

A Word from the Pastor



During the month of November, we especially keep in prayer all who have died. This is a good and beautiful gift we can give to our loved ones who have gone before us. Think about that. Even after they died, we can still offer our love, as we pray for their soul, that they may finally and forever be in the presence of our loving God. This is one of the many beauties of our Catholic Faith. Our grief is not the only thing that connects us. They do not merely "live on in our memory." That is much to small compared to life eternal

which is ours in Jesus Christ! We grieve, but as Saint Paul tells us, "We do not grieve as those who have no hope." (1Thes. 4:13) So as our lasting gift, we pray for those who have died. It makes up for the things we may have neglected to say or do while they were alive. What a gift we have in our faith!

As the entire Archdiocese of Chicago has gone through the Renew My Church process, one of the important ideas that came out of it for our area is a richer collaboration with neighboring parishes. I have seen with my own eyes the struggle of these people. Our responsibility as disciples of Jesus is to respond to people in need.

Saint George is known for our devotion to the Blessed Sacrament and our love for Our Blessed Mother. With that in mind, we are planning to redesign the Marian Shrine outside the Eucharistic Adoration Chapel. Please see the notice in this bulletin about memorial bricks we are offering for the shrine. It is a wonderful way to memorialize a loved one; mark an anniversary; celebrate a birth; honor a family member or friend; or simply express your appreciation to God with a permanent commemorative brick. We hope to begin construction in the spring but we need to plan now. What a great Christmas gift! Place your order soon.

I want to express my appreciation to Father John and the whole staff for giving me the opportunity to go with 42 people to Italy last month. You've seen some of the pictures here and on Facebook. Italy truly is the gift that keeps on giving. No matter how many times you go, you'll always find something beautiful you haven't seen before. NEW RECORD PUMPKIN

Father Ken Fleck did it again! As big as his two pumpkins were two years ago, 305 pounds for Saint Paul and 315 pounds for Saint Peter, this year tops all. Independence Pumpkin (pollinated on July 4th) is guesstimated to be between 700 - 800 pounds. He grew it in his garden in Michigan City. The total weight will be recorded once the pumpkin is cut up, the seeds saved, and the rest put back into his garden as compost.

Just a reminder that if you have pumpkins as decorations or ask for them, for free, from stores that are disposing them after Halloween, you can get many recipes off the internet for soups, pies, cookies, roasted seeds, etc. You can even roast pumpkins, save the roasted flesh, after trimming the peel, keep it in your freezer for winter recipes. Seeds will be available for any and all who would like to grow giant pumpkins in their gardens. Easy instructions can be found on the internet.

PS - Charts on the internet can give an estimate of the weight with three measurements. This pumpkin's total inches for guessing its weight is 330 inches.

IMPACT OF 40 DAYS FOR LIFE

The international 40 Days for Life vigil at abortion facilities ran from September 27 through November 5 at 681 locations in 30 nations. One of these vigils has taken place at Planned Parenthood in Flossmoor. A number of cases of changed minds and hearts have occurred there. Based on reports received from vigil locations so far, 243 babies and their mothers are known to be saved from abortion as of November 3, 2023. You can be certain that many more mothers had a change of heart which was not made known to vigil participants. This 40-day vigil also motivated a number of abortion workers to guit their jobs, as well as three more abortion facilities to close permanently. Please continue to pray for mothers who are considering abortion that they find the help they need before making this terrible mistake.

VIGIL AT PLANNED PARENTHOOD IN FLOSSMOOR

Please plan to join the monthly vigil to be held at the Flossmoor Planned Parenthood abortion facility. We will gather along the public right-ofway extending from 19831 S. Governor's Hwy in Flossmoor. This vigil will take place from 10:00 AM to 11:00 AM on Thursday, November 16, 2023.

Public parking is available 1/2 block north of the Planned Parenthood site on 198th Street, which goes west from Governors Hwy, or along the alley that runs east from Governor's Hwy behind the Vollmer Road strip mall (parking spots facing Planned Parenthood). Express your prayers and concerns about an abortion facility located in our own neighborhood.

Parish Information

BAPTISMS will take place at 1:00 PM on the first Sunday of the month and at the 11:30 AM Sunday Mass on the third Sunday of the month. The family must be registered. A baptismal preparation program is obligatory in advance; please call the parish office to register and for more information.

CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS is a program for anyone inquiring and seeking information about entering the Catholic faith. Contact the parish office.
