

#### Message from Father Paul



So how was your Thanksgiving? I hope it was a wonderful time for family and friends to get together, to catch up and to truly give

thanks for all we have. I visited the Children's Faith Formation sessions before the holiday, and I gave them homework: when you say your prayers before bed, tell God five things you are grateful for. It is a simple exercise and a very healthy one, too. People who are grateful are always aware of their blessings. People who are not grateful dwell on all they don't have. It makes a difference. It's the most joyful homework we can do!

Today we begin our time of preparation for the coming of Our Lord at Christmas. Advent is a season of four weeks. Each week brings us a new angle, a new understanding of what kind of preparation we need. It makes sense that Thanksgiving comes right before Advent (even though it wasn't planned that way). What better preparation to welcome the Lord than by warming our hearts with gratitude for all we have received?

The Hand of God is a generous one. He doles out graces like the farmer who throws the seed around willy-nilly. Grace is in the air! It lands on hearts that are open and fertile. It lands on hearts that are struggling. It even lands on hearts that are completely closed off (usually because of ingratitude which is

caused by jealousy. When you look at all the rancor in society today, its roots can be found in people who feel they have been short-changed and envy those who they perceive as having something that they should have themselves. It's an ugly picture).

Grateful hearts are open. They are tender. They beat with joy and always look ahead with hope. This should not be misunderstood that all we have to do is put on rose-colored glasses. No, that is not true Christianity. The true Christian recognizes their own pain, and the pain of others. We know life has its tragedies. We even know the tragedies that would touch Jesus whose birth we await. We do not ignore these things. In fact, we embrace them, not in some weird masochistic way but rather as an opportunity to allow God's prolific grace to take root in a new way in our hearts.

I heard a priest tell a story of visiting a patient in the hospital. He offered prayers asking for healing, that the pain would be taken away, and she would be renewed in health. The priest invited the woman to offer her own prayer. She offered prayers of thanks for all her blessings. That was it. What a beautiful example for all of us. Her attitude in life was that of appreciation, humility and joy. What better way to spend Advent as we look to Christmas? Be blessed!



# EUCHARIST ADORATION SERVICE HONORING THE FEAST OF OUR LADY OF GUADALUPE AS WE PRAY FOR PEACE IN OUR WORLD



Our Lady appeared to Juan Diego, instructed him to visit his bishop and ask that a temple be built on the site of her appearance, so that she would have a place to hear petitions and to heal the suffering of the Mexican people. After repeated visits to the bishop, without success, on December 12, when Juan Diego makes another visit to the bishop, he opened his tilma in his presence, and roses fell to the ground. The bishop sank to his knees. On the tilma where the roses had been appeared an image of Mary exactly as she had appeared at the hill of Tepeyac. Our Lady of Guadalupe had this to say to Juan Diego: "I will give all my love, my compassion, my help and my protection to the people. I am your merciful mother, the merciful mother of all of you who live united in this land, and of all mankind, of all those who love me, of those who cry to me, of those who seek me, of those who have confidence in me. Here I will hear their weeping, their sorrow, and will remedy and alleviate all their multiple sufferings, necessities and misfortunes."

In preparation for the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe (December 12), the Eucharist Adoration Service on December 10 will be dedicated to Our Lady of Guadalupe. After the adoration service, we will join together to pray Pope John Paul II's Prayer to Our Lady of Guadalupe. Please join us as we pray to Our Lady for peace in our world!

Depending on the location that would be more convenient, if you learn of a pregnant woman who is considering abortion, suggest that she call The Women's Center at 708-425-0707 (Evergreen Park), Aid for Women at 312-621-1100 (Flossmoor and downtown Chicago), PASS Pregnancy Care Center at 708-614-9777 (Tinley Park and South Holland), or Southside Women's Services at 708-229-0092 (Evergreen Park). If there is a change of heart after taking the abortion pill, call 877-558-0333 or go to AbortionPillReversal.com. There may still be time to save your pregnancy.

#### PRAYER VIGIL IN ORLAND PARK

Please plan to join a prayer vigil to be held at Orland Park Planned Parenthood. We will gather along the public sidewalk extending from 14470 LaGrange Road in Orland Park. This vigil will take place from 3:00 PM to 4:00 PM on Monday, December 2. Parking is available in the Orland Chateau lot (14500 S. LaGrange Road), but please park in the back.

Even if you can only stop by for a short time, please join us. Show your concern to protect our teenagers from Planned Parenthood. Pray for the conversion of Planned Parenthood's staff. Contrary to their claims, Planned Parenthood's birth control and sex education programs always lead to more unplanned pregnancies and more abortions, not less.




