

MESSAGE FROM FATHER PAUL



There are those times when we just need a little encouragement. Sometimes we can feel very much alone. I think that is often the case for

Catholics. We can get to feeling like we are isolated and alone in the world because our values and concerns are often not understood or appreciated. Our moral positions run the gamut of societal opinion. We are too conservative on abortion, too liberal on immigration, too open to new ideas (at the moment) and too... well, you get the idea.

It is important for us to keep the Gospel as our guidepost along the way. As we consider various issues in society, our first and last thought must be, "How does this stack up with the Gospel?" If we find ourselves arguing with God, that is a losing proposition. So we listen. We feel the Spirit. And, as the prophet Micah said, "He has shown you, O mortal, what is good. And what does the Lord require of you? To act justly, love mercy and walk humbly with your God." It doesn't help that some leading Catholics on social media seem to have forgotten this to make political points.

So it is in this mixed up jumble that it is especially encouraging to see new people coming into the Catholic Church. Here at Saint George, we have several people who have responded to the movement of the Spirit within them. Last Sunday, our Director of Life-Long Formation, Jeanne Lassandrello and I accompanied them to a packed Holy Name Cathedral for the Rite of Election. There they were greeted by Cardinal Cupich. We prayed for them, and each of their names was called out. They met the Cardinal personally and received his blessing.

It was amazing to see all these catechumens (those preparing for baptism) and candidates (those who are coming from other Christian denominations) fill the sanctuary. Hundreds of them! The Cardinal made a point to say that this was just one of four similar ceremonies. At the Easter Vigil, there will be thousands of people in the Archdiocese of Chicago who will receive the Easter sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist.

Please keep them in your prayers over these remaining weeks prior to the Easter Vigil. They are our brothers and sisters, and we welcome them. At the Cathedral, there were several entire families who presented themselves. I wonder if we have families who have not completed these three basic sacraments. Any individual should speak to Ms. Lassandrello and she will be happy to get the ball rolling.

Next Saturday is Super Bingo! This is always a big event. IF you don't have a ticket yet, call the school and see if any are available. CARDINAL CUPICH RECENTLY SENT THIS TO ALL THE PRIESTS OF THE ARCHDIOCESE.

March 2025

Dear Brothers,

This week the President of our Episcopal Conference, Archbishop Timothy Broglio, wrote to encourage support of Ukraine as the world marks the 3rd anniversary of the Russian invasion. He reminded us that "as Catholics, we are acutely aware that every past occupation of Ukraine has resulted in various degrees of repression of the Catholic Church in the country." We cannot let this happen again.

Since the invasion I have made two visits to this war-torn land. I have seen first-hand the suffering that this unjust violation of a nation's sovereignty has brought to the "martyred people of Ukraine", a phrase Pope Francis recently used. I heard stories of family members killed defending their homeland, of the destruction of their homes and towns, of family separation, of leaving behind their lives and livelihoods, yes even of the barbaric abduction of children. I saw mass graves containing bodies of people gunned down on streets as they foraged for food and sought shelter from rocket attacks.

Yet, amid the tragedy, I witnessed extraordinary heroism of citizens who became soldiers overnight, first responders who fought fires caused by rocket attacks and neighbors reaching out to each other to provide food and shelter.

Regrettably, we now hear powerful voices attempting to change the narrative and rewrite history by declaring that Ukraine started the war or even that Russian's invasion can be defended. What is the truth?

- 1) Ukraine is not the aggressor in this war.
- 2) The invasion by Russia was unprovoked and in breach of international law and the UN Charter.
- 3) The violation of Ukraine's sovereignty was also a violation of the security assurances made 30 years ago by guarantor states when Ukraine agreed to turn over its nuclear arsenal, the third largest in the world.

Yes, we need to pray for peace and for negotiations that will lead to a just peace and lasting security for Ukraine. But this can happen only if Ukraine is at the table, if the truth is told and the nations of the world honor the promises that were made in treaties signed. Ukraine has the right to its existence and its self-determination. Most of all in this moment, Ukraine has the right to be a true architect of the pathway to peace that can lie ahead.

Archbishop Broglio was right in reminding us how "every past occupation of Ukraine has resulted in various degrees of repression of the Catholic Church in the country." He is also right in tell us "we must not tolerate the forcing of our brothers and sisters underground again." Let's make it clear to our people that we stand with Ukraine.

Flossmoor 40 Days or Life Vigil

Join the 40 Days for Life vigil at Planned Parenthood in Flossmoor on any day now through April 13. Thursday is a known abortion day, so that would be a good day for on-site prayer for the victims of abortion. Join other Saint George parishioners from 10:00 AM to 11:00 AM any Thursday from March 20 through April 10, or choose any hour from 8:00 AM to 4:00 PM (ending at 5:00 PM) for prayer on site at the Planned Parenthood abortion facility in Flossmoor at 19831 S. Governors Highway. Public parking is available 1/2 block north of the Planned Parenthood site on 198th Street which runs west from Governors Hwy, or along the alley that runs east from Governor's Hwy behind the Vollmer Road strip mall (parking spots facing Planned Parenthood). You can schedule your vigil time at 40daysforlife.com/en/flossmoor/.

This vigil is part of the national call for 40 days of prayer and fasting for an end to abortion running from March 5 through April 13 and is one of over 650 in 30 nations. During these 40 days, please make an extra effort to pray and fast for the end of abortion in our nation (e.g. make extra visits to Holy Family Chapel and/or attend weekday Mass).



These forty holy days are intended for us to focus on prayer, fasting and almsgiving, Please come and begin your Lent well – pray with us!

LENTEN REGULATIONS

Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years old and older on Ash Wednesday and on all the Fridays of Lent. Fasting is to be observed on Ash Wednesday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 59. Those who are bound by this may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted. The special Paschal fast, as well as abstinence, are prescribed for Good Friday and encouraged for Holy Saturday.

STATIONS OF THE CROSS

Please join us for Stations of the Cross at 7:00 PM on Friday evenings during Lent. On March 21, the Stations will be sponsored by the Knights of Columbus. The Music Ministry, Lectors and Eucharistic Ministers will be sponsoring the stations on March 28.

Let us walk together in the footsteps of Christ.

SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION

The Parish Reconciliation Service will take place on Wednesday, March 26 at 6:30 PM.

Private reconciliation is scheduled on Saturdays from 2:30 PM to 3:30 PM. Confessions will not be heard on Holy Saturday.

EUCHARISTIC ADORATION

Eucharistic Adoration takes place on Tuesdays from 6:00 PM to 7:00 PM in Church, and Monday through Friday from 11:00 AM to Midnight in Holy Family Chapel

A STORY OF HOPE FROM NIGERIA Paying it Forward as a Lead Mother.

Amina Bukar, a mother of five, is a wellrespected leader and small business owner in Muna Moforo, Nigeria. In her village nutrition

group, she teaches mothers how to prepare nutrient-rich porridge for their children to help them grow strong and healthy. This is important because in Nigeria, more than 25 million people face extreme hunger and lack access to nutritious food. Amina makes regular house visits to families in her community to provide support and knowledge for leading healthy lives.

Amina and her family used to live in their hometown of Marte. She owned a chicken farm and a store. Her husband, Garba, worked for a water and land conservation agency. But in 2014, violence in their community forced them to flee their village.

"My husband placed me and the children in a pick-up truck and asked us to go my auntie's house," Amina says. "I left with just my purse, a small amount of money and the clothes on my back. I used to live well but suddenly, I lost everything. It affected me mentally.

After arriving in Muna Moforo, Amina and her family had to start life all over again. Amina joined a Catholic Relief Services

program that provided food and cooking supplies. This enabled her family to eat healthy meals as they worked to rebuild their lives and find employment.

"Before we didn't have the money to buy sardines or even eggs to eat well," Amina says. Now, she and her family can prepare balanced meals, like eggs and yams for breakfast.

Amina started a food grinding business to earn income. She also began preparing specialty foods to sell in the market, like hibiscus drinks and gingerbread palm fruit. She earned enough money to support her family's needs and now provides materials to other women to help them start their own businesses.

"[Amina] is always here, listening to the women and their concerns," says Garba, her husband. Because of her supportive and caring nature, Amina was nominated to be a lead mother in her village. By empowering mothers and caregivers, she is helping her community overcome the challenges of hunger so they can thrive!
