Message From Father Paul



This is Annual Catholic Appeal pledge weekend. I am grateful to everyone for being so patient as we walk through this process. Many of you have given for years. Some are new to the Appeal, so we want to include as many people as possible. Last week, I asked that you consider pledging \$1,000 to be fulfilled over the course of the next year. For some, that may be too much. Others might be able to give more. Whatever your sincere prayer leads you to will

be pleasing to God and helpful in many ways. Our assigned goal is \$60,225. Anything over that will come back to the parish as a rebate. If we surpass our goal, we have some special projects.

We plan to refurbish the Marian Shrine outside our Eucharistic Adoration Chapel. Much of this will be paid for by the commemorative bricks we are offering. Any shortfall will be covered by the rebate. The main plan is to refurbish our Parish Life Center Meeting Rooms and lobby. We hope to make our meeting rooms feel more comfortable and inviting and less like a classroom. The ceiling tiles are original, and many are discolored and sagging. The rooms all need a painting and the room dividers, which are quite expensive, need to be replaced. Considering that the building is close to 30 years old, these kinds of updates are routine.

I hope we will have wide participation in this year's Appeal. Every gift, no matter the amount, is a blessing and a sign of the dedication of our parish to the charitable work of the Archdiocese and our parish. Saint George always comes through!

Can you believe we begin Lent in just a few days? Yes, Ash Wednesday is this week. The Mass and Ash Service schedule is available in this bulletin. Let's get this Lent started with hope and gratitude for God's blessing and forgiveness. And then there's the hard part --- we fast and abstain from meat this Wednesday and the Fridays of Lent. If there is good medical reason or if fasting is too much of a hardship, please use your common sense. Fast and abstinence is to make us spiritually stronger, not physically ill!

This Lent we have a very special mission planned with author and speaker, Joe Paprocki. Joe has written some fine books, including "A Church on the Move." Joe's presentations are always clear, practical and inspiring. He will be with us at all weekend Masses on February 24 and 25. He will speak the evenings of February 25, 26 and 27 at 7:00 PM. Wonderful snacks and beverages will follow each night.

On Sunday, March 10 at 2:00 PM, we will have a service which will be dedicated to prayers against violence. In the last year, we have witnessed terrible crimes in our own community. These are especially horrible because it was directed at family members and ended in death. We need to lift up our community in prayer and ask God for His help. I hope you will join us.

Lenten Regulations

Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years old and older on Ash Wednesday and on all the Fridays of Lent. Fasting is to be observed on Ash Wednesday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 59. Those who are bound by this may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted. The special Paschal fast, as well as abstinence, are prescribed for Good Friday and encouraged for Holy Saturday.

Masses with ash distribution will take place at 8:15 AM and 7:00 PM. A prayer service with ash distribution is scheduled at 3:30 PM



MARCH FOR LIFE IN WASHINGTON, D.C.

On January 19, hundreds of thousands of Pro-Life Americans marched in the cold and snow flurries in Washington, D.C., both celebrating the overturning of Roe v. Wade and focusing on the big task ahead at the state level (e.g. in Illinois) to protect mothers and their babies from the enticing lies offered by abortion providers. While about 25 states are providing protections from abortion for mothers and their babies, the other states are using government power to promote and expand abortion with virtually no oversight or regulation. During the rally that preceded the march, many dynamic speakers encouraged continued resolve to seek the protection of life from conception to natural death in all states. Unfortunately, most "mainstream" media outlets now practice nearly complete censorship of the March for Life. Even so, this large annual gathering continues to send a powerful message that abortion must be made unthinkable.

PRAY FOR LIFE DURING LENT

Next weekend, Saint George Pro-Life will be providing Pro-Life prayer cards that you can pick up at the entrances of church. Your prayers are very important for mothers who go there, so that they will be moved to choose life, rather than abortion. As abortion has been increasing in Illinois through more public funding, less regulation, and the repeal of parental notice, prayers are needed more than ever to defend innocent lives.

FLOSSMOOR 40 DAYS FOR LIFE VIGIL

Please join the 40 Days for Life vigil at Planned Parenthood in Flossmoor on any day from February 14 through March 24. Thursday is a known abortion day, so that would be a good day for on-site prayer for the victims of abortion. Join other Saint George parishioners from 10:00 AM to 11:00 AM on any Thursday from February 15 through March 21, or choose any hour from 8:00 AM to 5:00 PM (ending at 6:00 PM) for prayer on site at the Planned Parenthood abortion facility in Flossmoor, Illinois at 19831 S. Governors Highway. Public parking is available 1/2 block north of the Planned Parenthood site on 198th Street which goes west from Governors Highway or along the alley that runs east from Governor's Highway behind the Vollmer Road strip mall (parking spots facing Planned Parenthood).

This vigil is part of the national call for 40 days of prayer and fasting for an end to abortion and is one of nearly 600 in 30 nations. During these 40 days, please make an extra effort to pray and fast for the end of abortion in our nation (e.g. make extra visits to Holy Family Chapel and/or attend weekday Mass). Little Black Book

Lent is almost here!

The Little Black Books for Lent will be available at the February 11 weekend Masses. Pick yours up from the baskets at the entrances of church.

The Mission of Little Books is to Help People Pray During Lent.

Each Little Book has been carefully crafted to help you explore the depths of Scripture and deepen your relationship with Christ. Use your Little Book for personal devotional time, and spend some quiet time with the Lord.

How to use the Little Black Book

This Little Black Book is your companion for Lent. It's an oldfashioned "vade mecum" (pronounced vahday maykum). That's the Latin for "travel with me" and was used to describe a book of prayers for traveling priests, or a handbook for quick reference – something you could take with you anywhere. It travels easily in your pocket, purse, glove compartment. The goal is to find six minutes of quiet time every day for the next 50 days to walk through this book a page at a time. Six minutes. That's within reach. And it pays big returns.

The key is the right-hand page. Starting with Ash Wednesday, we will walk through the passion narrative of Luke, a few verses at a time, with explanations and reflections along the way. It's an ancient way of praying the Scriptures — called lectio divina. God speaks to us "live" through the sacred word and we're often surprised at the thoughts that come.

The left-hand page has a variety of quotes, information, timely thoughts. Treat it like a buffet table from which you can take what you like. (If pressed for time, go directly to the right-hand page and spend your time there.)

We won't start reading the Gospels until Ash Wednesday. But we'll start the six-minute program on Sunday, February 11 (the Sunday before Ash Wednesday), which will give us three days to get ready for Lent.

We need to use today's "six minutes" to ask for God's help in making some course corrections in our lives.



Living a Prayerful and Contemplative Lifestyle through Spiritual Direction

There are two ways to live prayerfully in your everyday life. The first is to pray around, in and through the ordinary activities of your day. The second is to cultivate a contemplative lifestyle. Through participation in spiritual direction with a Spiritual Director, one learns how to live more prayerfully in his or her everyday life, focus on one's relationship with God and learn ways to nourish that relationship, and reflect on your life story and faith journey and your deepest spiritual desires.
