MESSAGE FROM FATHER PAUL



In today's Gospel, Jesus makes an obvious connect between the heart and the mouth. The heart is the

place of feelings, emotions and reactions. The mouth is where those things come out in the form of words. These words can have a tremendous impact on other people and our relationship with them. I have heard it said about a commentator, "He never had an unpublished thought." The meaning being that the author didn't stop to do a vital piece to stop, weigh, evaluate and consider his comments. In other words, he didn't stop to think. To think! That cherished uniquely human ability to reason.

How many times have you or I had to apologize for words we spoke that hurt someone, and we said, "I'm sorry, I didn't stop to think!" How many times have we regretted something we said (or wrote on social media)? The human mind can be a marvelous fount of wisdom, if we choose to use it. Simple things like slowing down our reactions to comments or events can help us offer more measured, caring responses. "Shooting from the hip" can mean a person is direct and up-front with their feelings. It can also mean they are a verbal bull in a china shop, unthinking of what their comments may mean to someone else.

In the wonderful play and movie, "Harvey," the main character, Elwood P. Dowd, has a beautiful line of reasoning. He says, "My mother always told me, in this world, Elwood, you must be oh so smart or oh so pleasant. For years I was smart. I recommend pleasant." Maybe more of us should listen to Elwood's mother.

This has been a full week. As I write this, our Holy Father Pope Francis is in critical condition in a hospital in Rome. Please keep him in your prayers. Pope Francis has had a tumultuous reign but he has maintained his warmth and humor. May God bless Pope Francis.

Closer to home, we welcomed our school principal, Mrs. Pratl, back to work. She has undergone a series of operations that significantly extended her time away. On Monday. we welcomed her back to work with flowers, songs and cheers. She is pacing herself as she is still in recovery. God bless you Mrs. Pratl. 

On Wednesday, March 5, we begin the holy season of Lent. Ash Wednesday provides an opportunity for everyone to come to pray and receive ashes. These forty holy days are intended for us to focus on prayer, fasting and almsgiving, as the readings on Ash Wednesday teach us. That day, the collection will go to Aid for the Church in Central and Eastern Europe per archdiocese instructions. Please come and begin your Lent well – pray with us!

ASH WEDNESDAY - MARCH 5

Masses with ash distribution will take place at 8:15 AM and 7:00 PM. A prayer service with ash distribution is scheduled at 3:30 PM.

LENTEN REGULATIONS

Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years old and older on Ash Wednesday and on all the Fridays of Lent. Fasting is to be observed on Ash Wednesday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 59. Those who are bound by this may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted. The special Paschal fast, as well as abstinence, are prescribed for Good Friday and encouraged for Holy Saturday.

Please join us for Stations of the Cross at 7:00 PM on Friday evenings during Lent. The Men's Club, Ushers and Greeters will be sponsoring the evening on March 7. The Women of the Parish will be sponsoring the Stations on March 14.

SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION

The Parish Reconciliation Service will take place on Wednesday, March 26 at 6:30 PM.

Private reconciliation is scheduled on Saturdays from 2:30 PM to 3:30 PM. Confessions will not be heard on Holy Saturday.

How to use the "Little Black Book"

This Little Black Book is your companion for Lent. It's an

old-fashioned "vademecum" (pronounced vahdmaykum).

That's Latin for "travel with me" and the name was used for a book that was a constant companion-perhaps a condensed book of rituals and prayers for traveling priests.

The Little Black Book travels easily in your pocket, purse, or glove compartment. The idea is to find quiet time every day during Lent, and walk through this Little Book a page at a time. It's an investment that will pay big returns. The key is the righthand page, which will walk through the Passion according to John, with explanations and reflections along the way. It's an ancient

way of praying the Scriptures -called lectio divina. God speaks to us "live" through sacred Word. If you will consciously stay open to the Lord present in these words, you will be surprised by the thoughts that come. On the Sundays of Lent, the righthand page will take us through different forms of prayer.

The left-hand page has a variety of guotes, information and timely thoughts, many of which are centered around the virtue of hope. (If pressed for time, go directly to the righthand page and spend your time there.)

We will not start reading the Passion until Ash Wednesday. But we will begin preparing on Sunday, March 2 (the Sunday before Ash Wednesday), and spend three days getting ready for Lent.

We need to use these three days to ask for God's help in making some course corrections in our lives.

EXTRAORDINARY MINISTERS OF COMMUNION

In 1971, extraordinary ministers of the Eucharist were first permitted in the United States. At that time, the Congregation of the Sacraments responded to a request of the American bishops to allow laypersons to assist priests in giving Holy Communion.

Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist are first and foremost a member of the Body of Christ, one of the holy people of God. In Baptism, we all were claimed by Christ as one of Christ's own and marked with the sign of the cross. Through the waters of Baptism, we died with Christ to all that was not of God and were cleansed of all that could separate us from God. In Confirmation, we were anointed with Chrism as one who shares in the priestly, prophetic and royal ministry of Jesus, the Anointed One, the Christ.

As Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist, we are called to further service of the Body of Christ, the Church, as we share the gift of the Body and Blood of Christ with God's people. Like all ministries, this is a great honor and a great responsibility. We undertake it with the intention to grow in our devotion to the liturgy, to the Church that celebrates it, and most importantly, to the Lord, through whom, with whom and in whom we live and move and have our being. We are called to a most beautiful ministry. As a witness and a sign of the "Eucharist", you represent the local faith community, the parish, and the universal church.

We are in need of additional Extraordinary Ministers of Communion to serve at our weekend liturgies. Becoming an Extraordinary Minister of Communion is a great way to become involved in the life of our parish. The time commitment is minimal and your assistance would benefit our parish community.

To become an Extraordinary Minister of Communion you must be: a Catholic in good sanding having received the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation); have a love for the Eucharist and Confirmation, a desire to share your faith through this ministry and have an acceptance of this call as a gift and an opportunity to be of service.
