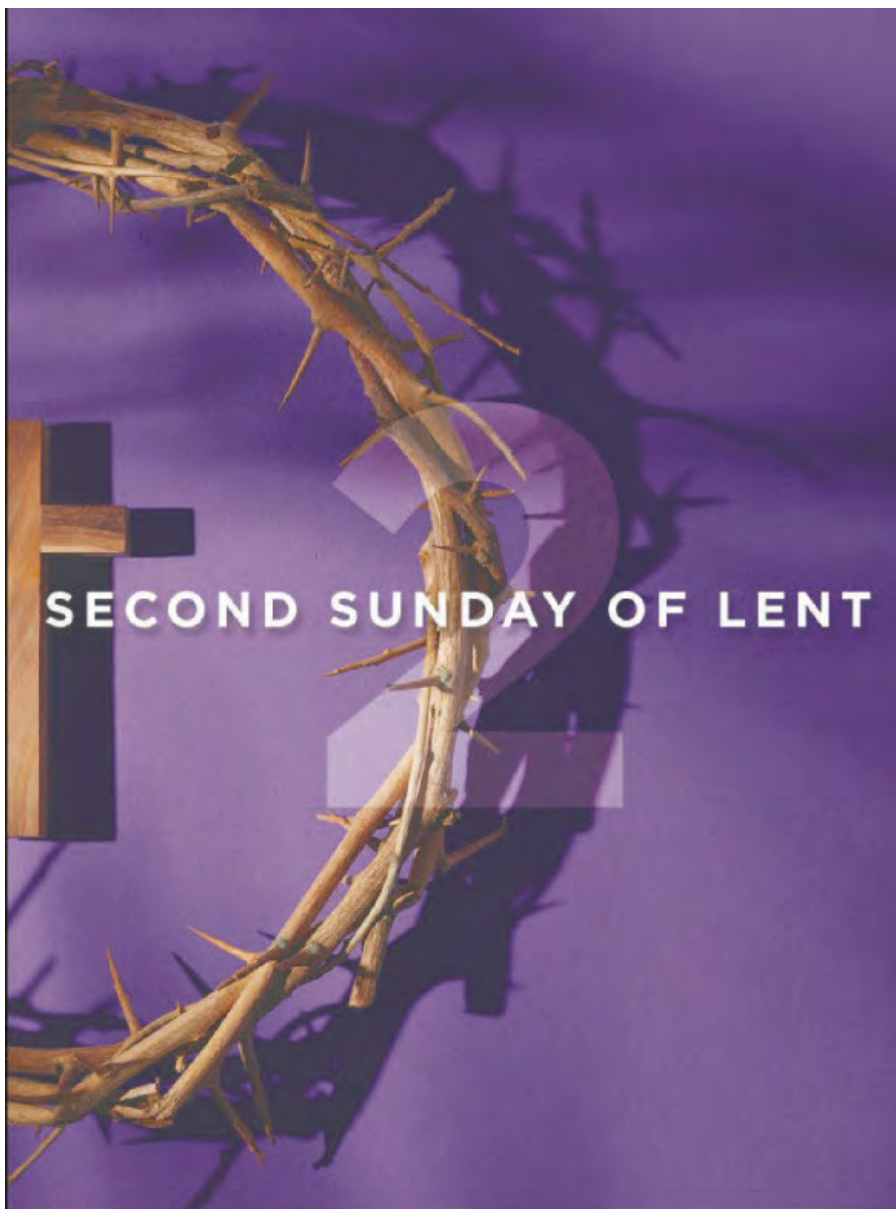

As you know, we will soon be hosting a Lenten Parish Mission with Father Brian Walker, O.P., on March 12, 13 and 14. Father's theme will be "To Praise, To Bless, To Preach." Father Brian will also preach at all the Masses on March 11 and 12. I have known Father since high school. Yes, a very long time! He has preached all over the United States and beyond. We already have about a dozen people who spoke to Tim about joining. That's great! Even if you just like hanging around musical people, there's always a lot of organizational work to be done. Give it some thought. Don't hide your light under a basket!

On a personal note, I just made an appointment for my annual physical. I urge everyone to be sure to take care of the gift God gave you. Our bodies need attention. I am always dismayed and saddened when I hear about people who discover they are seriously ill but found out too late because they "don't like going to the doctor." LENTEN REGULATIONS

Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years old and older on Ash Wednesday and on all the Fridays of Lent. Fasting is to be observed on Ash Wednesday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 59. Those who are bound by this may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted. The special Paschal fast, as well as abstinence, are prescribed for Good Friday and encouraged for Holy Saturday.

STATIONS OF THE CROSS

Stations of the Cross will be performed at 7:00 PM on Friday nights during Lent.

EUCCHARISTIC ADORATION

Tuesdays, March 7, 21, 28 and April 4 from 6:00 PM to 7:00 PM. Note: Holy Family Chapel will be closed during the Triduum (April 6, 7 and 8).

SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION

The Parish Reconciliation Service will take place on Wednesday, March 15 at 6:30 PM.

Private reconciliation is scheduled on Saturdays from 2:30 PM to 3:30 PM during Lent. Confessions will not be heard on Holy Saturday.

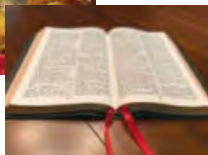

SOUP AND THEOLOGY



Soup and Theology will be offered Monday evenings during Lent, beginning at 6:30 PM. This year, we will be using Bishop Barron's series titled "Conversion". We will share some delicious soup, and hopefully, have great conversations about a few characters in the bible who had a particular experience of hearing God's words. Bishop Barron takes each story of conversion as he sees it apply to our own experiences.

Soup will be available at 6:30 PM with fellowship. We will open the session with prayer, followed by a 10-15 minute video presented by Bishop Barron. With that we will share stories and insight in small groups connecting what we heard, what we read and how it all speaks to us on our faith journeys. Each evening's session is independent and is not contingent on attending the previous week.

A LENTEN RETREAT HOSTED BY THE MARIAN FELLOWSHIP GROUP

The Marian Fellowship Group is hosting a Lenten Retreat: The Eucharist and the Spiritual Works of Mercy. Our presenter will be Deacon Jerry.

The Good Samaritan parable defines "neighbor love" as the practice of mercy. In response to the question "Who is my neighbor" one might answer "the man lying wounded along the road." But it is not.

The answer is the Samaritan. The neighbor is the one who shows mercy. In The Face of Mercy, Pope Francis's first words identify Jesus Christ as the face of mercy. This Jesus comes to us in a special way, in a real way, every time we receive the Eucharist at Mass. So, mercy is extended to us in and through the Blessed Sacrament. At the end of Mass, one of the options for the words of dismissal is, "Go in peace, glorifying the Lord by your life." Through this retreat, we will learn to live what we believe. We are to become another Christ, the Face of Christ, the Face of Mercy, to every person we encounter, the familiar and the unfamiliar, the lovable and the unlovable.

The retreat will take place on Saturday, March 18. Check-in for the retreat is at 8:00 AM (coffee and donuts) and will begin with morning prayer in the Sanctuary at 8:30 AM. PERSISTENCE TO SUCCEED

A STORY OF HOPE FROM HONDURAS

Rony is a farmer who lives with his wife Reina and two children about two hours from Tegucigalpa, the capital of Honduras. His son Emilson, age 14, dreams of becoming a professional soccer player. Determined to support Emilson's dream, Rony enrolled him in a soccer academy in Tegucigalpa, despite the expenses involved, and looked for ways to increase his income.

Rony participated in a Catholic Relief Services project to learn new farming techniques and how to care for the land and natural resources. CRS also helped him repair an old reservoir and install a low-cost irrigation system with pipes and hoses that uses very little water to grow his crops. Now he can harvest his crops even if it doesn't rain.

Today, Rony can feed his family, pay the soccer academy's fees and help people in his community. He's even become an active advocate for caring for the environment. "That's the best way to guarantee the lives of our families and the animals," he says.

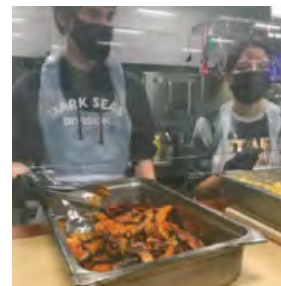


Thank You, Saint George Parish!!!!

THE PARISH AS A SCHOOL OF PRAYER

The three disciplines of Lent are Almsgiving, Fasting, and Prayer. My hope and prayer is that Saint George Parish, through the journey of Lent and into Easter, will become a School of Prayer! Where to begin- the Eucharist. How do we enter into communion - but through prayer! In his book, *7 Secrets of the Eucharist*, Vinny Flynn, writes: "The Church has always emphasized a time of preparation before Communion and a time of thanksgiving after Communion to properly dispose our minds and hearts to enter into the deeper relationship of mutual love and unity to which the sacrament calls us... How seriously the saints took this! And what stark contrast there is between their preparations and thanksgivings and the all too prevalent tendency today to simply attend Mass, receive Communion, and leave immediately after the final blessing." (p.66-67).

To help our parish become a School of Prayer, during Lent and into the season of Easter, I invite you to pray this prayer of preparation before Communion and to pray this prayer of thanksgiving after Communion:

A Prayer of Preparation (Vinny Flynn)

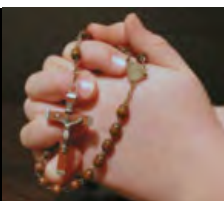
Mary, you were the first one asked to believe that God himself wanted to take flesh in you. Come now into my heart, and help me to believe that this same God wants to live in me. Prepare my Heart to receive Him, sweeping it clean of anything impure or unholy. And as I say "Amen," let it be a "Fiat", a complete "Yes" to his will and joyful acceptance of His life within me. Amen.

A Prayer of Thanksgiving (Alice Clair Mansfield)

Our Lady of the Most Blessed Sacrament, pray for me that I may become, like your Son Jesus, Bread for the life of the world. Through Him, with Him and in Him, may my life be a joyful, living sacrifice of love and praise to the honor and glory of God our Father. Amen.

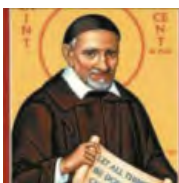
