

Message from Father Paul



This weekend we celebrate the beautiful mystery of the Holy Trinity. We believe in one God. We know Him as Father, Son and Holy Spirit. We mark ourselves in this faith every time we make the Sign of the Cross. Many Christian denominations do not use this gesture. If you see someone doing it, it's a pretty good bet they are Catholic. It is not only nice to have something that makes us stand out --- it is a symbol of our love, devotion and

dependence on the love of the Father, who sacrificed His Son for us and is still present in the word today in the Holy Spirit.

We also honor those who made the greatest sacrifice for our country on Memorial Day. It is a good occasion to recollect what our country stands for and the importance of our institutions that hold our democratic society together. Our unique balance of power in the three branches of government, and the critical peaceful transition of power are cornerstones of our democracy for which thousands of people have fought and died. 

How does it work? You come and sing at funerals as your schedule allows. Simple as that! Most funerals are at 10:00 AM, with a few at 11:00 AM, and if there are two funerals on the same day, the later one is usually at 11:30 AM. One need not come to all of them! Come as your time permits.

The music is usually quite familiar. There are no rehearsals, other than coming a few minutes before to review what music there is. Of course, music is important, but the real ministry here is just showing up, being there to help support a grieving family. One might call it the ministry of presence.

Assisted Suicide Bill Has Not Advanced in Springfield

There is good news to report from the Illinois Legislature in Springfield. SB 3499 has not advanced. This dangerous bill would allow "medical assistance in dying" (assisted suicide) in the state of Illinois. It would allow doctors to prescribe lethal drugs to anyone diagnosed with a terminal illness. Doctors should not be asked to assist in suicide. Doctors need to have the trust of their patients. That trust would be threatened by assisted suicide.

Many opponents of assisted suicide and euthanasia have raised the alarm about "doctor shopping," in which someone seeking euthanasia can simply keep visiting doctors until finding one willing to check the right boxes. Accounts suggest that almost any patient can find a doctor willing to approve euthanasia for any reason. Furthermore, such doctors will never be investigated or prosecuted, rendering the letter of the law essentially moot. Thus, "strict" safeguards, become meaningless "guidelines." As Alex Schadenberg, who leads up the Euthanasia Prevention Coalition, put it, "Canada's euthanasia law was not designed to protect vulnerable people." Instead, "The law is designed to protect the doctors who are willing to kill."

EXPECT DELAYS - Road Closure, Detour in Place

Location

Village of Tinley Park - The improvements for the 175th Street Construction include full pavement replacement, storm sewer installation, water main and sanitary main relocation, curb and gutter replacement, ADA ramp, sidewalk and multiuse path construction, street lighting and traffic signal replacement and pavement markings along 175th Street, Ridgeland Avenue and Oak Forest Avenue.

Traffic Impact

During construction, 175th Street, Ridgeland Avenue, and Oak Forest Avenue will be restricted to on-way in the EB/NB directions. WB 175th Street and SB Ridgeland Avenue will be closed through work zone limits and traffic detoured via Central Avenue, 167th Street, Oak Park and 177th Street.

Celebrating the Anniversary of Pope Francis' transformational encyclical, Laudato Si'.

"Care for Creation" and Laudato Si' (Part 2)

- The Pope's encyclical, Laudato Si', challenges us to rethink our relationship with nature.
- He reframes the environmental dialogue from a political discussion into language of faith. Creation, the natural world around us and all living things in it, is recognized as a precious gift from God to be revered by all.
- Our pervasive "throwaway" culture, combined with deforestation, and massive industrial and agricultural pollution is seriously degrading the earth, our common home.
- Francis also points out the solid scientific consensus that human activity is the main contributor to a warming climate and warns of a worsening crisis. Without change, additional harmful sea level rise, droughts, water shortages and negatively impacted crop yields are expected.
- Since the livelihoods of the poor will be most impacted, it becomes a moral imperative to take action.
- Pope Francis urges us to take action to mitigate these outcomes by working to protect our common home and by eliminating wastefulness in our lives.

Parish Information

BAPTISMS will take place at 1:00 PM on the first Sunday of the month and at the 11:30 AM Sunday Mass on the third Sunday of the month. The family must be registered. A baptismal preparation program is obligatory in advance; please call the parish office to register and for more information.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS is a program for anyone inquiring and seeking information about entering the Catholic faith. Contact the parish office.

WEDDING arrangements must be made four months in advance of the wedding date. You must be a registered parishioner for six months prior to making arrangements. Please schedule your church date before reserving your hall.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK / RECONCILIATION can be arranged by contacting the Parish Office to have a priest celebrate the sacraments with the person who is seriously ill or homebound.
