

FROM THE PASTOR

Happy Easter! I hope you still feel some of the joy of last week because Easter is not just one day but a whole season in the Church --- fifty days, basking in the gift of Jesus risen from the dead. That last phrase was one that's pretty easy to roll through, but it should stop us in our tracks. Jesus risen from the dead! It is amazing that people still believe in that. It's even more amazing that it is TRUE! Over these next several weeks, we will continue to reflect on this mysterious and singular moment in human history. It is also a singular moment in our salvation. And I think it is not an exaggeration to say it is the ultimate moment in our salvation.

So I encourage you to simply linger in this Eastertime. Allow yourself to luxuriate in it. In a particular way, I highlight today's Gospel. It is Easter evening. That becomes their job just as it is our own. Forgiveness is a Godly work and so it is the work of the Church and of every person in it.

I want to thank so many people who helped make Easter Sunday such a beautiful experience. Father Tom and Father Ken on the altar with me for the Vigil made for a blest moment. Father Tom guided our Art and Environment group in making our church look so stunning. Our Director of Lifelong Formation, Jeanne Lassandrello walked with our three adults, Grace Temfack, Tim Bolin and Kevin Taylor, who were baptized into the faith at the Vigil. All our liturgical ministers, including our servers, lectors, Eucharistic Ministers, ushers, musicians under Tim Quisdorff, and yes, even our collection counters! Jeanne and Renee Beemsterboer organized hospitality following the Vigil. Kristen Maxwell, our Youth Minister led our teens in a beautiful presentation of the Stations of the Cross. Of course, the best part was to share God's grace with so many people for Easter Mass. Yes, I know we are left to wonder where some of them are today. 

IMPACT OF 40 DAYS FOR LIFE

The 40 Days for Life vigil at abortion facilities ran from February 22 through April 2 at over 600 locations in over 30 nations. One of these vigils took place at Planned Parenthood in Flossmoor. A number of cases of changed minds and hearts occurred there. Many of these women were offered help at Aid for Women right next door to Planned Parenthood. Based on reports received from vigil locations so far, 331 babies and their mothers are known to be saved from abortion through April 7. You can be certain that many more mothers had a change of heart that was not made known to vigil participants. This 40-day vigil also motivated a number of abortion workers to quit their jobs, and these vigils also have a history of seeing abortion facilities close permanently. Since 2007, 136 abortion facilities have closed, 247 abortion workers have left their jobs, and 22,855 babies have been saved from abortion (that are known of).



MENTAL HEALTH FORUM

In May, we celebrate Mental Health Month. May 15 is the Feast of Saint Dympha, patron of those suffering from nervous and mental afflictions. We also remember Venerable Matt Talbot, the patron of women and men struggling with addictions.

It was during my studies for the Presbyterian ministry, that I began the healing journey from a history of trauma and abuse (emotional/physical). For our studies in clinical pastoral education, there was a weekly group meeting called Interpersonal Relations Group.

Participation birthed an awareness of how wounded I was from trauma and abuse. I was referred to a psychiatrist, Dr. Richard Erman for a consultation. He was the "reincarnation" of John Wayne. He was tall, had a Western drawl, and wore Cowboy Boots. Dr. Erman provided a safe haven which allowed me to share my story. Since that day, my healing journey has continued through psychotherapy and spiritual direction, and participation in workshops and retreats.

Last December, I participated in a Healing Men's Retreat sponsored by Game Changers FTS (they also host Healing Women's Retreats). Through it, I learned more about my own woundedness and my efforts to cope with the wounds of fear and shame. Bob Schuchts, from the John Paul II Healing Center, wrote two books which I have found to be "treasures of healing mercies and grace": *Be Healed*, a powerful guide to the healing power of Jesus in your life and *Be Transformed*, the healing power of the sacraments.

In May, we celebrate Mental Health Month. As a faith community, we must not underestimate what we can do to have a positive impact on mental and emotional well-being. One in five adult Americans experienced mental illness in 2022. One in six youth from ages 6-17 experiences a mental health disorder each year. The National Alliance on Mental Illness reports that suicide is the second leading cause of death among people ages 10-34. We all probably need more faith and more prayer, but just as we go to the dentist for a toothache, God has provided the gifts of qualified, caring mental health professionals to tend to our psychological well-being. God also has provided the gifts of empathetic, caring spiritual directors to tend to our spiritual well-being.

I serve on the Archdiocesan Commission on Mental Illness. We host a monthly prayer meeting. What I have learned, through these prayer meetings, from my sisters and brothers in Christ is this: as a faith community, we must come together to talk about our concerns and challenges, and to pray for those who struggle with mental illnesses and addictions.

On May 11, I will host a forum where we can talk about our own journeys of healing and pray for those who struggle with mental illness and addictions. I will also share resources that are available to us. This forum will be in the Parish Life Center, Meeting Room 3 at 7:00 PM. Please pray about your participation in this forum.
