A Word From The Pastor



Last week, the Archdiocese of Chicago lost a great churchman with the death of Bishop John Manz. Bishop Manz was an unusual bishop. Many priests (or seminarians for that matter) make it their life's goal to become a bishop. But John's ministry as a priest focused on Chicago's Hispanic community, where he became a beloved minister of the Gospel. He was named a bishop by Pope John

Paul II in 1996. His new role would be a continuation of his work with Hispanics. I had the joy of working with John when I was a dean on the north side. He was dedicated, funny, down to earth and sometimes a ferocious advocate for priests. I am grateful for the gift of my time with Bishop Manz. He was a rare gift to the Church.

Every once in a while, life gives you a good slap to remind you of what really matters. This happened to me last week. I went to my place on the north side as I do most weeks, depending on things in the parish. I got there about 9:00 PM, parked my car, and ended my day content and happy. The next day I had to go to my car which was by a park, a place where children play, and people walk their dogs. As I approached the park, I saw a large section cordoned off with police tape. I saw the police cars and officers milling around. I looked to my left, and there was a dead man in the middle of a baseball field. His body was partially covered. No one was near him. I stopped and said a prayer. The next day, I went to the spot. Someone had left a small bouquet of flowers. The sand was still stained with blood. I later learned that it was a 64-year-old man. He was stabbed to death. That's all I know.

I wonder what his story is. Was he in trouble? Did he make enemies? Was he killed in anger or, worse, was he just a guy in the wrong place at the wrong time --- a victim of random, senseless violence? Maybe by the time you read this, we will have more details. Or maybe it will be just one more story of one more man who ended up the victim of just one more of hundreds of other murders.

I wonder how you stab a man to death. Guns offer a cowardly, distant and almost impersonal method of death. But how does one person go to another and see their face, their eyes, see their pain and hear their shriek of horror? And the blood. Did it get on the killer's hands, his clothes? No matter how much you scrub, does it ever come out? Do the sights and sounds of that terrible moment ever go away?

Message from the Pastor (continued)

You don't need me to tell you we live in a violent society. Politicians act like throwing more money at social programs, education and mental health will help. And it does but that's not the whole story. At the bottom of it all, I think, is personal responsibility. Can a person commit such a crime and not feel anything? Have some people in our society become soulless? There are too many signs that we have become a hardened people. Our humanity is slowly being sapped from us by the violence and gratuitous sex depicted in movies and TV, which passes for "entertainment." We are responsible for that, in part, because we consume it. We invite it into our homes. We pay for it.

Cardinal Bernardin tried to give us a pathway to understanding what needs to change. He taught us to see the awful relationship of abortion, poverty, guns, violence, care of the poor, the aged and mentally infirm as a tapestry of a consistent ethic of life. Mother Teresa put it in stark terms when she said, "Any country that accepts abortion is not teaching the people to love, but to use violence to get what they want. That is why the greatest destroyer of love and peace is abortion." Stark and perhaps even harsh, but no one can ignore reality. If we can dispose of our unborn children, then who is safe? It is undeniable that for many of us, another part of that reality are the hard edges of life that lead to these decisions. The question before us is whether we are willing to make our sacrifices so that others may live and have decent lives. If you find yourself in what feels like an impossible position, please come and talk to us. We can help. There is a better way. There is always a better way.

Live the Liturgy

When the disciples cannot understand something, they approach Jesus, and beseech him to explain. Let us be this forthcoming when we are discerning the will of God or struggling with a decision. Let us ask him to explain in words we can understand.

I knew Saint George Parishioners and friends could do it and so did Father Paul; and we DID!

We turned a small, older apartment into a home for a family of six. We finished the apartment an hour before they stepped in the door. Everyone donated everything – fresh beds and bedding, a living room that is attractive and comfortable as well as a kitchen table, chairs and matching bench seating so that the family can eat dinner together. We also received monetary donations for some of the rent and needs. With continued donations, we will be able to provide bus passes so the family can go to "English as a Second Language" classes, and cell phone service for the mom and dad, Without cell phones, they will not be able to be contacted for possible employment or in case of emergency.

None of the above could have been accomplished without everyone's gifts or the movers who spent one night picking up the furniture you donated, and a second day carrying that same furniture from the 60 foot moving van to the second floor apartment, Thank you Saint George parishioners for your big heart and strength.

There is one more invitation I am sending to you. We need a committee who will visit the family, help them to learn about a microwave, occasionally drive them to necessary appointments, and just be their new friends welcoming them to their new home and the United States of America. The Exodus Organization is asking us to get together, and they will help us to know how to visit people who don't speak English and are away from their former life.


Vigil at Planned Parenthood in Flossmoor

Moving up the Mountain: Coffee Farmers Fight Against Climate Change



This story is part of a year-long campaign called Living on the Edge of Climate Change, which shows how the changing environment is affecting the world's most vulnerable.

It's only 10:00 AM on a Thursday, but no one here is lingering over a last morning cup of coffee.

No, in the community of Nuevo Eden in the department of San Marcos in Guatemala, these people are growing your coffee. It's hard work that gets more difficult by the year.

Person after person - man, woman and child - pass with a quick "Buenos Dias" and a smile, but they don't linger. They have a long, dusty mountain road ahead of them as they carry huge sacks of coffee cherries on their backs. These cherries will eventually become cups of steaming coffee. But to these farmers that's not their immediate concern. Just getting the beans to this point has been an uphill battle: a battle against circumstance, a battle against the climate, a battle against poverty. And it's a fight that is still not won, especially against climate change.

This part of Guatemala is known for its quality coffee, and for its beauty. The mountains provide both a gorgeous landscape and a good location for growing the valuable beans. But these tall peaks also serve as symbols of struggle. This has not been a smooth road, and these farmers are definitely not rich. In fact, they are some of the most vulnerable people in our world. 


