

MESSAGE FROM FATHER PAUL



The goal of our existence on Earth is to one day be united with God in heaven. And yet, when someone

attains that blessing, it is a cause for sorrow and grief. The whole Church and all people of goodwill share that sense of sorrow and grief as we offer our prayers for the soul of Our Holy Father Pope Francis. Though his death was not surprising, there is still that pain. And yet, as Saint Paul says, "O Death, where is your victory? O Death, where is your sting?"

The legacy of Pope Francis will be his desire to bring us back to the basics of our Christian life. Centuries of holy and wise theologians and philosophers have expanded on the Scriptures and done a great service to the Church. But sometimes those reflections added layers that could obscure the basic message. Pope Francis chose to strip away those layers and call us back to the heart of the Gospel.

His approach was one of love, mercy, compassion and joy. It was evident Pope Francis loved life! He told jokes about mother-in laws. Surely, he was the first pope to use the word "sourpuss" in an official papal document to remind us that when we leave church, we shouldn't look like we just got

out of a funeral.

He preached the immediacy of the perils of our common home, the earth. Exploitation of our resources has destroyed vast areas of land, caused the extinction of whole species, and ultimately snaps back to harm humans, especially the poor.

Pope Francis was courageous in saying that which needed to be said, and was often criticized for it which indicates it was important and necessary to be heard. He challenged us Americans in particular to be generous and compassionate since we are among the most blest and wealthiest.

I hope that as you watched the coverage since the Pope's death, it has moved you to consider his words and the faith beneath it. May the legacy of Pope Francis bring us closer to the Risen Christ.

A word of thanks to all who helped make our Easter so beautiful. A tremendous amount of work goes into making our liturgies meaningful. Thanks to all who came and prayed. If you haven't made your Easter gift to the parish, please do so. And thanks to all who left Father John and me cards, gifts and goodies. They are much appreciated. Let the Easter joy continue!





LIVING STATIONS OF THE CROSS - GOOD FRIDAY AT SAINT GEORGE


We are so proud of the group of 15 young people from Saint George who stepped up to inspire our congregation on Good Friday with at Living Stations of the Cross.



Join us on Sunday, April 27 at 1:00 PM to celebrate God's mercy and love for us. Divine Mercy Sunday is an official feast of the Catholic Church instituted by Pope John Paul II. Impact of 40 Days for Life

The 40 Days for Life vigil at abortion facilities ran from March 5 through April 13 at over 650 locations in over 30 nations. Based on reports received from all vigil locations so far, hundreds of babies and their mothers are known to be saved from abortion during this vigil. This 40-day vigil also motivated at least four abortion workers to quit their jobs. These vigils also have a history of seeing abortion facilities close permanently with four more closing this time. Since 2007, 162 abortion facilities have closed, 268 abortion workers have left their jobs, and 25,386 babies have been saved from abortion (that are known of).

One of these vigils has taken place at Planned Parenthood in Flossmoor. At least five mothers have changed their minds and not allowed their babies to be aborted. Please continue to pray for mothers who are considering abortion that they find the help they need before making this terrible mistake.

Pregnant, Need Help?

If you learn of a pregnant woman who is considering abortion, suggest that she call The Women's Center at 708-425-0707 (Evergreen Park), Aid for Women at 312-621-1100 (Flossmoor and downtown Chicago), PASS Pregnancy Care Center at 708-614-9777 (Tinley Park and South Holland), or Southside Women's Services at 708-229-0092 (Evergreen Park), depending on the location that would be more convenient. If there is a change of heart after taking the abortion pill, call 877-558-0333 or go to AbortionPillReversal.com. There may still be time to save your pregnancy.

If you (or a person you know) needs to talk to someone to seek reconciliation and healing from an abortion, people are available who are ready to help you. Please call Project Rachel at 888-456-HOPE (4673), Post-Abortion Hotline at 800-5-WE-CARE, or Rachel's Vineyard at 877-467-3463.

Now you can learn Natural Family Planning without ever having to leave your house. Natural Family Planning classes are available online. All you need is a computer or iPad, and speakers. The course features presenters on a live video feed, and you can ask questions through a live chat feature. New virtual classes in English and Spanish begin monthly. PARISH INFORMATION


