## Message From Father Paul



We are so proud and excited to have Joe Paprocki with us for our Lenten mission: A Glimpse of God. Just as the disciples were given a glimpse of Jesus in His glory, Joe will walk us through on Sunday, "What the World Needs Now is a Glimpse of God." Monday, "Glimpsing God in Our Own Lives and in Our Parish." Tuesday, "Helping Others to Glimpse God: Becoming a Church on the Move." Each evening will begin at 7:00 PM. Afterwards, we will have wine and cheese, as well as some milder

refreshments. In his capacity as an author, Joe has traveled all over the country giving inspiring presentations. In his role as a husband, father and grandfather, Joe knows the challenges of raising a family in a world that often does not recognize a place for God. After you experience this mission, I think you will find new energy and hope in your relationship with Jesus and a greater desire to share it. Please join us and bring a friend!

On Sunday, March 10 at 2:00 PM, Saint George will be hosting a prayer service for Healing the World of Violence. In recent months, we have seen the horrific results of war in the Middle East and Ukraine; street violence fills the news every day; violence in homes that result even in death. These are terrors that some people live with day in and day out. These are the tragedies we must bring to prayer. Please come and join us as we lift up our world in prayer and become more aware of the suffering endured by so many.

Several weeks ago, I published some of the activities of the Archdiocese and Catholic Charities concerning the asylum seekers in the Chicago metro area. Since then, the Cardinal published an important article in the January 31, 2024 issue of the *Chicago Catholic*. I urge you to read it (it can be found on the Archdiocesan website). Among the statistics highlighted are (as of January 26):

34,229 people bussed from Texas to Chicago since August, 2020.

16,489 people directly supported by Catholic Charities and Parish Care Initiatives.

3,748 adults and children reunited with families outside Chicago.

11,125 people living in shelters and hotels now in stable housing.

1,400 people assisted with work authorization and Temporary Protection Status applications.

216 (95 families) housed through the Parish Family Sponsorship Program.

These amazing signs of generosity don't count many of the individual parish initiatives, such as our coat drive, and does not include the help we are giving to people like our Syrian family, who are making inroads in learning English and employment. Living the Corporeal Works of Mercy is a challenge and a gift. These initiatives and many more are reasons to be proud to be Catholic! The world may not recognize them --- or appreciate them --- but when we are asked, "What did you do for me when I was hungry, thirsty, naked, sick or in prison?" we will have an answer. Thank you for making it possible!

### Reflections at Weekend Masses (February 24 and 25) "Catching a Glimpse of Glory"

In the Gospel story of the Transfiguration, Peter, James, and John "catch a glimpse" of Jesus' divinity. It was a "mystical" experience. In his reflections at Mass, Joe will invite you to consider how mystical experiences – glimpses of God – occur in our everyday lives and how we can help others to catch a glimpse of God.

### Sunday (February 25) - 7:00 PM What the World Needs Now is a Glimpse of God

The movie, Apollo 13, gave us the now-famous line "Houston, we have a problem." The truth is, our Church and our world are facing many problems that seem, at times, insurmountable. We are in desperate need of glimpsing God in our midst and hearing his voice proclaim the Truth, so that, as in Apollo 13, this may yet be "our finest hour." Together, we'll explore how we can and must respond to the crises we face and become a "Church on the Move."

### Monday (February 26) - 7:00 PM Glimpsing God in Our Own Lives and in Our Parish

In a world where people are desperately searching for meaning and purpose, folks are turning away from traditional "religion" and seeking spiritual wellness elsewhere ("I'm spiritual but not religious"). They simply don't believe that they will catch a "glimpse of God" in the Catholic Church. In order to become a "Church on the Move," we must ensure that we ourselves are developing eyesight capable of seeing God in everyday life. Together, we will explore how the Catholic Church helps us to "see" so that we can truly find God in all things.

### Tuesday (February 27) - 7:00 PM Helping Others to Glimpse God: Becoming a Church on the Move

Unless a church is moving "outwards," it risks becoming irrelevant and eventually, obsolete. As a "Church on the Move," we have been commissioned to go forth and help others "glimpse God" in their daily lives and to help them recognize that such "glimpses" are transformative and even lifesaving. Together, we will explore how the faith community of Saint George can serve as a "beacon of light" to Tinley Park and surrounding communities and thrive as a "Church on the Move" for years to come.

## **Lenten Regulations**

Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years old and older on Ash Wednesday and on all the Fridays of Lent. Fasting is to be observed on Ash Wednesday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 59. Those who are bound by this may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted. The special Paschal fast, as well as abstinence, are prescribed for Good Friday and encouraged for Holy Saturday.

#### Stations of the Cross

Stations of the Cross will be performed at 7:00 PM on Friday nights during Lent.

#### **Eucharistic Adoration**

Tuesdays, February 27, March 5, March 12, March 19 and March 26 at 6:00 PM in the church. Note: Holy Family Chapel will be closed during the Triduum (March 28, 29 and 30).

### Sacrament of Reconciliation

The Parish Reconciliation Service will take place on Wednesday, March 13 at 7:00 PM.

Private reconciliation is scheduled on Saturdays from 2:30 PM to 3:30 PM. Confessions will not be heard on Holy Saturday.

We also ship wheelchairs, tools and jogging strollers.

The Working Bikes Cooperative ships bicycles to: Guatemala (www.mayapedal.co), Ghana (www.patriensa.co), Nicaragua (www.peaceworks.or), Angola (www.sharecircle.or), Tanzania (www.globalallianceafrica.org) and Peru (www.coprodeli.or). The Co-Op also distributes about 500 bikes a year to refugees and day camps in the Chicago area.

Donations provide humanitarian aid or pay for shipping. Bikes do not have to be in working order. Since 2001, Working Bikes Cooperative has shipped over 4,000 bikes to Africa, Central America and the Caribbean.

Adolf and his wife, Florence, are farmers in Akwangagwel, Uganda. The couple is dedicated to fighting hunger so that their family and others in their community can build thriving lives. They do this by farming, which helps their family to eat three nutritious meals a day, and by assisting others in their community to grow successful crops.

Each member of their household has an important role, like gardening, cleaning, preparing meals and caring for the animals. In the evenings, they enjoy spending time together as a family. Adolf is thankful for the free time to sit and relax with his children.

In the area where they live, the climate is very dry. Lately, the rainy season has been coming later than it used to. And sometimes, it rains too much all at once and causes flooding.

"It rains so heavily and destroys things," Adolf says. "So, the goodness of rain is taken away."

In addition, people come through their community and steal their food or tools. It makes it difficult to farm with these challenges—and that means food is harder to come by.

To overcome these obstacles, Adolf and Florence joined a Catholic Relief Services program where they learned new farming methods that help them grow crops even when it is hot and dry. They planted seeds that grow quickly, so that they can still have vegetables to harvest, even if there isn't much rain. This provides enough food to eat and to sell at the market for extra income.

"I have seen my children are happy because they are well fed," Adolf says.

Because of the successful life that he and Florence have built, they are sharing the knowledge they learned with their neighbors. As a leader in his community, Adolf works with others to increase their harvests, improve the land and build a safe and thriving community.

Pray for Adolf and his wife, Florence this week for their continued success in feeding their family. Your continued support is helping them and other families in Uganda and around the world learn to survive and learn how to grow food to sustain good health.




