

A Word from the Pastor



The calendar has flipped and 2024 is off and running. What are you looking forward to? What are you dreading? I think taking a moment to think about how we would like to spend the next year is a wise and worthwhile exercise. Of course there's no predicting what could happen. but if we don't give ourselves some kind of direction, we could end up like a ball in a pinball machine, bouncing from one place to another without purpose. And purpose is key. Doing life on purpose rather than just drifting along can help us reach important goals.

Personal goals --- How well am I taking care of myself? My health --- regardless of how strong or challenged it is --- is a gift from God. This might mean taking up healthier foods, getting more exercise or giving up habits that clearly only damage us. Do I carry pain or loss, disappointments or grudges that separate me from the joys of life? If I am not taking care of myself, that could put significant limits on how much I can do for others. However, this should not be considered exclusive or separate from ---

Interpersonal goals --- How well am I caring for the people in my life? If married, am I being attentive to this shared vocation with my spouse? And if blessed with children, am I tending to those I have brought into the world (and perhaps those they have brought into the world, too!). If I am single or widowed, how do I use this state to contribute to the lives of relatives, friends and those in need?

Communal goals --- How do I relate to my civic and church communities? Do I contribute by making efforts to improve and enhance the place I call my civic and spiritual homes? How do I best pitch-in to make both of these more welcoming and hospitable?

Spiritual goals --- How attentive am I to my relationship with God? Do I pray? And if I don't, do I feel like something is missing from my day? Do I have a sense of God truly present in my life, in all circumstances and situations? Do I turn to God in need, or in gratitude when things are falling into place? Is Mass a regular part of my week, and reconciliation an oasis of healing for me? How do I reach out? Do I take advantage of opportunities to grow spiritually through prayer, faith and good words and deeds?

All that might sound a little overwhelming, and there are plenty of things in life that will try to rob us of achieving these goals. If we truly make God our top priority, our relationships with those God has given us will improve, and our sense of self will be more centered and more authentic.

Our 90th anniversary celebrations continue. On Sunday, January 21, we will be having a skating party. I will be honest, the thought of me on skates immediately brings to mind a picture of me wearing a cast on one limb or another! But for those gifted with coordination, come on out! And even if your content to watch the fun, plan on coming!

The weekend of February 24-25, you will meet Joe Paprocki, author of several fine books about living a Catholic life. One of the books he wrote, A Church on the Move is being read by the staff. Later we hope to offer an opportunity to read and discuss this book on a parish-wide scale. Joe is a Chicagoan, a husband and father, and has been involved in catechesis and evangelization for decades. He will speak at all Masses that weekend, and will offer reflections that Sunday, Monday and Tuesday evenings. Please plan on coming. The chances of improving your spiritual life are in your favor and the risk of breaking a body part is significantly less!
