Message from Father Paul



Last weekend, Father Ed Cronin, former associate pastor with me at Saint Lawrence O'Toole and former pastor of Saint Alexander Church, among others, suddenly died in the middle of Mass. He was 69. As a priest, I can hardly imagine Ed thinking of a better way to go. Being called home by God in the very act of worship he loved so much seems like a beautiful thing and I hope it was. On the other hand, the

congregation must have been terrified, seeing a man die before their eyes. We need to pray for them along with Father Cronin.

He was a dynamo. When we met, he had been ordained for five years, and I was going to Saint O'Toole for my first assignment as a priest. Father Richard "Reddo" Sullivan was pastor, a delightful old Irishman. (Hey, wait a minute...he was the same age I am now! But I digress...) We made a fun team. Father Sullivan knew everything that went on in the parish but he never needed to throw his authority around. And when one of "his lads" made a mess of things, he would be there quietly to clean it up.

Ed and I worked closely together with Father Sullivan. He handed over some of his responsibilities to me, and there was no slacking off. It was a time when creativity and innovation were appreciated in the Church, and some things we did were amazing. And some were amazing flops. But it was fun and exciting and energized the parish. It was a wonderful way to begin my priesthood.

Much later, I bumped into Father Cronin at a priests' meeting. It was the last conversation we shared. I said, "Ed, I want you to know, and I want to thank you for giving me a priest's work ethic." I learned from him the importance of giving it your best, a willingness to sacrifice and to do it with joy. He showed me the need people have, and a desire they sometimes don't even realize, to tap into that better part of themselves that God gave them. We worked on small faith-sharing groups and community organizing to fend off the sin of racism. And we worked to make the liturgy reverent and lively. Participation of the laity in all these areas was the key to success. I am grateful for all that I learned from these two wonderful priests.

Father Sullivan died only a year and a half into retirement, and I think of him often. Father Cronin barely started his retirement. God has His reasons, I know, but it does seem like such a loss to the People of God who seek caring, dedicated priests. Ed was one of them. He tried to teach me how to be that too. God bless you, Father Ed Cronin. Say hello to Reddo for me.

Just a final note. We will be wrapping up the dedication brick drive in a couple weeks. If you'd like to dedicate a brick, do not delay. See the parish website for details.

started! But please know that if you would like to help out, but don't want to "solo", we can do that. You can sing with me from the organ area. I won't make you solo if you don't want to, but maybe we could work toward that. We can still use your help.

We can rehearse before Mass or during the week. I usually send recording links via email for people to listen to from home. If you have someone to sing with (spouse, sibling, neighbor, friend, whoever), we can have more than one person at a time.

You do not need to join the choir, but of course you can. If you sang, or currently sing, in your high school or college choir (even if a long time ago), if you enjoy music in general, or if you find music an important part of your liturgical prayer, please talk to me. EXPECT DELAYS - Road Closure, Detour in Place

Location

Village of Tinley Park - The improvements for the 175th Street Construction include full pavement replacement, storm sewer installation, water main and sanitary main relocation, curb and gutter replacement, ADA ramp, sidewalk and multiuse path construction, street lighting and traffic signal replacement and pavement markings along 175th Street, Ridgeland Avenue and Oak Forest Avenue.

Traffic Impact

During construction, 175th Street, Ridgeland Avenue, and Oak Forest Avenue will be restricted to on-way in the EB/NB directions. WB 175th Street and SB Ridgeland Avenue will be closed through work zone limits and traffic detoured via Central Avenue, 167th Street, Oak Park and 177th Street.

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Next weekend, as we celebrate Fathers' Day, we pause to reflect on the gift fathers are to our families. We thank God for how they enrich our lives by their example, their support, their love and their wisdom.

It is also an occasion to honor those who father our parish communities, our priests who minister to us and tend to our needs as pastors. They come to mind as we recall the priest who performed our family marriages, who was at the bedside of a parent, spouse or child close to death, who baptized our children, who heard our confession and whose homilies gave us hope to carry on.

Today, we are given an opportunity to stand by them, as they have stood by us, by giving generously to this weekend's second collection in support of their health and retirement needs. The Priests' Health and Retirement collection is for the benefit of our 411 active and 253 retired priests. We all know how health care costs continue to rise. This year the expenses for health care, nursing and priests' retirement will total \$13 million. This is the only collection for our archdiocesan priests' health and retirement, those ordained to serve in our archdiocesan parishes. It is distinct from the annual collection for religious order priests, sisters and brothers, which was taken up earlier this year.

While our priests begin retirement only at age seventy, many choose to stay active. And, many of those who do retire at seventy continue to let us know we can count on them by helping out on weekends in our parishes. Please join me in letting the sons of this archdiocese, who have stepped forward to give their lives in service to us, know that they can count on us. Join me in making a generous contribution to this weekend's second collection. Also, I ask you to consider naming the Priests' Health and Retirement as one of the beneficiaries in your will, something I personally have done.

Each day they stand by us, so let's stand by them now. We can do a lot if we all do our part. As we give thanks to God for our fathers on Fathers' Day, let's say a prayer for our priests, those who father our parishes.

PLANNED GIVING

God gave up his only Son. What gifts are we willing to give up for God? You can make a gift from your individual retirement plan (IRA) that benefits you and our parish. A qualified charitable distribution (QCD) allows individuals age 70½ or older to authorize their IRA administrator to make a direct transfer of funds from their IRA to qualified charities, tax-free.

There are three main benefits of giving with a QCD:

- 1. If you are 73 years old or older, the amount you transfer can satisfy all or part of your required minimum distribution.
- 2. The amount transferred directly to charity does not generate taxable income, which may reduce your annual income level. This may help lower your Medicare premiums and decrease the amount of Social Security that is subject to tax.
- 3. Your gift will be immediately used, allowing you to see the impact of your gift now.
