

**MESSAGE FROM
FATHER PAUL**

One of the hot topics around Saint George is one you can't help but stumble on ---

literally! The road project on 175th Street has been an obstacle we have had to live around for over a year. I want to thank everyone for your patience during this time --- and for showing up! This is an extremely complex job, involving several different actors to make it all happen.

I spoke to one of the supervisors last week and he gave me some insight into the challenges he and his crew are facing. Timing and coordination is often a logistical nightmare. If you've ever had any renovation work done at your house you know how difficult that can be. In this case, the workers are dealing with several different groups: Nicor, sewers, water lines, demolition, materials, pavers, concrete... I think you get it.

Although we are looking at what seems to be a large area, the width of the street is narrow for the work that is being done. Also the road is being lowered two feet. The new road will consist of a foot of foundation and a foot of asphalt. That means having to dig up four feet total. So it is a lot of digging, pounding, removal, trucks, dust and mess!

Getting in on 175th Street is dicey and now Nicor is working on 176th Street! Nicor has told the village the work there should be complete by August 8. This is

especially important as we gear up for the beginning of the new school year.

Obviously, this is tedious for all of us. We who live on 175th Street can't even open our windows with so much dust and dirt in the air. I thank you for your patience and ask your continued caution while navigating the street. It is hoped that the road will be complete in November. Some landscaping may have to wait until Springtime.

Like so many things in life, sometimes you just have to grin and bear it. Ultimately, 175th Street is going to be vastly improved over what it has been for so many years. Hopefully, it will be safer, allow for smoother traffic and more attractive. Hold tight. We will all get through this together.

Once again, Saint George comes through. Our Generation to Generation campaign has exceeded our goal of \$1.1 million. We have now reached \$1.3 million. Remember, eighty percent of everything that comes in over our goal will stay at Saint George. We have been working diligently to understand the scope of work for the fire suppression system. We have already looked into air conditioning for the classrooms. And then there is rebuilding the parking lot. I think we can hold off on that kind of work for awhile...

Have you been baptized, received First Holy Communion and not yet received the Sacrament of Confirmation? The Archdiocese of Chicago is offering a nine week process for adults to complete their initiation into the Catholic Church by receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation.

There are numerous reasons why parishioners have not received the sacrament. Know that in this class you are not alone. We have had participants from ages 19 to 80. Based on family situations, personal decisions or just not feeling ready when the sacrament was offered, this is your opportunity. I ask you to discern your relationship with Jesus and the Catholic Church. How can we at Saint George help serve you on your faith journey?

If you do not attend Mass, this is a good time to get back into the practice of being an active participant in our weekend liturgies. This is also a time to examine your prayer-life. How is God calling you?

These sessions are virtual so you can attend in the convenience of your home or office. We meet on Wednesday evenings from 7:00 PM to 9:00 PM. Sessions begin September 17 and will finish on November 19. The date and location of the Confirmation Mass has not yet been determined. Registration closes on September 5 at 6:00 PM.

I have included the link below for you to register. You will need a copy of your Baptismal Certificate and First Communion record to attach when you apply. If you do not have a copy, you can call the parish where you received these sacraments or ask me for assistance.

CREATION CARE CORNER

WEEKLY STEWARDSHIP RECOMMENDATION:

How you use water can have a significant environmental impact over time. It takes a lot of energy to pump the water to homes and to treat it to make it safe for use. Low flow shower heads, washers, and dishwashers reduce water waste and can save you money, as does turning off the water while you're brushing your teeth or shaving. Fully loading your washers and dishwashers before running also saves water. Got a leaky faucet or toilet? You might be wasting 200 gallons of water a day. Planning on outside watering? Check the forecast for rain. Also, consider drinking tap water instead of bottled water, to reduce packaging waste. The EPA sets the standards for tap water provided by public water suppliers that the FDA uses to set bottled water standards. Quality is often similar if standards are met. More water saving tips can be found at <https://www.epa.gov/watersense>.

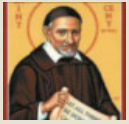

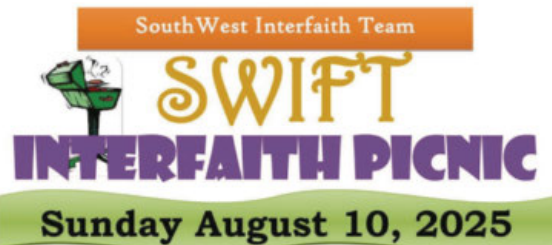

As some of you may know, due to recent changes within the federal government, I lost my position at the FDIC. However, I have since started a new chapter as the Coordinator of Parish Life at our local church. It has been a big adjustment returning to parish ministry, but I'm grateful to be part of a supportive community once again.

Prayer Vigil In Orland Park

Please plan to join a prayer vigil to be held at Orland Park Planned Parenthood. We will gather along the public sidewalk extending from 14470 LaGrange Road in Orland Park. This vigil will take place from 3:00 PM to 4:00 PM on Monday, August 4. Parking is available in the Orland Chateau lot (14500 S. LaGrange Road), but please park in the back.

Even if you can only stop by for a short time, please join us. Show your concern to protect our teenagers from Planned Parenthood. Pray for the conversion of Planned Parenthood's staff. Contrary to their claims, Planned Parenthood's birth control and sex education programs always lead to more unplanned pregnancies and more abortions, not less.

Dangers of Abortion Drugs

Planned Parenthood claims the abortion drugs Mifepristone and Misoprostol are safe and effective. Through their promotion of this "chemical" approach to abortion, nearly two thirds of all abortions nationally are now committed using these drugs. In fact, using the abortion drugs Mifepristone and Misoprostol is dangerous, not safe. According to the FDA's own label, roughly one in 25 women who use these abortion drugs end up in the emergency room. Now a detailed study of health statistics has revealed that one in ten women face serious consequences from these abortion drugs. Women and girls across the nation have suffered serious, even life-threatening, complications such as severe bleeding, infections, or sepsis.

With the state government in Illinois fully supporting abortion under all circumstances, no actions will be taken to address these dangers. However, in Missouri, Attorney General Andrew Bailey recently announced that his Office has filed a lawsuit against the national Planned Parenthood Federation of America for violating the Missouri Merchandising Practices Act. The suit alleges that Planned Parenthood has systematically misled women about the dangers of chemical abortions in order to cut costs and drive up revenue at the risk of women's health and safety. Pray that this lawsuit is successful, so that women will no longer be misled about abortion drugs.

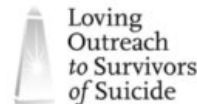

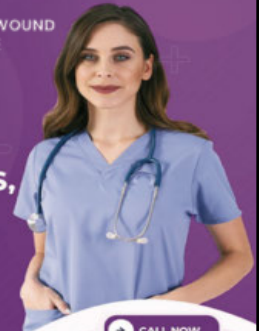
