

A Word From The Pastor



Today we kick off our 90th anniversary celebrations with our annual parish picnic. I am very excited about the coming year. We have many opportunities for prayer, service and fun. So we start with fun! As you know the picnic is today (Sunday), right after the 11:30 AM Mass at Jaycee Grove at 168th and 80th Avenue. There will be food, games and lots of great times meeting old friends and making new ones. I want to thank our wonderful committee that put together this picnic. And while they have made every plan for this to be a terrific day, we don't

know how the weather will cooperate. So if it's just not a typical day for a picnic, our Plan B is that we'll be in the Cahill Parish Life Center. So bring your chairs and goodies. Where Saint George is, fun will follow!

Last weekend I had the pleasure of joining six other priests at the wedding of our pastoral associate, Theresa Ward to Adam Gonzalez. Though Theresa is very young, over the years she has worked with many priests! It was a festive and beautiful occasion, a reminder for me of the beauty and value of love and commitment. We wish the new Mr. and Mrs. Gonzalez many blessings and much happiness.


On Tuesday, I attended a meeting of the Presbyteral Council, an advisory board to the Cardinal. Among the items discussed was the retirement of Bishop Joseph Perry, who had reached the retirement age for bishops of 75, and Bishop Andrew Wypych, who is retiring because of ill health. Please pray that they may enjoy good health in the years to come. A great deal of time was spent discussing new protocols for priestly development and growth, especially in these days of Renew My Church. Although our parishes have not experienced the mergers of most other areas, there is still a need for a new way to lead a modern parish. New challenges call for new approaches.


Of special concern was our discussion of how the Church can assist the many refugees flooding into Chicago. Priests shared stories of the work they are doing within their parishes or in cooperation with Catholic Charities. It was reported that there are 50,000 refugees in Chicago. Catholic Charities has been able to permanently settle about 4,000. The most vulnerable are those still living in police stations. This is far beyond the scope of police work. The Cardinal indicated there is tremendous waste by the city and it doesn't seem terribly interested in working with the Archdiocese. It is suspected that when the Democrats have their convention in Chicago next summer, the border states will bus in more and more refugees as a political tactic.

And therein lies the problem. If we reduce human beings to pawns, then we are guilty of dehumanizing them. Politics aside, this is a humanitarian crisis. Many of these people have been forced into prostitution and drug dealing, just to live, while the government refuses to allow them to look for honest paying jobs. The fear used to be that immigrants would "steal" jobs from Americans. With a historically tight jobs market, that is not the issue. Among the most needed items are basics of clothes (especially with winter coming) for all ages, diapers, and gift cards for stores like Target. We are not in the city but what happens there affects us in the suburbs. What can we do to help? How should we respond to fellow human beings in need? Have any ideas? I would love to hear them! LITURGY TRAINING

Initial Training for Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist & Initial Training for Lectors

Description of presentation: These sessions provide training for Liturgical Ministers. ALL trainees attend Monday evening's Scriptural foundation, overview of the liturgy, and discern their call to liturgical ministry.

Part I is Monday, October 9, and is required for both ministries.

Part 2 (Training for Lectors) is Wednesday, October 11. Participants will learn the theology of serving as a Liturgical Minister at Mass. Participants will also learn the practical skills necessary to Proclaim the Word and serve as a Lector at Mass.



False Claims about Abortion Restrictions

Abortion supporters have invented many false claims to suggest that abortion restrictions are dangerous for women, and will even force doctors to deny women standard health care. For example, claims have been made that doctors will not be able to handle ectopic pregnancies and miscarriages because of laws restricting abortion. Such claims are totally unfounded. Abortion is not health care because there are always other medical options to care for the needs of mother and baby. In fact, laws that restrict abortion provide a much safer environment for mothers and certainly for babies. Claims that abortion is vital health care are baseless scare tactics.

FLOSSMOOR 40 DAYS FOR LIFE VIGIL

Please join the 40 Days for Life vigil at Planned Parenthood in Flossmoor on any Thursday from September 28 through November 2. These are known abortion days so Saint George Pro-Life is encouraging on-site prayer on these days for the victims of abortion. Saint George will focus on 10:00 AM to 11:00 AM, but choose any hour from 8:00 AM to 6:00 PM to pray on site at the Planned Parenthood abortion facility in Flossmoor, IL at 19831 S. Governors Highway. This vigil is part of the national call for 40 days of prayer and fasting for an end to abortion running from September 27 through November 5 and is one of over 600 locations in 30 nations. During these 40 days, please make an extra effort to pray and fast for the end of abortion in our nation (e.g. make extra visits to Holy Family Chapel and/or attend daily Mass). Public parking is available 1/2 block north of the Planned Parenthood site on 198th St. which goes west from Governors Hwy. or along the alley that runs east from Governor's Hwy. behind the Vollmer Road strip mall (parking spots facing Planned Parenthood). BAPTISMS will take place at 1:00 PM on the first Sunday of the month and at the 11:30 AM Sunday Mass on the third Sunday of the month. The family must be registered. A baptismal preparation program is obligatory in advance; please call the parish office to register and for more information.


