MESSAGE FROM FATHER PAUL

This weekend, our nation celebrates the Labor Day holiday. It

represents the dignity of the American worker, and the important efforts that took place in the United States following the Industrial Revolution. It was a long, hard struggle for workers to organize. Many of the important laws we have today are a direct result of unions standing up for the working person. Eight hour work days, five day work week, child labor laws, occupational safety regulations, and many other protections we take for granted were codified only after a great deal of hard work, strikes, and sometimes death.

The establishment of the first Monday of September was chosen for practical and political purposes. Practically, it is a time when the weather (usually) is good for a parade and picnics. Some advocated for May 1st to be the day, but that was tied up too much with the European May Day celebrations. That date was considered too close to the anniversary of the Haymarket Riot of May 1 - 4, 1886 in Chicago. Chicago's significance to establishing the holiday was highlighted when President Grover Cleveland signed a Congressional Act 1894, shortly after the Pullman rail car strike.

The United States finally caught up to the Catholic Church. Three years earlier, Pope Leo XIII had issued a papal encyclical entitled, Rerum Novarum (Rights and Duties of Capital and Labor). In it, Pope Leo vividly describes the desperate condition of some workers. He condemns both

socialism and laissez-faire capitalism. He affirms the right to own property, form unions and a living wage. He goes on to state that free market considerations must be balanced with moral considerations. Pope Leo wrote: "Let the working man and the employer make free agreements, and in particular let them agree freely as to the wages: nevertheless, there underlies a dictate of natural justice more imperious and ancient than any bargain between man and man, namely, that wages ought not to be insufficient to support a frugal and well-behaved wage-earner. If through necessity or fear of a worse evil the workman accept harder conditions because an employer or contractor will afford him no better, he is made the victim of force and injustice."

With the arrival of "Chicago's Pope," Leo XIV, much has been made of his name choice precisely because of Leo XIII's work for iustice for the worker and the poor. It seems there can be no more obscene term in the United States than "the working poor." And while we watch the deportation and imprisonment of immigrants supposedly threatening the jobs of American workers, let's face it, when was the last time anyone encouraged their child to aspire to sweat in the fields of someone else's farm or over the sink of a diner?

Labor Day is a wonderful day for picnics and parades. But it is also a reminder to be vigilant in the protection of workers, fair wages and the dignity of work itself.



On September 8 (Parish Life Center #1) and on September 9 (Parish Life Center #3), we will study the Book of Isaiah. The early Church Fathers referred to the book of Isaiah

as the "fifth gospel" due to its significance for the New Testament, which cites Isaiah more than any other book of the Hebrew Bible except the book of Psalms. The study books are available in the church office, for a donation of \$15.

"Ignorance of Scripture is ignorance of Christ!" insisted Saint Jerome - a strong exhortation from a Father and Doctor of the Catholic Church to Christians, urging them to pay attention to serious Scripture study. This is a must, not a luxury option.

Have you been baptized, received First Holy Communion and not yet received the Sacrament of Confirmation? The Archdiocese of Chicago is offering a nine week process for adults to complete their initiation into the Catholic Church by receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation.

There are numerous reasons why parishioners have not received the sacrament. Know that in this class you are not alone. We have had participants from ages 19 to 80. Based on family situations, personal decisions or just not feeling ready when the sacrament was offered, this is your opportunity. I ask you to discern your relationship with Jesus and the Catholic Church. How can we at Saint George help serve you on your faith journey?

If you do not attend Mass, this is a good time to get back into the practice of being an active participant in our weekend liturgies. This is also a time to examine your prayer-life. How is God calling you?

These sessions are virtual so you can attend in the convenience of your home or office. We meet on Wednesday evenings from 7:00 PM to 9:00 PM. Sessions begin September 17 and will finish on November 19. The date and location of the Confirmation Mass has not yet been determined. Registration closes on September 5 at 6:00 PM.

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ.

Daily, we hear heartbreaking stories of suffering from Gaza. So many innocent victims, including those who belong to Christian communities, face violence, dire living conditions, and hunger. Our Holy Father Pope Leo has said "Gaza is starving," as he called for a cease fire. In a particular way, the faces of Gaza's hungry children make an indelible impression on our hearts.


