

# Message from Father Paul



Today I would like to offer a brief summary of terms we use in the Church which we use, I think, for no other reason than to confuse people...

This weekend we begin the first of three scrutinies with our catechumens and candidates. Lost yet?

Let's start with the people. Catechumens are people who have never been baptized who now seek to become Catholic. They have felt the movement of the Holy Spirit within them to live life on a deeper level in their relationship with God. Candidates are those who have already been baptized in some Christian church. We do not re-baptize people. As long as they have been baptized in water in the Name of the Father of and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, the Catholic Church recognizes it as a valid baptism. They have heard the call to live out their Christian Faith with the Catholic Church.

The Scrutinies are what they sound like. When you scrutinize something, you examine it closely. At the 9:30 AM Mass for these three weeks, we as the Catholic People, will ask questions of the catechumens and candidates, to affirm their calling to the Catholic Church. The 9:30 AM Masses will use special readings. This Sunday, we hear of the story of Jesus meeting a woman at a well. Next week will be the story of the blind man regaining his sight. And the final week we hear of the raising

of Lazarus from the dead. Each of these stories show us a process of conversion. Stay tuned. They are great stories!

Our faith is completely focused on the Holy Triduum. Huh? The Triduum is the three days when we celebrate the central mystery of our faith --- Holy Thursday (the day of the Last Supper); Good Friday (the day Jesus died on the Cross); and Easter Sunday (the day of Resurrection). That's The Pascal Mystery --- short-hand for the Passion, Death and Resurrection of Our Lord Jesus Christ. It is the center of our faith. It is the whole reason we are Catholic!

This year it happens we don't have any catechumens, but we do have candidates. At the great Easter Vigil, they will affirm their faith in Christ through the Catholic Church. They become a part of our community. They will be confirmed and receive Holy Communion for the first time. It is a beautiful liturgy, and I urge you to join us.

After they have been received into the Church, our candidates will enter into a period of Mystagogy. Don't worry. It's not as painful as it sounds. It is merely the time when our new Catholics (neophytes) through meditation in the Gospel, participation in the Eucharist and acts of charity and justice, make progress in understanding the Paschal Mystery. Please pray for our candidates!

So there you have it. There's a sampling of our "Catholic jargon."



These forty holy days are intended for us to focus on prayer, fasting and almsgiving, Please come and begin your Lent well – pray with us!

## **LENTEN REGULATIONS**

Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years old and older on Ash Wednesday and on all the Fridays of Lent. Fasting is to be observed on Ash Wednesday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 59. Those who are bound by this may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted. The special Paschal fast, as well as abstinence, are prescribed for Good Friday and encouraged for Holy Saturday.

### STATIONS OF THE CROSS

Please join us for Stations of the Cross at 7:00 PM on Friday evenings during Lent. The Music Ministry, Lectors and Eucharistic Ministers will be sponsoring the stations on March 28. On April 4, the Stations will be sponsored by the GodSEND Youth Ministry.

Let us walk together in the footsteps of Christ.

# SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION

The Parish Reconciliation Service will take place on Wednesday, March 26 at 6:30 PM.

Private reconciliation is scheduled on Saturdays from 2:30 PM to 3:30 PM. Confessions will not be heard on Holy Saturday.

### **EUCHARISTIC ADORATION**

Eucharistic Adoration takes place on Tuesdays from 6:00 PM to 7:00 PM in Church, and Monday through Friday from 11:00 AM to Midnight in Holy Family Chapel

# A STORY OF HOPE FROM GUATEMALA

Nutritious Meals Help Children's Growth

Ana Belén and her husband, José, have four children and a baby on the way.

They live in a small house in Santa María Chiquimula, Guatemala. Francisco, their 9-year-old son, says his neighborhood is, "a very happy place to live, but sometimes it's also very hard to live here." He is not wrong. In their community, malnutrition affects over half of the population mainly because people can't afford to put food on the table.

Almost five years ago, when the COVID-19 pandemic started, José lost his job as a driver. This created serious challenges for the family. Even after the pandemic, things never went back to normal. Food prices went up and eggs became twice as expensive. Bad weather made things worse—strong rains damaged the crops, causing the prices of vegetables, including tomatoes, onions and corn to go up.

When Ana Belén went to the market, she could barely buy anything. The little money she had wasn't enough to buy even the basics. "Sometimes I would cry because I didn't have anything to give my children," she recalls.

Now the family participates in a Catholic Relief Services project that helps fight hunger in places where people don't have enough food. Through the project, Ana Belén goes every other week to her children's school to receive food such as corn, beans, rice, vegetable oil and eggs. "It made me happy when they started giving me eggs," she says.

Her children really like eggs, especially hard-boiled with beans, so they make sure to remind their mom when it's time to pick them up. Ana Belén's family now eats nutritious meals every day. She also makes sure to take her children for monthly health check-ups, as part of the project.

Having enough nutritious food is very important to help children grow healthy and gives them the energy they need to learn and play, just like Francisco, who loves playing ball with his cousins and at school.

This Lent, try black bean soup, a meatless dish commonly eaten in Guatemala.

**Prayer for Lent:** Jesus, Bread of Life, As we encounter you in the Eucharist this Lent, nourish us with your love, unite us in communion with our sisters and brothers, showing us how we are connected. Transform our hearts, that we may be moved to share bread for life with our global family and work for a world where all can thrive. Amen.


# Action Needed on Dangerous Illinois bills: HB 1328 and SB 9


# Flossmoor 40 Days for Life Vigil




