

Message from Father Paul



Blessed 2025 to you! The New Year is off and running. We can look back on the past year and make our own

assessments about the world, our country and our own lives. Each of these, I think, should be evaluated through the lens of our faith. If we do so honestly, and courageously, all of us should feel challenged but always with a sense of hope. If we find that things, including ourselves, have not gone in the direction we would like, we know we still have a chance to make things right.

Turning the page of a calendar does nothing, other than give us the veneer of some new possibilities. But there is nothing new about it. Those possibilities are there for us every day of every year. Maybe resolutions are best made one day at a time. Too often we can feel defeated by a single failure in some unrealistic pursuit. Sometimes the best way to make progress in our Christian life is to be gentle with ourselves.

Are there situations in your life or in the wider world that make you anxious or unsettled? That may mean you are looking at life realistically and seeing wrongs that need to be righted. And that's a very good impulse. But sometimes we need to retreat into a quiet place where we can regenerate our spirits and refresh ourselves in God's grace. We do that through prayer, reflection, meeting good friends, helping someone, maybe a nice cup of hot chocolate!

As much as we would like to, we can't fix everything. We have to come to peace with that. Our anger or anxiety or depression won't change anything, except take us further down that rabbit hole. But there are things we can change to influence our own little corner of God's green earth. We don't have to convert anyone or cajole anyone into our way of thinking. We first have to love. That's it. We simply have to love and see things through the eyes of Jesus Christ.

Today we celebrate the Epiphany. Three Wise Men came in search of the newborn king. Seeking Jesus will take us on a road that will be surprising, beautiful and sometimes rocky. If our eyes are always fixed on the radiant love of Jesus, we will share that love with everyone we meet. And 2025 will truly become a year of Our Lord. Happy New Year to you!


If you weren't available last Fall, please don't let that discourage you from joining us now. You don't need to commit to attending every week. Just come whenever your schedule allows!

PLANNED GIVING

Have You "Insured" Our Parish?

A life insurance gift is a powerful and simple way to provide future support for our parish. Here are two ways to give a gift of life insurance to Saint George Parish:

- Name our parish as a beneficiary of the policy. Simply update your beneficiary designation form with your policy holder and list the beneficiary as: "Saint George Parish, The Catholic Bishop of Chicago, a Corporation Sole"
 - You can name our parish as the primary beneficiary for a percentage or a specific amount, or make us the contingent beneficiary so that we will receive the balance of your policy only if your primary beneficiary doesn't survive you. This is a great option if you want to have access to the cash value of the policy if you ever need it or if you want to retain the right to change the beneficiaries of a policy depending on family circumstances.
- 2. Make an outright gift of an existing policy. You can irrevocably name our parish as owner and beneficiary of a policy with accumulated cash value that you and your family no longer need. You qualify for a federal income tax charitable deduction when you itemize on your taxes. Also, if you continue to pay premiums on the policy, each payment is tax deductible as a charitable gift, if you itemize.
- 3. For more information on making a gift of life insurance to our parish, we recommend you consult with your financial planner, attorney or insurance representative. New Year's Resolution Ideas: Efficiency

Studies indicate that a large chunk of a household's carbon footprint is linked to their home energy usage, and represents a significant portion of overall carbon pollution. Improving home energy efficiency helps care for creation and contributes to climate stability. Consider creating a plan to upgrade your appliances to Energy Star when they reach the end of their service life. This could include water heaters, stoves, furnaces, air conditioners, clothes dryers, washing machines, microwaves, and dishwashers. Switching away from fossil fuels is an added plus but may require some advance planning (i.e. like where to place 240-volt outlets). Weatherstripping and adding insulation to the home will further contribute to energy efficiency.




