

MESSAGE FROM JEANNE LASSANDRELLO



Has anyone ever asked you "what's your favorite color?" "what's your favorite meal?" "what's your favorite song, movie, memory," and the list goes on. When I get asked these or other so called leading questions, inside I freak out. Of course, yellow is beautiful, the sun, flowers, smiley faces, but red is amazing and bold, then there is blue like the sky. Who can choose? Favorite meal, a good grilled steak, an enticing piece of chicken, a

wonderful pasta dish. Who can choose? Why do I have to choose, don't make me! I might have an easier time identifying what I don't like rather than choosing a favorite.

What if someone asked, "what's your favorite part of the mass?" The procession, the handshake of peace, the community, the music, the homily, the commission to "go and serve the Lord?" I know, it's Eucharist, right? I remember there was a time in my life when we got to the end of the mass and the priest (no deacons yet) would say, "the mass has ended go in peace." With a heavy sigh I would respond "thanks be to God." Maybe back then that was my favorite part, it was over. Now I am grateful that is no longer the case for me. I am excited to have spent much of the summer writing a curriculum for our children and our parishioners to give all an opportunity to learn and experience the amazing gift we have received from Jesus. More importantly to be able to share the relationship we have with Jesus.

In today's gospel following the multiplication of the fish and loaves last week, the disciples were looking for him. When they found him he said to them, "Amen, amen, I say to you, you are looking for me not because you saw signs but because you ate the loaves and were filled." John 6:26 Did they seek him out because they were hungry again, or because the people were hungry again and they needed Jesus to feed them, or because they wanted to know more about him? The greatest gift Jesus gave us was Himself! Jesus invites us to meet Him in the Eucharist, and every part of the mass leads us to prepare ourselves for our personal most intimate encounter with Him. We come as we are, with our joys and sorrows, with our successes and failures, with our hopes and dreams. Where else can we go to be with the community of people who have the same feelings we bring and to pray with the communion of saints who now have eternal life?

So when you are attending mass, pay attention to your body language, your responses to the prayers we know, your encounter with Christ through the Eucharist, and how you feel when the mass is over. If you want to share that information I would love to hear it. If you want to join us this year, my plan is to invite you once a month while our students are in class on Wednesday to learn about where in scripture that part of mass is found, how that particular part was incorporated into our tradition, and more. The mass is not a personal devotion, it is communal. Our faith grows when we can share it with each other. Now I hear "the mass has ended, go out to love and serve the Lord and one another." Oh yes, one of my favorites!

Prayer Vigil in Orland Park

Please plan to join a prayer vigil to be held at Orland Park Planned Parenthood. We will gather along the public sidewalk extending from 14470 LaGrange Road in Orland Park. This vigil will take place from 3:00 PM to 4:00 PM on Monday, August 5. Parking is available in the Orland Chateau lot (14500 S. LaGrange Road), but please park in the back.

Even if you can only stop by for a short time, please join us. Show your concern to protect our teenagers from Planned Parenthood. Pray for the conversion of Planned Parenthood's staff. Contrary to their claims, Planned Parenthood's birth control and sex education programs always lead to more unplanned pregnancies and more abortions, not less.

False Claims About Abortion Restrictions

After the U.S. Supreme Court Dobbs decision has allowed the states to legislate more restrictions on abortion, some states have made most abortions illegal. Unfortunately, Illinois is not one of those states. Abortion in Illinois is completely unregulated and in many cases is paid for with tax dollars.

Abortion supporters have invented many false claims to suggest that abortion restrictions are dangerous for women. For example, claims have been made that doctors will not be able to handle ectopic pregnancies and miscarriages because of laws restricting abortion. Such claims are totally unfounded. In fact, laws that restrict abortion provide a much safer environment for mothers and certainly for babies.


We will have a Silver Rose Prayer Service followed by a reception celebrating Our Lady of Guadalupe and a culture of life in our world.

CLIMATE CHANGE: A MATTER OF FAITH? YES

Following John Paul II and Benedict, Pope Francis recognizes the scientific consensus that most of the current warming trends are caused by human activity. Deforestation and burning fossil fuels are major causes. While some have wrongly turned it into a political issue, Pope Francis recognizes it as a social justice and a moral issue. This is because those who will suffer most from the resulting environmental damage are the poor and future generations...who are least responsible for causing it. Francis calls upon individuals, governments and corporations to make changes to mitigate the problem. He has met with top energy company executives and they have agreed to support policies that put a price on carbon emissions. The US Conference of Catholic Bishops also has issued a statement of past support for legislation that puts a price on carbon emissions to encourage a switch to clean energy, without economically harming the poor or middle class. The severe human costs, that will be a consequence of doing nothing, make this a moral issue and a matter of concern and action as part of our faith.
