

Message from Father Paul



Today's Gospel touches on an issue that is very much on the mind of every person during this run-up to Christmas --- greed. John the

Baptist is asked by various people what they must do to prepare for the coming Messiah. And it is an interesting bunch who ask: soldiers and tax collectors are specifically named. These are exactly the people you wouldn't expect. Soldiers were part of the Roman occupation of Palestine and many tax collectors were Israelites, considered collaborators with the Roman enemy. Traitors to their own people. Yet, here they are, asking how to lead better lives.

John gives four directives: share, don't cheat people, don't extort money, and be satisfied with your wages. All of these are intended to guide people away from greed. And here we are, preparing for the coming of Jesus Christ at Christmas and at the end of time, being told all the things we absolutely have to have and all the things we absolutely have to give so everyone has a wonderful Christmas. Oh, boy.

So here's a thought. If anyone asks you what you would like for Christmas, go ahead and tell them but maybe add, "What I'd really appreciate is if you would go to Mass on Christmas." I talk

to so many people who are deeply hurt that family members don't go to Mass. Maybe asking for that as a gift would move them in the right direction and move us away from the greed John the Baptist warns against.

Bulletin deadlines are all jumbled up, so I have to write these well in advance. By the time you read this, I will have spent three days at the southern border in El Paso, Texas to see the good work the Church is doing for suffering immigrants. I'll fill you in when I can.

I want to urge everyone to join us on Monday at 6:30 PM for our parish Reconciliation Service. This is a beautiful way to prepare for Christmas. We will have plenty of priests available. Please come and prepare the way of the Lord!

Finally, I ask that you join in prayer for Ms. Charlotte Pratl, our school principal. She has had some health setbacks that have kept her away from work. Ms. Pratl is very dedicated and loves our school, so it is frustrating for her not to be present for our students who she loves so much. Hopefully, she will be back to work after Christmas break. In the meantime, our school is being well-tended by Ms. Stock and Ms. Rojas. I am very grateful for the extra work they are doing and the whole staff at the school who always go at 110%.


If you drop off envelopes at the parish office, please use the mail slot in the wall marked, "Key Deposit" which will bring them safely into the parish office.




