

# Message from Father Paul



This weekend at the 9:30 Mass, we honor our Blessed Mother with a May Crowning. This wonderful tradition reminds us that we devote the entire month of May to prayer and celebration of Mary, the first person to say YES to Jesus. When the angel Gabriel came to her and asked if she would be willing to bring the Son of God into the world, all of creation was at a crossroads. God saw that the time had

come to send us a savior. Would Mary fulfill her role in God's mission to save us from sin? Would she take a leap of faith like none other? Would she trust God?

Thankfully, her answer was YES. Mary would be the first of a host of saints beyond count who would say 'yes' to Jesus. Those yesses came in many ways. Some were small. Some were offered in their own blood. And though Mary did not die a martyr's death, she certainly came to understand the words of the old man Simeon, who at the presentation at the Temple, told Mary that her heart would be pierced with a sword. And it was.

Mary's YES would lead her to the Temple again, twelve years later, when Jesus stayed there debating with the teachers and she and Joseph didn't know where He was. She would later see people praise, fear, scorn and reject her son. She would also watch Him die.

Mary's pain would lead her and the Apostles to overwhelming joy when Jesus rose from the dead. She would be there when He sent the Holy Spirit after His Ascension into heaven. Mary was there for all of it --- the good, the painful, the triumphant --- all of it! We are invited to the same journey. Some of it may not look too enticing. But it is always about our ultimate goal, to get to heaven.

In the meantime, we reflect on how God is calling us, awaiting our YES.

Many thanks to our teachers and catechists who, working under Ms. Pratl in our school and Ms. Lassandrello, guided our young people through Confirmation (a few weeks ago) and First Holy Communion (last week). It is our hope that these young people will continue to receive the guidance and teaching they need to carry out their Christian vocation.

Part of our Christian vocation is to invite people into the faith. How's that going? Keep your ear to the ground. There are many seekers out there, of all ages, who are looking for something deeper than Tik Tok and Instagram. We've got it. So do you, so let's spread the joy!

BAPTISMS will take place at 1:00 PM on the first Sunday of the month and at the 11:30 AM Sunday Mass on the third Sunday of the month. The family must be registered. A baptismal preparation program is obligatory in advance; please call the parish office to register and for more information.


