

Message from Father Paul



What a glorious Triduum we shared at Saint George last week! I am so grateful to everyone who contributed their time, talent and treasure to making this an especially beautiful Easter. Many people don't realize the time and effort it takes to make even the most "ordinary" Mass come together. I thank our lectors who read, prayed and prepared their Scripture passages so well. Our Eucharistic Ministers worked with their personal schedules so as to exercise their ministry at Mass. Our

ushers were right there to assist people. Our altar servers were on their toes at each of the services for Holy Thursday, Good Friday, the Easter Vigil and Easter Sunday. Each is unique and very different. Both the adult and children's choirs did a beautiful job in leading us in song and prayer. Our teens walked us through the Living Stations of the Cross which touched us so profoundly. Even the people who were kind enough to allow us to wash their feet on Holy Thursday played an integral part in the liturgy. The Art and Environment group did such a wonderful job making our church look beautiful!

I am deeply grateful to Father John and Father Ken for their assistance and beautiful homilies. Our deacons were extraordinarily helpful throughout the Holy Days. Our office and pastoral staffs all worked for weeks to prepare. They did, as always, an amazing job. And as I write this article, there is another group busy at work, and those are the collection counters! Thank you to everyone who made a special gift to the parish this Easter. It is an essential part of our financial health. If you haven't been able to make your gift yet, please do so, so we can close out the books.

On Holy Thursday, we had 100 more people in attendance. On Good Friday, we had the same increase. On the Easter weekend, we had 800 additional people praying with us! I know there is the temptation to be frustrated. Where are they usually? Where are they this week? I've let go of that. Instead, I am simply grateful for the goodness everyone brought to make Easter the grand celebration it should be. Thank you, one and all.

The Big Event at the Tinley Park Convention Center on April 21 is fast approaching. It has been evolving each day, and so we have added a new feature. If you would like to order a dinner (Caesar salad, chicken and dessert, served at 3:30 PM, you can do so by going to the Saint George Facebook page or the parish website. If you aren't quite up to it online, come by the office and we will be happy to help you. Of course we will be having raffles and split-the-pot chances. Plus, if you go online, there is a chance to win up to \$2,500. All of this wrapped in a great musical program.



Bicycles in a developing country can mean the difference between work and unemployment. Bikes are used to deliver cargo as well as for transportation. A bike worth \$20 in the United States is worth the equivalent of \$1,000 in Africa due to salaries of \$30 per month. Some bikes also provide transportation for doctors, mechanics and messengers. The working Bikes Cooperative ships bicycles to Africa, Latin America and distributes about 500 bikes a year to refugees and day camps in the Chicago area.

Donations provide humanitarian aid or pay for shipping. Bikes do not have to be in working order. Since 2001, Working Bikes Cooperative has shipped over 4,000 bikes to Africa, Central America and the Caribbean. 
