". We live in anticipation that our future and the birth of Jesus brings a renewed spirit of hope.

On Thursday, December 15 at 7:00 PM, the Marian Fellowship Group will host a prayer service to our Lady of Guadalupe in the Church.





#### THE ADVENT WREATH



The Advent Wreath is a tradition related to Advent, the Church season immediately preceding Christmas. The Advent Wreath is a popular tradition among many Christians, Catholic and

Protestant. It is often used in homes, churches, and schools.

The Advent wreath, first used as a Christian devotion in the Middle Ages, gets its design from the customs of pre-Christian Germanic and Scandinavian cultures, who used candles and greenery as symbols of light and life during winter. The Advent Wreath is a circular evergreen wreath with four or five candles, three purple, one rose, and (if you use the five-candle model), one white one for Christmas Day placed in the center. Some Christians use blue candles instead of purple.

The candles symbolize the light of Christ coming into the world. The evergreen symbolizes renewal, and the circular shape symbolizes the completeness of God. The candle colors are derived from the traditional liturgical colors of Advent (purple and rose) and Christmas (white). Each candle is first lit on the appropriate Sunday of Advent, and then the candles may be lit each day as a part of the individual or family's daily prayers.

Certain candles have been given various names and designations:

Candle 1. Hope and/or Patriarchs (purple)

Candle 2. Peace and/or Prophets (purple)

Candle 3. Joy and/or John the Baptist (rose)

Candle 4. Love or The Virgin Mary (purple)

Candle 5. Christ The Light of the World (white)

**Directions:** Light the first purple candle.

**Prayer:** Stir up Your power, O Lord, and come, that by Your protection we may be rescued from the dangers that beset us through our sins; and be a Redeemer to deliver us; Who lives and reigns with God the Father in the unity of the Holy Spirit, ever one God, world without end. Amen.

O Emmanuel, King and Lawgiver, Desire of the nations, Savior of all people, Come and set us free, Lord, our God.




## SAINT GEORGE SCHOOL P.A.R.T.

## HOW DO WE CHANGE OUR CULTURE OF DEATH?

Pope John Paul II noted that the structure of man's sin is characterized or manifest on a universal scale in our Culture of Death. He pointed out that the powerful are easily able to manhandle the weak (e.g. abortion and euthanasia). Therefore, first and foremost, we must first recognize God's saving action and saving mission, and then participate in it. This has always been, and will always be the Church's role. We love because He loved us first (1 Jn. 4:19), and we spread that love through our testimony to the nations (Acts 1:8).

We must try to influence our culture with our words and deeds, realizing that the purpose of evangelization is always to introduce man to the Person of Christ, and the Person of Christ to man, that man might enter into His mystical body, the Church. Thus, through grace attained by turning to Him, the culture of death can indeed be transformed, simply because the Gospel always has the power to transform the hearts of men...even when the culture seems most evil, hopeless and perverse.

Faith and religious community representatives can promote safety and restore personal integrity and self-esteem to the victim, and can suggest batterer intervention services for the abuser, but should not engage in couples counseling unless the long-term safety of the survivor, and of staff, can be assured.

The **Invest in Kids Act Tax Credit Scholarship** Program helps children from low-income homes receive scholarships that cover up to 100% of a Catholic school's tuition. Thanks to this program, thousands of students are gaining knowledge in a faith-filled environment in Archdiocese of Chicago Catholic Schools.
