

A Word From The Pastor



Thank you for your patience last weekend as I reviewed the previous fiscal year (July 1, 2022 to June 30, 2023). I hope you took some time to look at it for yourself. You can find it on the parish website in last week's bulletin. The feedback I received was very positive. It was thought best not to go through all those numbers in Mass simply because it can be a little overwhelming. There are a few specifics I'd like to highlight.

Most importantly, the Sunday, Christmas and Easter collections are the backbone of our parish's financial strength.

Your substantial, consistent, generous giving is what keeps our parish financially strong. The donations you put in the collection boxes each and every week or gifts through electronic giving is our greatest financial blessing. Thank you!

We are doing our best to keep expenses contained. There are some expenditures we will make, particularly the upkeep of our buildings. One of these will be funded through the Sunday collections and some will be paid for through our parish endowment fund which was established for that specific purpose.

Similarly, the school's core income is through tuition. Our parents make terrific sacrifices to send their children to Saint George School. During COVID, we received substantial funds from the government which no longer applies. It was nice while it lasted! Under the direction of Ms. Pratl, our school principal, fundraising efforts have been successful and we hope to expand on that success. All parents are required to assist at bingo, with our outstanding school board leading the charge. We also have some longtime volunteers who help out of the generosity of their hearts. Everyone's participation in the Strike It Rich Raffle is a tremendous help, as well as the blue offering envelopes designed to support our school. When you participate in any of these activities, you're helping pass on the faith through the school.

On the expense side, our teachers dedicate themselves to passing on the faith while providing an outstanding educational experience. But the total income of the school doesn't even cover all the salaries. All the other expenses like materials, administrative and maintenance expenses, utilities and insurance have to be covered and that will most likely happen through the parish. We are keeping a close eye on that situation, and making strategic moves like hiring a grant writing firm to help us find outside funds.

The last point I made in my talk was to encourage everyone to think of our giving with a different attitude. Yes, we must pay our bills, and that's my headache. More important is our attitude towards giving as a spiritual exercise. God is the source of all our blessings. Sure we work hard for them but the fact that we are in a circumstance that allows us to generate the income we have is a gift. We then need to pray over what is a substantial, sacrificial gift each of us can make. Those with smaller incomes certainly are not expected to give at the same level as someone who is better off. I urge each of us to consider in prayer what portion of our gifts we are able to give as a worthy offering of gratitude to God. If we all embrace that attitude, God will make sure everything else falls in place. Thank you for your goodness.

How Witnessing Domestic Violence Affects Children



Preschoolers who witness domestic violence, may revert to the habits of younger children: thumb sucking, bedwetting, increased crying, and whining.

School-aged children can develop anti-social traits, struggle with guilt over the abuse witnessed and take on the blame for the abuse their parent deals with. Domestic violence has ability to cause post-traumatic stress disorder in children that are raised around it.

The trauma of domestic violence is enough to cause dangerous changes in the developing brains of children, including nightmares, changes in sleep patterns, anger, irritability, difficulty concentrating.

Routinely witnessing domestic violence places children at a high risk of developing depression, sadness, concentration issues into adulthood. In some instances, children that live in abusive households are also likely to fall victim to this treatment themselves.

FLOSSMOOR 40 DAYS FOR LIFE VIGIL

Please join the 40 Days for Life vigil at Planned Parenthood in Flossmoor on any Thursday from October 19 through November 2. These are known abortion days so Saint George Pro-Life is encouraging on-site prayer on these days for the victims of abortion. Saint George will focus on 10:00 AM to 11:00 AM, but choose any hour from 8 AM to 6 PM to pray on site at the Planned Parenthood abortion facility in Flossmoor, Illinois at 19831 S. Governors Highway. This vigil is part of the national call for 40 days of prayer and fasting for an end to abortion running from September 27 through November 5 and is one of 681 locations in over 30 nations. During these 40 days, please make an extra effort to pray and fast for the end of abortion in our nation (e.g. make extra visits to Holy Family Chapel and/or attend weekday Mass). Public parking is available 1/2 block north of the Planned Parenthood site on 198th St. which goes west from Governors Hwy., or along the alley that runs east from Governor's Hwy. behind the Vollmer Road strip mall (parking spots facing Planned Parenthood).
