

Last weekend was a very exciting time here at Saint George. It was a blessing to welcome Father John Zurek to our parish family. Father John has a warm sense of humor and a kind heart. He will fit right in! Father's mother was able to be with us and she seemed to thoroughly enjoy her visit. Father is going to be getting deeply involved in our school, Children's Faith Formation and various groups. I look forward to a wonderful

partnership in ministry with him. As he acclimates to the parish, please help him feel at home.

Our missionary sisters who visited were very grateful for the warm welcome they received. Sister Deanna was a beautiful representative of a young woman who has chosen to give her life over to the Church. The sisters had a very joyful spirit about them. There is a real value to parishes having these visits from missionaries. It is a call to generosity. Hearing these stories of the missions reminds us that our vision goes beyond parish boundaries. Rather we must recognize that the Catholic Church does amazing work in parts of the world where there is war, natural disaster and persecution. Their courageous ministry is done on our behalf.

I also mentioned our sponsorship of a Syrian refugee family. Syria is a country that has suffered greatly from civil war. Countless deaths have occurred. The violence is unrelenting. This family has two parents and four children, ages 13 and younger. In cooperation with Catholic Charities and Exodus World Service, we are helping with housing, furniture, and the difficult work of adapting to a new country, a new language and a new culture. They will need help with learning English, rides to job interviews, groceries, and other appointments. If you think you would be able to help, please call Mary Cermak-Vis at 708-602-3137. One of our problems as a Church is we do not tell our story well enough or often enough. Even many Catholic are not aware of the many good things we do as a church. Spread the word! 

## **Questions & Answers**

**Question:** Why do we use incense at Mass?

### Answer:

The use of incense in religious ceremonies and worship is a practice that predates Christianity, and which is also found in many other religious traditions today.

Incense, which is made from resin infused with aromatic spices and oils, is one of those fundamentally human symbols that incorporates more than one of our senses, helping us to reflect on realities that transcend the everyday details of our lives.

The use of incense in the Church's liturgy — in the Mass, as well as in devotions to the Eucharist and the Liturgy of the Hours — is inspired by the use of incense in the Jewish tradition. In the writings of the Old Testament, we hear about incense being used in the worship of the temple, and Psalm 141 asks, "Let my prayer be incense before you; my uplifted hands an evening offering" (vs. 2). The image here is that, as the incense gently rises to heaven, our prayers also rise to God as something sweet and pleasant.

Another ancient use of incense that has also become part of our Catholic tradition is the idea that when we incense something, it's because it is something special or sacred. This is why the Book of the Gospel is incensed during the Liturgy of the Word and the bread, wine, priest celebrant, and congregation are incensed at the presentation of the gifts. To this, we can also add the incensing of the Blessed Sacrament during eucharistic adoration and benediction, and the body of the deceased at the end of the Mass of the Resurrection (the Funeral Mass).


