

FROM THE PASTOR

This weekend we begin a series of three Gospels that are central to our story as Christians. These Gospels are a bit longer than we are used to but they are stories worth hearing. Today we are introduced to the Woman at the Well. She is a Samaritan, and Jews and Samaritans were bitter enemies. Jesus approaches her, asking for a drink of water, a shocking thing for a Jewish man to do. A Samaritan woman and a Jewish man speaking to each other was unheard of. But Jesus was all about breaking down barriers.

Next week, we will hear about The Man Born Blind. "Was it his sin or a sin of his parents that caused him to be born blind?" the disciples ask. Jesus sets them straight on that right away. As usual, Jesus helps the blind man, and as usual, the Pharisees give both Jesus and the cured man a hard time.

Lastly, we will hear about The Raising of Lazarus. Jesus seemingly delays going to help his friend as he was dying, even though He wasn't far away. This puts Lazarus' sister, Martha, on edge. She challenges Him. Jesus calms her and promises great things to come. I like that this story gives us a kind of permission to question God. Martha is asked to affirm her faith in Jesus, which she does. So even the most faithful among us can have questions, and this story shows it is alright.

Each of these three beautiful stories come from Saint John's Gospel. They all have a similar pattern of people not knowing Jesus, coming to understand Him, and finally coming to faith and recognition of who He truly is, Our Savior. Over these weeks at the 9:30 AM Mass, we will pray with those preparing for the Easter sacraments.

These Gospels, in some way, reflect their experience of conversion. Those to be baptized, confirmed and receive the Eucharist have been preparing for several months. Now they have reached a point in which we as a parish hear them profess their desire to become Christians and live it in the Catholic Church. These rituals are called the Scrutinies, a terrible term of our Catholic jargon, which simply means they will be questioned and prayed for as they come closer to the great Easter Vigil, when they will receive the sacraments.

So it is a very good time for us to begin our Lenten Parish Mission. You will meet Father Brian Walker, O.P. who will lead us in prayer and reflection. I hope you will join us for this first mission since COVID. Father Walker will speak at all the Masses this weekend. Then he will offer a presentation tonight (Sunday), Monday and Tuesday. On Wednesday, we will have our Parish Reconciliation Service at 6:30 PM. And on Saturday, Deacon Jerry will lead a day of reflection. It's a busy week! Please join us for these beautiful opportunities to deepen your faith this Lent.

Cardinal Cupich, called on the people of the Archdiocese of Chicago to take part in a global effort to celebrate the 10th Anniversary of Pope Francis' election to the papacy by praying the Hail Mary 10 times. You can register your participation on the campaign by lighting a digital candle on https://www.decimusannus.org/site/index. The page may be in Italian but there is an option to translate into English.

LENTEN REGULATIONS

Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years old and older on Ash Wednesday and on all the Fridays of Lent. Fasting is to be observed on Ash Wednesday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 59. Those who are bound by this may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted. The special Paschal fast, as well as abstinence, are prescribed for Good Friday and encouraged for Holy Saturday.

Stations of the Cross will be performed at 7:00 PM on Friday nights during Lent.

EUCHARISTIC ADORATION

Tuesdays, March 21, 28 and April 4 from 6:00 PM to 7:00 PM. Note: Holy Family Chapel will be closed during the Triduum (April 6, 7 and 8).

SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION

THE PARISH AS A SCHOOL OF PRAYER

The three disciplines of Lent are Almsgiving, Fasting, and Prayer. My hope and prayer is that Saint George Parish, through the journey of Lent and into Easter, will become a School of Prayer! Where to begin- the Eucharist. How do we enter into communion - but through prayer! In his book, 7 Secrets of the Eucharist, Vinny Flynn, writes: "The Church has always emphasized a time of preparation before Communion and a time of thanksgiving after Communion to properly dispose our minds and hearts to enter into the deeper relationship of mutual love and unity to which the sacrament calls us... How seriously the saints took this! And what stark contrast there is between their preparations and thanksgivings and the all too prevalent tendency today to simply attend Mass, receive Communion, and leave immediately after the final blessing." (p.66-67).

To help our parish become a School of Prayer, during Lent and into the season of Easter, I invite you to pray this prayer of preparation before Communion and to pray this prayer of thanksgiving after Communion:

A Prayer of Preparation (Vinny Flynn)

Mary, you were the first one asked to believe that God himself wanted to take flesh in you. Come now into my heart, and help me to believe that this same God wants to live in me. Prepare my Heart to receive Him, sweeping it clean of anything impure or unholy. And as I say "Amen," let it be a "Fiat", a complete "Yes" to his will and joyful acceptance of His life within me. Amen.

A Prayer of Thanksgiving (Alice Clair Mansfield)

Our Lady of the Most Blessed Sacrament, pray for me that I may become, like your Son Jesus, Bread for the life of the world. Through Him, with Him and in Him, may my life be a joyful, living sacrifice of love and praise to the honor and glory of God our Father. Amen.



THIRD OF WEEK—OVERCOMING DISASTER A STORY OF HOPE FROM THE PHILIPPINES



Raul and Rhodora Enecillo live on their farm in Northern Samar, Philippines, with their granddaughters Loraine and Kate.

Raul and Rhodora get up at 5:00 AM each day to tend to the fishpond, pigs

and chickens before getting their granddaughters off to school. Education is important to Raul and Rhodora. Their dream is that Loraine and Kate will graduate from college and get good jobs - Loraine wants to be a doctor when she grows up.

For years, Raul and Rhodora worked hard as coconut farmers. After harvesting, they prepared the coconuts for making oil - but it took a lot of work before they made money. On top of that, periods of heavy rain caused flooding, making farming difficult.

Then Raul and Rhodora participated in a Catholic Relief Services program where they received training and assistance to build their own fishpond. They bought little fish to stock the pond, fish food and a net. The fish grew bigger, and soon they were able to sell them at the market. The fishpond also provided food for their family so they could enjoy nutritious meals together.

"Life is so much easier now that we have the fish for our daily living," Rhodora says.

In the program, Raul and Rhodora also learned how to better prepare for the increasing natural disasters in their area - like typhoons, flooding, earthquakes and landslides. They made improvements to their house, using stronger, sturdier materials to protect their home and family.

Since joining the program, Raul and Rhodora added two more fishponds along with pigs and chickens. With the extra income from their farm, their granddaughters can enjoy their childhood and live a more comfortable life, giving them the opportunity to study hard and finish school.

"I have many dreams for my family and my grandchildren," Raul says. "I hope I can give them something good." Page 13 March 12, 2023


