

## **Message From Father Paul**



This is the third and final week for the Annual Catholic Appeal. Thank you to everyone who has pledged. Your gift will make a difference! Your pledge can be fulfilled over ten months. With the beginning of Lent, we are reminded of our call to prayer, fasting and almsgiving. These three simple acts of devotion help us to grow in our relationship to God, to others and ourselves. As we hear about the temptations of Jesus in the desert, so we see the temptations that haunt us. With the help of God, we can overcome them. One of the devil's most effective tools is discouragement. Don't be discouraged in the face of God's grace! Please take advantage of the many prayer opportunities at Saint George, as listed in the bulletin.

I especially want to encourage you to attend our Lenten Parish Mission at the end of the month with Joe Paprocki. He is a respected writer and dynamic speaker. I know you will enjoy his engaging style and simple effective ways we can become a more mission-driven parish. Plan to join us!

This weekend, we are making a couple slight liturgical changes that will have no impact on you, other than making everyone feel more a part of our prayer. As we all know, our church has an unusual layout. To accommodate that, Father Fleck would move the candles and offer Mass in such a way as to eliminate the awkwardness of saying Mass directed to only one side. Father Tom didn't feel comfortable with that but Father John also thinks it's a good idea. So we will try it and see how it works.

The other change is the procession will enter from the "old section" as usual but will leave at the end of Mass by way of the "new section." The priest will offer Holy Communion in the "new section" and a deacon will go to the old. This way, anyone who wishes to receive Holy Communion from a clergy member will be able to do so in either section. This especially helps us priests and deacons to see more of our community up close. If the people sit in the same section every week, then I may never have the chance to offer you Communion. And as trivial as that may seem to you, it is very important to me. We anticipate rotating our Communion stations each year. Another problem with the old section/new section scheme is one may seem more dominant than the other. There are no stepchildren in the liturgy, so these changes will help eliminate that perception.

One of the great joys of being at Saint George is meeting people who come to Mass for the first time here. They express their appreciation for the genuine welcome and warmth they experience. This all happens because of you! When you help people find a washroom, every time you make room in your pew for someone, whenever you show someone the way to the Parish Life Center so they can get to Family First Sunday, that may be just the simple act of kindness they are hoping for. Simple hospitality can go a long way. Thanks for being so welcoming to everyone!


#### Monday (February 26) - 7:00 PM Glimpsing God in Our Own Lives and in Our Parish

#### **Lenten Regulations**

Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years old and older on Ash Wednesday and on all the Fridays of Lent. Fasting is to be observed on Ash Wednesday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 59. Those who are bound by this may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted. The special Paschal fast, as well as abstinence, are prescribed for Good Friday and encouraged for Holy Saturday.

#### Stations of the Cross

Stations of the Cross will be performed at 7:00 PM on Friday nights during Lent.

#### **Eucharistic Adoration**

Tuesdays, February 20, February 27, March 5, March 12, March 19 and March 26 at 6:00 PM in the church. Note: Holy Family Chapel will be closed during the Triduum (March 28, 29 and 30).

#### Sacrament of Reconciliation

The Parish Reconciliation Service will take place on Wednesday, March 13 at 7:00 PM.

Private reconciliation is scheduled on Saturdays from 2:30 PM to 3:30 PM. Confessions will not be heard on Holy Saturday.



#### February 18, Week 1

#### Give Your Used Bike a New Home in a Developing Country

Bicycles in a developing country can mean the difference between work and unemployment. Bikes are used to deliver cargo as well as for transportation. A bike worth \$20 in the U.S. is worth the equivalent of \$1,000 in Africa due to salaries of \$30 per month. Bikes also provide work for mechanics and messengers. We also ship wheelchairs, tools and jogging strollers.

The Working Bikes Cooperative ships bicycles to: Guatemala (www.mayapedal.co), Ghana (www.patriensa.co), Nicaragua (www.peaceworks.or), Angola (www.sharecircle.or), Peru (www.coprodeli.or) and Tanzania (www.globalallianceafrica.org). The Co-Op also distributes about 500 bikes a year to refugees and day camps in the Chicago area.

Donations provide humanitarian aid or pay for shipping. Bikes do not have to be in working order. Since 2001, Working Bikes Cooperative has shipped over 4,000 bikes to Africa, Central America and the Caribbean.


