

MESSAGE FROM FATHER PAUL



What does it mean to be Catholic today?

Sometimes it's good to take a moment for

self-reflection. Being Catholic is core to our lives. Father Tom McCarthy, OSA, one of the south side's favorite sons, will lead us through our parish mission February 17 to 19. Father Tom is familiar to many in our area, and all across the country. Father Tom is a dynamic speaker with a true heart of a priest. Father will walk us through what it means to be Catholic today. He will renew us in our faith and re-energize us to move forward as a light of hope to the world. Please plan on joining us at Saint Julie Church at 7:00 PM February 17 to 19. You deserve this beautiful experience!

So why are we having our parish mission at Saint Julie? Actually, Saint George, Saint Julie and Saint Elizabeth Seton are all joining together for this important event. Throughout the Archdiocese, parishes are intentionally seeking ways to work together. Many of us grew up trained to have deep parish lovalties. But we are in a new era. It is evident that we need to work in a new way and recognize we are not merely members of a parish. We have a wider vision that makes us more "catholic" as Catholics. We reach beyond

borders and join hands with other faithful people. We are a universal church! So working with our neighboring parishes not only makes sense but is true to our Catholic identity.

I am hoping we will see more of this kind of collaboration among our parishes. A group representing eight parishes in our community named the Vision Council has been meeting to seek out new ways to work together. We already have some collaborative efforts, including Home Build, Teen Ministry, Order of Chistian Initiation (the process for becoming Catholic), and now the mission. The Vision Council is also working on a cooperative Pre-Cana program. These are exciting opportunities for parishes to learn from each other and work out of our strengths.

Last week, we experienced the heartbreaking tragedies of the air collision over the Potomac River and the crash in Pennsylvania. These are hard reminders of the fragility of life. We offer our prayers for the souls of those who died, for their families, and the first responders who help us in our moments of need. Let's hold those we love a little closer. Let's find ways to repair broken relationships. We need each more than we realize.

SAINT GEORGE PRO-LIFE

March for Life in Washington, D.C.

Hundreds of thousands of Pro-Life Americans marched in rather cold temperatures on January 24 in Washington, D.C., both celebrating the overturning of Roe v. Wade and focusing on the big task ahead at the state level (e.g. in Illinois) to protect mothers and their babies from the enticing lies offered by abortion providers. While about 25 states are providing protections from abortion for mothers and their babies, the other states are using government power to promote and expand abortion with virtually no oversight or regulation. During the rally that preceded the march, many dynamic speakers encouraged continued resolve to seek the protection of life from conception to natural death in all states. Unfortunately, most "mainstream" media outlets now practice nearly complete censorship of the March for Life. Even so, this large annual gathering continues to send a powerful message that abortion must be made unthinkable.


