

A WORD FROM THE PASTOR



Today's first reading shows us the evil King Ahaz, who desecrated the Temple and brought in foreign altars to make illicit sacrifices. He was the son of a faithful king, Jotham, and his son, Hezekiah, would undo his father's sacrilege. In the reading, the Lord offers Ahaz a sign, to show He is willing to save Israel. Ahaz responds that he would rather not tempt the Lord but rely on his allies, the Assyrians. The prophet Isaiah warns King Ahaz that God

wouldn't put up with him for long. But this conflict gives Isaiah an opportunity to extend a promise, a promise of a savior. He says:

Therefore the Lord himself will give you this sign: the virgin shall conceive, and bear a son, and shall name him Emmanuel.

There are many such promises throughout the Old Testament. This is the promise made to the Israelites that sustained them for centuries. Often the fulfillment of that promise was an image of a warrior king who would make Israel the foremost world power. God, however, had a different plan.

Next weekend, we will see how God's Plan would unfold. The birth of Our Lord in a manger, a feedbox for animals, in a stable, would alter the old images. The Apostles themselves sometimes fell into the warrior mentality, waiting for Jesus to assert His power. But they expected a political power. Jesus came bearing the power of the Kingdom of God, a kingdom of peace, charity and unity.

I hope these last days leading to Christmas will give you those same gifts. We seek peace for our troubled world. We pray for an end to the violence we see in our streets. We struggle to find a more civil public discourse. We seek an end to the violence inflicted within families.

We pray that charity will become the cornerstone of our lives. We are called to the charity that not only responds to immediate needs of the hungry, homeless and sick. The charity we are called to also desires to change the injustices that drags one people under another, that keeps some people rich at the expense of others.

And during these last days before Christmas, we pray for unity within the Church, the peoples of the world, in our families, and even for a unity within ourselves.

My prayer for you is that you will find peace in prayer, charity for others and unity with God, your family and friends. I hope you will join us for Mass as we welcome the Christ Child. God bless you!



The **Invest in Kids Act Tax Credit Scholarship** Program helps children from low-income homes receive scholarships that cover up to 100% of a Catholic school's tuition. Thanks to this program, thousands of students are gaining knowledge in a faith-filled environment in Archdiocese of Chicago Catholic Schools. Your support helps educate the next generation of Catholic student leaders and builds on a brighter future for all.

What is a Tax Credit Scholarship?

Tax Credit Scholarships cover tuition and fees for the 2023/24 school year. REGISTRATION: We welcome new members with open arms. Please call the parish office for more information.

STEWARDSHIP involves your time, talent and treasure. Contact the parish office for assistance in getting started in any of the Parish's ministries and organizations.
