

Message From Father Paul



We now enter into the holiest week of the year. Holy Week is the Church's invitation for us to walk with Jesus through His Passion, Death and Resurrection in real time. These days represent the most crucial moments of the story of the salvation of the world. Today we hear the story of Palm Sunday at the beginning of the liturgy. We remember the day when Jesus rode into Jerusalem, the most sacred city for the Jews.

An important detail is to notice that He rides in on a donkey. That told the people something about Him. Jesus came on a donkey to show His humility and status as a common person who comes in peace. A conqueror would ride in, not on a donkey but on a horse, a majestic and powerful animal meant to convey the majesty and power of the one riding it. But that is not Jesus' approach.

In the Gospel, we hear the sad story of Judas' betrayal, with a kiss no less. But before that happens, Jesus shares the bread and wine with His disciples. He is having a Passover Meal which is a sacred ritual for Jewish people. It recalls the ancient Israelites' flight out of Egypt. The angel of death is patrolling the country, killing the first-born humans and animals. The Israelites' homes are spared because they have smeared the blood of a sacrificed lamb on their doorposts. The angel of death passes over them. They leave in a hurry, not even waiting for their bread to rise. And they flee slavery to begin a new life in the Promised Land.

Our Mass is a direct descendant of the Passover Meal. We use unleavened bread. We seek freedom from the slavery of sin. And we, too, have a sacrificial lamb --- Jesus Himself, who would be led before Pontius Pilate, condemned and crucified. His ignominious death would be His crowning glory, as least as Saint John portrays it in his Gospel. The earth quakes and the sanctuary curtain is torn wide open, from top to bottom. And that's important. No human could tear it from the top. Also, the tearing of a piece of clothing was an act of grief for a Jew. It symbolized their aching heart. So God grieves that His Son has been killed. Yet the tearing of the sanctuary curtain also represents God demolishing the division between Him and the human race. In Jesus, God has experienced the one single most difference between the Creator and a creature---death.

These two magnificent moments --- the Last Supper and the crucifixion converge at every Mass. We come to participate in a representation of Jesus' Passion and Death. The Holy Spirit works and changes bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. The shadow of the cross is cast upon the altar. And the promise of the empty tomb of Easter is implanted in our hearts, as we become Jesus in a world seeking truth and peace.

I hope you will find these gifts over these days. Please join us for all the liturgies you can. Walk with Jesus in real time.

Lenten Regulations

Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years old and older on all the Fridays of Lent. Fasting is to be observed on Good Friday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 59. Those who are bound by this may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted. The special Paschal fast, as well as abstinence, is also encouraged for Holy Saturday.

Sacrament of Reconciliation



At the heart of this celebration, are the messages of divine mercy given to Saint Faustina by Our Lord Jesus Christ. Jesus asked that the first Sunday after Easter be declared as a feast for His Divine Mercy and promised to pour out many graces on that day. From Saint Faustina's Diary: "Divine Mercy, repose of hearts, I trust in you. Divine Mercy, inspiring hope against all hope, I trust in you." (Diary 297)

Pope Francis proclaimed that mercy is the beating heart of the gospel. As we face the problems in our country and as we pray for peace in Ukraine, we need to pray that our lives, our country and our world will be consecrated to merciful love, the beating heart of Divine Mercy.

Following the National Eucharistic Revival commissioning at the parish level, as One Body in Christ, and led by the Holy Spirit to center on The Eucharist, the Vicariate V, Deanery Parishes: Our Lady of the Woods, Saint Damian, Saint Elizabeth Seton, Saint Francis of Assisi, Saint George, Saint Julie Billiart, Saint Michael and Saint Stephen Deacon and Martyr Parishes, collaborated to bring our faith communities together to worship and adore the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Christ which will culminate with a Eucharistic Celebration.

On Sunday, April 14, we will embark on a Eucharistic Revival Car Caravan Pilgrimage. Our pilgrimage will take us to our local holy sites and parishes. In addition, we will enjoy an afternoon of spiritual enrichment focusing on the True Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist.

Listed below is the pilgrimage route with approximate timings. Feel free to join us or drop off at any point in the Car Caravan Pilgrimage.

Saint Michael (14327 Highland Ave., Orland Park, IL) - Church doors will open at 3:15 PM, for the 4:00 PM start time of Eucharistic worship and adoration.

Depart in a car caravan procession from Saint Michael at 4:30 PM to Saint Francis of Assisi (15050 Wolf Rd., Orland Park). Arrive at Saint Francis of Assisi at 4:45 PM.

At 5:25 PM, depart in a car caravan procession from Saint Francis of Assisi for a 5:40 PM arrival at Our Lady of the Woods. Mass will take place at 6:00 PM. A fellowship gathering with light refreshments will take place following the Our Lady of the Woods Mass. Water and soda will be provided.

Donations of snacks and desserts are greatly appreciated. Please consider gluten free. Please drop them off at the Our Lady of the Woods parish office on Friday, April 12 or Sunday, April 14 between 8:00 AM and 12:00 PM. Please label it Car Caravan Pilgrimage. You can also bring it with you on the Car Caravan Pilgrimage and drop it off before Mass in the Our Lady of the Woods narthex.



Palm Sunday marks the beginning of Holy Week, one of the most significant moments of the Church year. During this week, we journey with Christ from His triumphant entry into Jerusalem to His final meal with His closest friends and ultimately to His death on the cross.

What better day to observe the tragedy of abortion than Good Friday? You are invited to attend this prayerful vigil at Flossmoor Planned Parenthood (19831 S. Governor's Highway, Flossmoor). Given the increasing volume of abortions committed in Flossmoor, please join us in solidarity with the babies lost to abortion and their injured mothers. Public parking is available 1/2 block north of the Planned Parenthood site on 198th Street which goes west from Governors Highway, or along the alley that runs east from Governor's Highway behind the Vollmer Road strip mall (parking spots facing Planned Parenthood).

NATURAL FAMILY PLANNING CLASSES AVAILABLE ONLINE

Why take health risks? When it comes to spacing children, many couples are turning to Natural Family Planning (NFP). NFP is 100% free of harmful side effects and does not involve the use of any medications, drugs, or devices. Proper use of NFP offers 99% effectiveness in postponing pregnancy as well as in helping couples with normal or marginal fertility achieve a pregnancy.

Now you can learn Natural Family Planning without ever having to leave your house. Natural Family Planning classes are available online. All you need is a computer or iPad, and speakers. The course features presenters on a live video feed, and you can ask questions through a live chat feature. New virtual classes in English and Spanish begin monthly. ACTION NEEDED: Dangerous 2024 Illinois bills: HB 4876 and SB 3499

HB 4876 will criminalize parents who refuse to take their minor children for an abortion or "affirm" their gender of choice. Such parents will be charged with child abuse for denying their children abortion services or gender-affirming services. Contact Rep. Debbie Meyers-Martin (38th Dist) by calling either 217-558-1007 or 708-833-7010 to ask her to oppose HB 4876.

SB 3499 will allow "medical assistance in dying" (assisted suicide) in the state of Illinois. It will allow doctors to prescribe lethal drugs to anyone diagnosed with a terminal illness. Doctors should not be asked to assist in suicide. Doctors need to have the trust of their patients. That trust would be threatened by assisted suicide. Contact Senator Michael Hastings (19th Dist) by calling either 217-782-9595 or 815-464-5431 to ask him to oppose SB 3499.

MINISTRY OF CARE: Mandated Agape Ministers of Care are available to visit, pray with, and bring Holy Communion to those who are sick and unable to attend Mass. Notify the parish office when this service is needed.

REGISTRATION: We welcome new members with open arms. Please call the parish office for more information.
