**FROM THE PASTOR**

One of the greatest fears many of us shares is the possibility of losing our eyesight. I deeply admire people who are in that situation and function amazingly well. It is inspiring and a sign that even when we find ourselves in difficult or loss, we still have possibility and purpose. Today's Gospel tells us of a man who was born blind and the controversy, not so much around his condition, but on Jesus' intervention to bring sight. These Gospel stories we hear in the second half of Lent foreshadow Jesus' coming passion and His ultimate victory.

Last week, we had the blessing of hearing Father Brian Walker, as he lead us in our parish mission. I want to thank everyone who helped by assisting with the services and hospitality. The challenges of our faith are many. Our world brings these into sharper focus every day. The price was paid on the cross. Our hope is found in the empty tomb.

Today our little ones who are preparing for their First Holy Communion will share in a retreat day. This will help them get ready for a beautiful moment in their lives. The most important preparation, though, is in simply being at Mass regularly with the

family. The church itself must be familiar, comfortable and special. These can only happen with regular family Mass attendance. This can be a wonderful opportunity for us to reflect on the meaning of the Eucharist. The gift of Jesus Himself, His sacrifice and His strength, can be ours. Sometimes the road ahead is bumpy. We need to be spiritually nourished and the Eucharist is our surest strength.

This Friday, our young people will take part in a Confirmation retreat. Bishop Kevin Birmingham will be with us next month to send down the Holy Spirit upon them with the Seven Gifts of the Holy Spirit. It might be fun to take a moment to think back on your own Confirmation. What name did you choose? What inspired that choice? Who was your sponsor and why did you pick them? Did your Confirmation bring you any particular gifts or blessings you are aware of today? If you have yet received the Sacrament of Confirmation, maybe now is the time, regardless of age, to consider it. To be considered fully brought into or initiated, into the Church, a Catholic is baptized, confirmed and has received the Eucharist. It's a package deal and one worth pursuing!

The year 2024 will be our parish's 90th anniversary. This calls for a celebration! If you would be interested in helping us organize some events around this occasion, please join me on Monday, March 27 at 7:00 PM in the Parish Center. Let's make the coming year a true celebration of our lived faith at Saint George.

LENTEN REGULATIONS

Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years old and older on Ash Wednesday and on all the Fridays of Lent. Fasting is to be observed on Ash Wednesday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 59. Those who are bound by this may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted. The special Paschal fast, as well as abstinence, are prescribed for Good Friday and encouraged for Holy Saturday.

STATIONS OF THE CROSS

Stations of the Cross will be performed at 7:00 PM on Friday nights during Lent. Living Stations will be presented by the teens on April 7.

EUCCHARISTIC ADORATION

Tuesdays, March 21, 28 and April 4 from 6:00 PM to 7:00 PM. Note: Holy Family Chapel will be closed during the Triduum (April 6, 7 and 8).

SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION

Private reconciliation is scheduled on Saturdays from 2:30 PM to 3:30 PM during Lent. Confessions will not be heard on Holy Saturday.

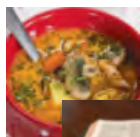

SOUP AND THEOLOGY



Soup and Theology will be offered Monday evenings during Lent, beginning at 6:30 PM. This year, we will be using Bishop Barron's series titled "Conversion". We will share some delicious soup, and hopefully, have great conversations about a few characters in the bible who had

a particular experience of hearing God's words. Bishop Barron takes each story of conversion as he sees it apply to our own experiences.

Soup will be available at 6:30 PM with fellowship. We will open the session with prayer, followed by a 10-15 minute video presented by Bishop Barron. With that we will share stories and insight in small groups connecting what we heard, what we read and how it all speaks to us on our faith journeys. Each evening's session is independent and is not contingent on attending the previous week.

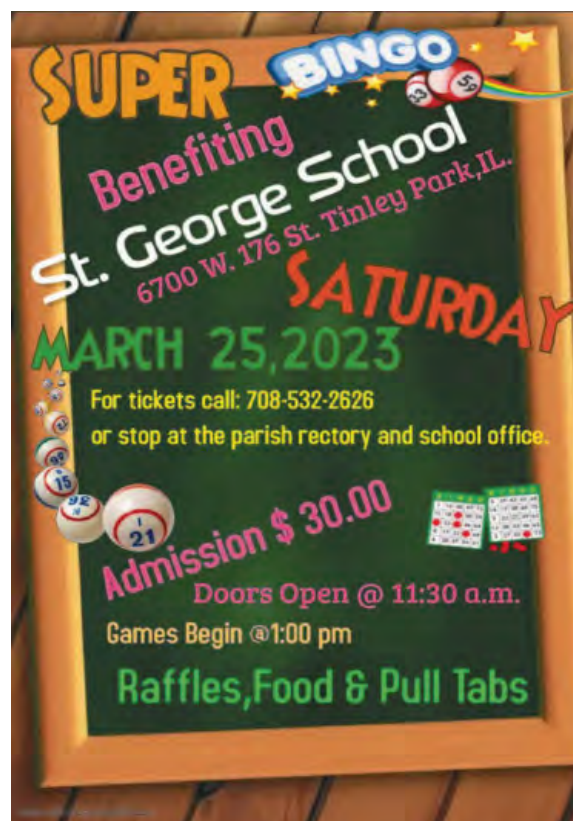

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION



Hello Saint George Catholic community. My name is Grace Gaelle Miafo Temfack.

I was born in Cameroon (a country in Central Africa) on July 15, 1994. I spent my childhood and younger years with my parents and siblings back home. I was exposed to Christianity when I was seven years old listening to Gospel songs, being surrounded by Christians and attending Sunday Mass. I knew and felt by then that there was something

strong and particular between God and me, something special that I could not describe. I was not praying that much - I will say I didn't even know how to pray. I didn't have that feeling. When I turned twelve, I started a Catechism program. I liked it; but unfortunately, it was not possible to keep up with my school schedule. Even though I stayed on my weekly Mass routine, my faith to God was skipping up and down. My feeling for Christianity ebbed and flowed.

My next exploration with my relationship with God started when I went to the university program in 2012 in another city. I felt disconnected and I stopped attending Masses for awhile, but God was always showing me in one way or another His blessings in my life and my family. Every single goodness for me and my family at that time was just a Miracle, a Graciousness from God.

Later, on November 2019, I moved to the United States of America, and a few months later the spring lockdown due to COVID-19. That was a difficult period for me as an outsider in a foreign land, but my host family was everything for me. They were awesome, just what I needed - they are my blessing. God was good. He was always there for me and always answered my prayers and thoughts. Later, churches opened again, and I started attending Masses. I understand that being Christian is more than going to church. It is improving the world around us, and working our faith to know God more. I felt the desire to dedicate myself to Jesus, my Lord and Savior.

I asked a friend more about Catholic faith, and in 2022, I started attending Saint George Catholic Church with my family. I felt so good during the Masses, enjoying the words of God and meeting other parishioners. We were welcomed with so much love and warm greetings.

I decided to send an email inquiry and soon received a warm reply from Father Paul who referred me to Jeanne Lassandrello, responsible for the RCIA program. The first contact with Jeanne was incredible. She introduced me to what Catholic Faith is all about, we did talk about my life, religious life, my expectations in joining the RCIA program, and here we are today.

I enjoyed learning about the Catholic faith with members from two other parishes - the process is special because we learn from each other. Through self-reflection, I noted I didn't know that much on Catholicism and God. I have learned everything I needed from the RCIA meeting. I have realized faith isn't just something you learn, it's a continuous intention of work and growth from within. I'm learning that it's not always a straight line, and that's okay. Sometimes unexpected things happen, but your faith will always lead you back to where you belong. Most importantly, I'm learning that this journey isn't just about me and God, but includes my relationship with everyone. The RCIA team has been so warm, informative, and has done an amazing job creating a safe space for everyone to share their faith journey. I'm growing more and more in my faith and finding new reasons to be grateful to our Lord for leading me here.

I couldn't have asked for better sponsors than Ayuk Akat and Melanie who have shown so much compassion and kindness. I'm in such awe of God's grace, the importance of the sacraments, and the growth I've seen in myself, and how I treat and communicate with others. This journey is truly a lifelong process, and I hope that I can continue to grow and learn from it, while also being a light for others. My gratefulness also goes to the Saint George parish family, friends, staff, my RCIA family and to the Saint Elizabeth Seton, Saint Stephen Deacon and Martyr representatives for their help and the availability to strengthen my life journey and relationship with our Lord.

KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS COMEDY SHOW 2023



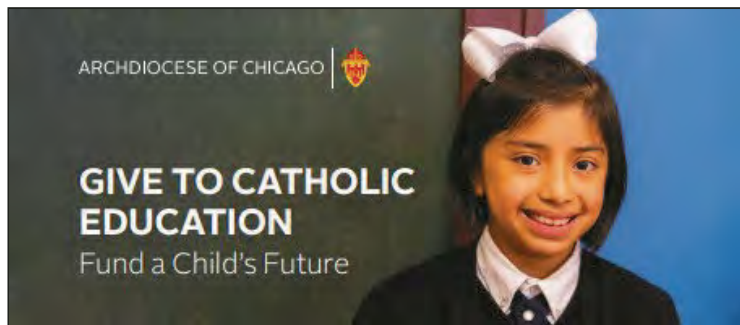
The annual Knights of Columbus Comedy Show is back for this year and will be held on Saturday, April 29 at Saint Julies Devine Center.

FLOSSMOOR 40 DAYS FOR LIFE VIGIL

Please join the 40 Days for Life vigil at Planned Parenthood in Flossmoor on any day through April 2. Thursday is a known abortion day, so that would be a good day for on-site prayer for the victims of abortion. Join other Saint George parishioners from 10:00 AM to 11:00 AM on any Thursday from March 9 through March 30, or choose any hour from 8:00 AM to 4:00 PM (ending at 5:00 PM) for prayer on site at the Planned Parenthood abortion facility in Flossmoor, Illinois at 19831 S. Governors Highway. Public parking is available 1/2 block north of the Planned Parenthood site on 198th Street which goes west from Governors Highway, or along the alley that runs east from Governor's Highway behind the Vollmer Road strip mall (parking spots facing Planned Parenthood).

This vigil is part of the national call for 40 days of prayer and fasting for an end to abortion running from February through April 2 and is one of nearly 600 in 30 nations. During these 40 days, please make an extra effort to pray and fast for the end of abortion in our nation (e.g. make extra visits to Holy Family Chapel and/or attend weekday Mass). FOURTH WEEK OF LENT - WATER FOR LIFE A STORY OF HOPE FROM KENYA



Turkana, Kenya is very hot and dry. Temperatures reach the mid-90s year-round. Most people in this area raise livestock such as goats and camels, and a few are

farmers. But the climate makes this work difficult - and climate change is making it even harder.

Rebecca and her husband, Lotiang, have farmed and raised goats for years. They rely on rain and river water to irrigate their crops and feed their animals. But it is raining less and less in Turkana, and - when it does rain - it can be unpredictable and intense, leading to floods that wash away the seeds. "We struggled to water our farms," Rebecca says.

Rebecca and Lotiang have worked hard so their family can thrive. Their determination - and hope for their children's futures - helped them overcome the challenges they faced.

They participated in a Catholic Relief Services program that installed a water well in their village and trained them in new farming techniques. With the well and solar-powered pump, they can irrigate their fields regularly and take care of their goats. Their children love to help with the goats!

Lotiang learned to grow kale, which provides nutrition for his family and can be sold for a high price at the market. Rebecca is grateful that her children can eat healthy food every day. She is also happy that she can send them to school using money from the produce Lotiang sells at the market.



Rebecca and Lotiang have become leaders in their community and teach others what they learned so that everyone can benefit. "I learned much in CRS' program," Rebecca

says. "It is a program that has changed my life. I am trying to show my community what I am able to do so that they can emulate it for a better future. Through that I will change my community." Visit crsricebowl.org to learn more about Rice Bowl and how you can help.

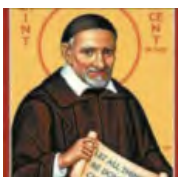
