A WORD FROM THE PASTOR



These beautiful days of Advent guide along into the joy of Christmas. Anticipation is a beautiful feeling. It is a sign of our hope for better things yet to come. What could be a more hopeful joy than waiting for the birth of Our Savior? Anticipation also means preparation. The best way we can prepare for the birth of Jesus is to make our hearts ready to receive Him. And the best way to do that is to celebrate the

gift of reconciliation. This beautiful sacrament puts us in touch with that which is beautiful and flawed within us and brings us to the beautiful and flawless love of God. Faithfulness to the Gospel, which is the fount of all hope, brings purposefulness and happiness into our lives that nothing on earth can offer.

This Wednesday, we will be offering the Sacrament of Reconciliation at 6:30 PM in church. Everyone is invited. We have at least seven priests who will be hearing confessions. Please join us for a beautiful evening of peace and forgiveness.

In other news, I recently received word that for the first time in many years, Saint George surpasses our goal for the Annual Catholic Appeal! The most recent figures show us having surpassed our goal of \$56,469 by \$872. (The goal is set by a percentage of our Sunday and Holy Day collections. Anything over that amount comes back to Saint George for our choice of use.) This money will be used towards some badly needed new Mass vestments. To all who made and fulfilled their ACA promises, we thank you!

As we approach Christmas, I urge you to invite people you know to join us for Mass on this very holy day. Christmas is a unique moment when connections can be made, and broken relationships healed. Too many in our own Catholic family have a painful relationship with the Church for a variety of reasons. But the Church has a great deal to offer and the only way some people will hear about it is through you. Your role in spreading the Gospel through simple invitation cannot be overestimated. You may be surprised how much a good word from you can mean. Jesus is anxiously awaiting His People to greet Him. We don't want anyone to miss out!



The **Invest in Kids Act Tax Credit Scholarship** Program helps children from low-income homes receive scholarships that cover up to 100% of a Catholic school's tuition. MINISTRY OF CARE: Mandated Agape Ministers of Care are available to visit, pray with, and bring Holy Communion to those who are sick and unable to attend Mass. Notify the parish office when this service is needed.

REGISTRATION: We welcome new members with open arms. Please call the parish office for more information.

STEWARDSHIP involves your time, talent and treasure. Contact the parish office for assistance in getting started in any of the Parish's ministries and organizations.
