MESSAGE FROM FATHER PAUL

Today we celebrate the Feast of Christ the King, or as it is now officially known, The Solemnity of Jesus Christ, King of the Universe (which seems a little

overwrought, doesn't it?). This Sunday ends the liturgical year, and we cap it off by honoring Our Lord in His ultimate height of majesty. Today's Gospel presents us with Jesus at what would seem to be His most vulnerable. We see Jesus verbally jousting with Pontius Pilate, as He is asked, "Are you the King of the Jews?" It seems that Pilate is truly interested in this preacher from backwater Nazareth who has the Jewish leaders so upset. Jesus responds by telling him what we know: Jesus' Kingdom is not of this world.

Sometimes we can get so caught up in the issues of our own time, that we forget that we are not of this world. We are not of "this kingdom." We belong to the Kingdom where Jesus Christ is our leader, our Lord and Our Savior. Naturally, we have to deal with the things of this world. We have our very real worries and concerns --- our families, our health, our security. These are things that deserve our attention and best efforts.

We go astray when peripheral issues consume our attention at the expense of these greater worldly priorities. In the last few weeks since the election, comedians have joked about the Kennedy family, with its wide political divergence these days, saying, "Wouldn't you like to see that Thanksgiving dinner?" It gets a laugh. But it's no laughing matter when it is our own families.

As I have said several times, we cannot allow politics to destroy our families and friendships. Name any politician, and I will tell you, they don't know you, they don't love you and they don't care about you. Why would anyone trade in a relative or friend for

that? But it has happened to many of us. So if you've not invited people who you should love to share your Thanksgiving, I hope you'll make a call in these last days before this great American holiday. Agree to disagree, agree not to talk about it, agree your love for each other is more important than all this other, um, nonsense.

Speaking of the Kennedy family, lately I've been revisiting some of their words (feet of clay and all). I guess after the ugliness of recent months, I need some inspiration that America still has our "higher angels". So here are a few reminders...

John Kennedy:

- *A man may die, nations may rise and fall, but an idea lives on.*
- *If a free society cannot save the many who are poor, it cannot save the few who are rich.*
- *Let us not emphasize all on which we differ but all we have in common. Let us consider not what we fear separately but what we share together.*
- *I am certain that after the dust of centuries has passed over our cities, we, too, will be remembered not for victories or defeats in battle or in politics, but for our contribution to the human spirit.*

Robert Kennedy, Sr:

- *Only those who dare to fail greatly can ever achieve greatly.*
- *There are people in every time and every land who want to stop history in its tracks. They fear the future, mistrust the present, and invoke the security of a comfortable past which, in fact, never existed.*
- *Some men see things as they are, and ask "Why?" I dream of things that never were, and ask, "Why not?"*

Ted Kennedy:

- *The work begins anew. The hope rises again. And the dream lives on.*

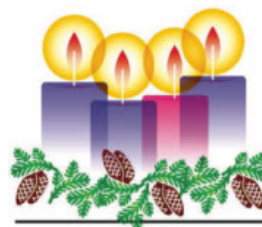

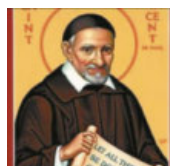

THANKS Giving Day

We gather with loved ones for Thanksgiving. Some may not know the origin of the day itself as a civic holiday. It was declared a holiday by Abraham Lincoln. The following are excerpts from his Thanksgiving Proclamation from October 3, 1863.

The year that is drawing toward its close has been filled with the blessings of fruitful fields and healthful skies. To these bounties, which are so constantly enjoyed that we are prone to forget the source from which they come, others have been added, which are of so extraordinary a nature that they cannot fail to penetrate the even soften the heart which is habitually insensible to the ever-watchful providence of Almighty God...Needful diversions of wealth and of strength from the fields of peaceful industry to the national defense have not arrested the plow, the shuttle, or the ship; the ax has enlarged the borders of our settlements, and the mines, as well of iron and coal as of the precious metals, have yielded even more abundantly than heretofore. Population has steadily increased...rejoicing in the consciousness of augmented strength and vigor, is permitted to expect continuance of years with large increase of freedom...It has seemed to me fit and proper that they [God's gracious gifts] should be solemnly, reverently, and gratefully acknowledged as with one heart and one voice by the whole American people. I do, therefore, invite my fellow-citizens in every part of the United States, and also those who are at sea and those who are sojourning in foreign lands, to set apart and observe the last Thursday of November next as a Day of Thanksgiving and Praise to our beneficent Father who dwelleth in the heavens...

The following blessing can be read at your meal of Thanksgiving. It is from the Church's Book of Blessings:

God most provident, we join all creation in raising to you a hymn of thanksgiving through Jesus Christ, your Son. For generation upon generation peoples of this land have sung of your bounty; we too offer you praise for the rich harvest we have received at your hands. Bless us and this food which we share with grateful hearts. Continue to make our land fruitful and let our love for you be seen in our pursuit of peace and justice and in our generous response to those in need. Praise and glory to you, Lord God, now and for ever. Amen.

SAINT GEORGE PRO-LIFE

PRO-LIFE LAWS RESTRICTING ABORTION NOT CAUSING DEATHS

Recent news reports from Georgia, Texas, and elsewhere have claimed women died when they could not get emergency care because of state laws restricting abortion. When the details are revealed about the cases where mothers have died, the claims that legal restrictions on abortion led to these deaths are found to be false. The cases cited actually occurred as a result of the dangers of using the abortion drugs Mifepristone and Misoprostol. According to the FDA's own label, roughly one in 25 women who use abortion drugs end up in the emergency room. Women and girls across the country have suffered serious, even life-threatening, complications such as severe bleeding, infections, or sepsis. Despite these risks, the FDA has removed all in-person doctor visits, including necessary screenings for serious conditions and life-threatening complications like ectopic pregnancies, as well as follow-up care, causing more women to end up in hospital emergency rooms. In fact, one study cited by the FDA showed that hospitalizations increased 300 percent with no in-person doctor visit.
