

MESSAGE FROM FATHER PAUL



I have good news of great joy! This is the last weekend you will hear about the Generation to Generation campaign! Yay!

I want to thank those who have made a pledge to this effort. Your pledge, to be fulfilled over the next five years, is a gift that will help the Archdiocese of Chicago and Saint George for many years beyond our current work.

I have been deeply touched by the stories I have heard of affection for our parish. I have been made aware of some people's hardship who still desire to give something because they believe in our ministry. Others have even expressed a sense of gratitude for being asked! This is what makes Saint George such a beacon of light. People want to give of themselves.

As I was looking over the grid of gift-giving, I was struck by the column entitled, "Daily Sacrifice." It gives the dollar amount a person would have to sacrifice on a daily basis over five years to fulfill their pledge. Then I thought about what that dollar amount represented, so:

To pledge \$6,000, a person would have to give up less than the cost of two candy bars.

To pledge \$9,000, the sacrifice would be a large (venti, if you please!) coffee at Starbucks.

To pledge \$12,000, would require giving up a fancy coffee at Starbucks.

To pledge \$18,000, the sacrifice would be less than a movie theater ticket.

To pledge \$25,000, you would have to give up a bottle of wine --- or a glass of wine at a restaurant!

Every person needs to make their own decision. I ask that you do so in prayer and a sense of gratitude for the gifts God has given you. Father Ken, Father John and I have all pledged because we believe in the good work of the Archdiocese and the necessity of the work at Saint George. The safety of our parking lot, not only for our cars but for our school children at recess and other activities and the fire suppression system are of paramount importance. If your generosity allows, we hope to air condition the school classrooms and enhance our fine arts program.

All of this will take time. But the results will be a lasting gift.





CREATION CARE CORNER

COOL EFFICIENTLY

Nearly half of the energy used in your home goes to heating and cooling. So making smart decisions about your home's heating, ventilating, and air conditioning (HVAC) system can have a big effect on your utility bills - as well as on fossil fuel energy consumption and Creation Care! Cooling tips include:

- Cover windows with drapes or shades especially on south and west facing windows.
- Weather-strip doors and windows, then add adequate insulation to keep the heat out.
- Regularly maintain home HVAC equipment and change filters. Programmable thermostats also save money.
- During the hottest part of the day, turn off anything that produces heat such as stoves, dishwashers, lights, etc. Also, consider turning up the thermostat temperature several degrees.
- If your AC is old, consider replacing with an Energy Star rated unit. Better yet, see if replacing it with a highly efficient heat pump will work for you (which can both heat and cool your home).

Qualified Charitable Distribution from IRA: Parishioners should mark "Qualified Charitable Distribution from IRA" as the method of giving on the pledge form. This method allows individuals 70-1/2 or older to authorize their administrator to directly transfer funds annually from their individual retirement account (IRA) to qualified charities, tax-free. If you are 73 or older, the amount you transfer can satisfy all or part of your required minimum distribution. Please call 312-534-7959 for more information and assistance.

Donor Advised Fund: Parishioners should mark "Other" as the method of giving on the pledge form. A representative from the archdiocese will be in contact with parishioners directly regarding the pledge.

Planned Gifts: Parishioners should mark "Planned Gift" as the method of giving on the pledge form. Bequests, charitable gift annuities, and life insurance policies are just a few options for making long term commitments to the church. Please call 312-534-5404 for more information and assistance.



Three Years After Roe Vs. Wade Overturned

June 24 is the three-year anniversary of the Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization decision by the U.S. Supreme Court that overturned the 1973 Roe v. Wade decision which had legalized abortion nationwide. Currently, 19 states have significant restrictions on abortion that prevent most abortions in those states. Unfortunately, most of the other 31 states allow almost all abortions, with abortion virtually unregulated in 27 of those states, including Illinois.

As a result, the number of abortions in Illinois has more than doubled in the last few years. Abortion is effectively unregulated in Illinois. Women are endangered by this unregulated environment with no requirements for licensing, inspections, reporting of complications, etc.




