

Message from Father Paul



In today's Gospel, John the Baptist cries out, "Prepare the way of the Lord!" He was announcing that finally the Messiah had

come in Jesus Christ. John must have been quite a sight, certainly an eccentric. But he had a message to convey and he did it forcefully, with conviction. Each of us is called to be a John the Baptist, too. We are to be heralds of good news, that Jesus is real and alive in our hearts and world. He is more than just an historic figure who said nice things. He is the Lord of our lives! He lives and is moving among us... and he wants us to feel Him deeply within our hearts, so He can heal our souls and fill our lives with goodness. That's our message to the world today, so go ahead --be a little eccentric! Jesus needs us to speak for Him!

Today we have a second collection for the Retired Religious. All those priests, brothers and sisters who taught so many of us. Their work was extraordinary, and it continues today in us and in those who followed their footsteps. Please be generous and be sure to use an envelope for that collection when you drop it in the box.

Please be sure to read the Pro-Life article today. It refers to a particularly heinous bill in the Illinois legislature to legalize assisted suicide. There are already about nine states where this practice is legal. We hold that all human life is sacred and a gift from God. It is not for us to reject this gift.

I know the pain many people experience watching a loved one suffering. And there is nothing morally wrong with withdrawing medical care when it becomes evident that the body is no longer able to function and there is no hope for meaningful recovery. Sometimes you may hear older people say, "I don't know why I am still here." Every person has mean and a purpose. Perhaps the reason some people continue to live even when burdened with illness is to bring something better out of us. Maybe through sick people, God is trying to draw out more and deeper love from us.

I am convinced that God has a special place in heaven for caregivers. It is an act of generosity and sacrifice like few others. But even caregivers need support and a break. We have such a group here at Saint George. Their next meeting will be Tuesday, December 17 at 6:30 PM. If you are a caregiver, you are most welcome to join us.

This week I will be going on a mission trip with the Catholic Extension Society which does so much good work in the mission fields of our own country. I will be in El Paso, Texas to see the important work the Church is doing at the border.

Saint Paul says in the second reading today, "I pray always with joy in my every prayer for all of you." Those words echo my feelings for the people of Saint George. Thank you for your kindness, your generosity and inspiration.

EUCHARIST ADORATION SERVICE HONORING THE FEAST OF OUR LADY OF GUADALUPE AS WE PRAY FOR PEACE IN OUR WORLD



Our Lady appeared to Juan Diego, instructed him to visit his bishop and ask that a temple be built on the site of her appearance, so that she would have a place to hear petitions and to heal the suffering of the Mexican people. After repeated visits to the bishop, without success, on December 12, when Juan Diego makes another visit to the bishop, he opened his tilma in his presence, and roses fell to the ground. The bishop sank to his knees. On the tilma where the roses had been appeared an image of Mary exactly as she had appeared at the hill of Tepeyac. Our Lady of Guadalupe had this to say to Juan Diego: "I will give all my love, my compassion, my help and my protection to the people. I am your merciful mother, the merciful mother of all of you who live united in this land, and of all mankind, of all those who love me, of those who cry to me, of those who seek me, of those who have confidence in me. Here I will hear their weeping, their sorrow, and will remedy and alleviate all their multiple sufferings, necessities and misfortunes."

In preparation for the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe (December 12), the Eucharist Adoration Service on December 10 will be dedicated to Our Lady of Guadalupe. After the adoration service, we will join together to pray Pope John Paul II's Prayer to Our Lady of Guadalupe. Please join us as we pray to Our Lady for peace in our world!

ACTION NEEDED: DANGEROUS ILLINOIS BILL SB 3499

Please contact your state senator and representative now to express your opposition to Senate Bill 3499, a proposed piece of legislation that seeks to legalize assisted suicide in Illinois. Many of you may have Senator Michael Hastings (815-464-5431) and Representative Debbie Meyers-Martin (708-833-7010).

The proponents of this bill are actively urging lawmakers to pass SB 3499 during the upcoming Lame Duck session, which begins on January 2 and concludes on January 8, when the 104th General Assembly is sworn into office.

Laws permitting assisted suicide pose significant risks to the poor, marginalized, and disabled, who may face pressure to end their lives rather than receive the care and compassion they need and deserve. There are documented cases from states where assisted suicide has been legalized, where individuals with rare or lifethreatening conditions were denied necessary medical treatment and were instead offered life-ending prescriptions.




