A Word From The Pastor



Part of my job as a priest is meeting people in disturbing times in their lives. Often I speak with people who find themselves bewildered by the world. They wonder what has happened to society. They wonder what happened to them. Society is in constant flux. We, as individuals, are constantly changing, too. Both have to happen. If we don't change, it's because we are dead. Society will change regardless. We evolve. Sometimes for the better, sometimes not.

There are two particular areas of frustration I hear about.

The first is about our world, more specifically, our country. They speak of deep anger inside them. Often this anger is expressed in sinful terms, usually accusing someone or some segment of society with "what's wrong with this world." God knows, there is plenty wrong with our world. The times we live in are confusing and what was once considered normal is upside down. What we used to take for granted as being right or wrong is now questioned and tested at every turn. This is not always a bad thing. Still, the process of evolving is fraught with challenges.

It often starts with, "I get sick watching the news." Usually, the person has become a news junky. The cable station (and more often than not, only ONE station --- it doesn't matter which --- it's just one) plays all day. The stories are repeated, the news becomes analysis, which morphs into opinion, which devolves into speculation, and finally, just blathering. When I was a kid, I remember when a TV show would be broken into with a "Special Report." These were rare and addressed an immediate crisis. Sometimes it could be pretty scary. Now we are bombarded with NEWS ALERT or BREAKING NEWS every fifteen minutes. And that can be scary, too --- until you hear the same story from the day or two before. The problem with the 24-hour news cycle is they have to fill up 24 hours of airtime. Remember when Walter Cronkite could give you all the news you needed in a half hour? So if you find yourself worried or constantly growing angry about everything, I urge you to limit the time you spend watching the news. And pick a reliable source. Personally, I find the national news at 5:30 on any of the networks or the PBS News Hour to have the most intelligent reporting. Forget the political wrestling matches. Listen to smart people and not the blowhards.

The other concern I have is for people who seem to be obsessed with the devil. There are religious writers and commentators who talk about Satan and the devil like a character in a movie. I was disgusted when I saw a person walking in the city with a shirt that said, "Hail Satan." Yes, the need for prayer is clear. The devil is real but sometimes good, sincere people become far too interested in the devil, exorcisms, and all these extraordinary manifestations of evil. Then they start hearing noises in their house, start having odd thoughts they never had before. I even had a person call me to say her microwave was possessed. It would turn on and off by itself. I told her to unplug it and buy a new one... We don't have to look for the devil. It finds us easily enough. Do not pursue it. Rather, I urge you to meditate on the blessings of God and His grace that can be for anyone who seeks Him. Why waste yourself on dung when you can have gold?

Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (aka RCIA)



Our readings today teach us how to lead, reconcile and love. What a perfect way to talk about our faith and our relationship with God and each other. Ezekiel is being instructed in his role as a prophet. Jesus is teaching His disciples what it takes to be in a good relationship with our neighbors, even though at times it can be very difficult. We cannot give up. How did Jesus treat Gentiles and tax

collectors? And Paul goes straight to the heart of it all, "love." Which brings us right to our role and responsibility to help those who wish to become fully initiated into the Catholic church. We lead, we invite and we walk with them in love. It's the trifecta of our faith. There is someone out there that sees your faith and desires to "have what you have." Seek them out! Pray for them! And encourage them to make the call to begin as an inquirer into the Rite of Chirstian for Adults. If you are that person seeking on your own, give yourself the opportunity to ask questions of those whom you know are Catholic.

The Rite of Christian Initiation is a process for those who have never been baptized, for those who have been baptized in another faith, or for those who are baptized Catholics yet have not received the sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist. This is the time to begin inquiring about joining. The RCIA process involves a number of steps that will assist those who desire to become Catholic.

As our parish staff continues to find ways to plan future events for our parish, it takes the entire community to pray together, to talk with each other and support the future of the Church as we know Jesus and Saint Paul had done. Please reach out to someone you know who has been inquiring about becoming Catholic. If you have been thinking about becoming Catholic yourself, this is the time to look toward the future.

The RCIA process involves the entire faith community of Saint George to help those who are questioning whether or not to join the Catholic Church. We do this by inviting others to have what we have, by praying for those who have decided to be part of the process, and by continuing to support those who have completed the process. We do have great faith, are you willing to share it?

This year our parish will be joined with inquirers from both Saint Stephen Parish and Saint Elizabeth Seton Parish beginning Wednesday, September 13. Our sessions run for about 90 minutes each week. All three parishes share in the preparation process as well as celebrating the rites at each individual parish. Prayer Vigil in Orland Park

Julia needs a miracle! Let us look toward Father Augustus Tolton!

Julia Donahoe is a bright light in our world. She is artistic, intelligent, funny, good-natured, and above all a truly kind and generous person. Born in Evergreen Park, she grew up in Orland Hills with her



parents, Tim and Julie, and her younger siblings, Timothy, Jack and Annie. Julie has always had diminished hearing, but she hasn't been

defeated by that fact. Instead, when she was in seventh grade at Cardinal Joseph Bernadin school, Julia started a sign language club. An outstanding student, she Irish danced through grade school, and acted in school plays in high school. In March 2022, she suffered a series of dizzy spells in class and rehearsals. Her condition worsened and symptoms multiplied. Julia began to lose strength, stamina, vision and more hearing. A specialist confirmed the possibility that Julia suffers from Postural Orthostatic Tochycardia Syndrome (POTS).

POTS is a disorder of the autonomic nervous system. This branch of the nervous system regulates functions we don't consciously control, such as heart rate, blood pressure, sweating and body temperature. POTS has damaged her cardiovascular system, digestive system and automatic nervous system. At this point, any type of physical activity, including standing, causes her to faint. Julia has spent much of the last two months in a wheelchair.



Augustus Tolton (1854–1897) was the first African American priest, and could very well be the first African American saint. Bishop Joseph N. Perry of the Archdiocese of Chicago, is the Diocesan Postulator for the cause of Father Augustus Tolton. Bishop Perry teaches, "His was a fundamental and pervasive struggle to be

recognized, welcomed and accepted. He rises wonderfully as a Christ-figure, never uttering a harsh word about anyone or anything while being thrown one disappointment after another. He persevered among us when there was no logical reason to do so." The child of slaves, Augustus suffered racist injustices as he attempted to become ordained and serve as a priest in Quincy, Illinois. And while his life's actions were saintly, in order to be named a Saint, a miracle beyond medical explanation must be attributed to the intercession of the blessed one.

In order for a miracle to be attributed to Father Augustus Tolton, we must pray solely for his intercession. Marked improvement of Julia Donohoe's condition would then be discussed and documented. Please include this plea to Father Augustus Tolton in your daily prayers in the month of September. If it be God's will, Julia and her family will be blessed at the start of her Junior year with health and wellness. Join us in prayer to Father Augustus Tolton on behalf of Julia Donahoe.

Father Tolton, you saw society with clarity and vision; please intercede for the restoration of Julia's sight. Father Tolton, your character was of unbreakable strength. Please intercede that Julia be granted the strength to walk. Father Tolton, you were a servant to humanity throughout your life; please intercede that Julia be healed so that she may serve to the fullest extent of her many talents.

When love directs an individual's moral decisions, his basic concerns such as family, sanctity of life, etc. is safeguarded. When one is at peace, one can plan for the future.
