MESSAGE FROM FATHER PAUL

Shut up!
Those two words were never tolerated in my family growing up. When you have to tell someone to shut up, it is usually

because they have become obnoxious to you. And, just as commonly, you've run out of intelligent arguments. There are other ways of telling someone to shut up. They are a little more subtle but often have the same effect.

When someone tells you to "stay in your lane," that's a way of telling someone to shut up. Maybe just a dismissive wave of the hand accomplishes the same thing. It can escalate. A drunken argument can become a brawl. Sometimes it can take a more serious form, like firing a person from their job. We've seen censorship, closing down newspapers or cutting off communications in totalitarian governments.

And then there is the ultimate way to tell someone to shut up. You kill them. Throughout all of history, we've seen assassinations. It can be a member of a jury, a whistleblower, or a government official. This ultimate method of shutting up a person has been used since the earliest days of

history. And it is the failure of this attempt to silence someone and their message that we celebrate today.

The Feast of the Exultation of the Cross is a symbol of the failure of trying to shut down another person, and reveals the weakness of the offender. In this case, it was the ancient leaders who fought against Jesus and His message of hope. They killed Jesus but here we are, a people committed to His teaching, and His calling, while proclaiming ourselves as His disciples. Jesus stirred up fear because He was upsetting the establishment and their base of power. Of course, Jesus had no interest in earthly power. His power came from above and was most valuable to the people in the lowest rungs of society.

To exult is to feel or show extreme joy. Jesus' death on the cross became the gateway to the resurrection --- the ultimate victory over death. And for over two thousand years, the voice of Jesus has been heard through the People of God. Admittedly, we don't always get it right or speak for Jesus perfectly or consistently. But that is our goal. Every step we take closer to that, the Exultation of the Cross cries out in joy.

LIVE THE LITURGY

No servant can serve two masters, and in His goodness, God gives us the ability to choose. Will we serve mammon, the riches of this world? Or will we seek true wealth, the kind that cannot be hoarded or wasted, but only given freely away?

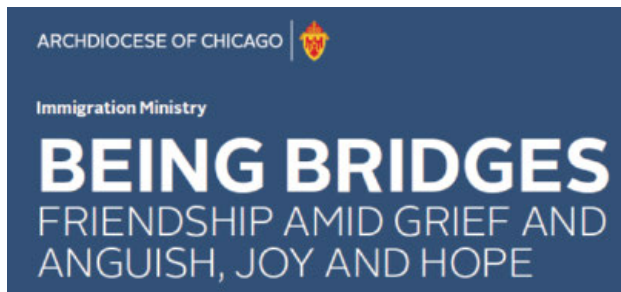
Moving Forward in Hope is a monthly series of prayer, connection, and hope.

Presenter: Steven Millies, Ph.D.
 Professor of Public Theology and Director of The Bernardin Center at Catholic Theological Union in Chicago.



Steven Millies is a scholar whose work explores the Catholic Church's relationship with politics through an interdisciplinary lens that includes theology, history, ethics, sociology, and political theory. Responding to Pope Francis's call for a more integral and compassionate politics, Millies

emphasizes our shared responsibility for one another and the world. He holds a doctorate in political theory from The Catholic University of America and previously served as the Strom Thurmond Endowed Chair in Political Science at the University of South Carolina Aiken. Now at Catholic Theological Union, he is the author of *Joseph Bernardin: Seeking Common Ground*, which won a Catholic Press Association award. He contributes regularly to national publications and is active in several scholarly societies. Millies is at work on his fourth book, a Catholic theological reflection on constitutional government, under the working title- *A House for All Peoples: Roman Catholicism and the Modern Constitutional State*.

YOUTH MINISTRY EIGHTH GRADE - HIGH SCHOOL AGE

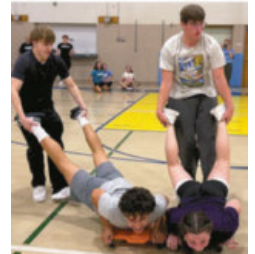
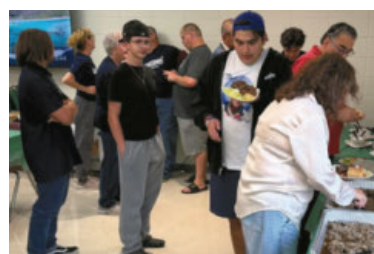
On September 6 and 7, the GodSEND Youth Ministry held their 2025-26, kick-off at Saint George. We graciously thank the parish for letting us use their space.

BAPTISMS will take place at 1:00 PM on the first Sunday of the month and at the 11:30 AM Sunday Mass on the third Sunday of the month. The family must be registered. A baptismal preparation program is obligatory in advance; please call the parish office to register and for more [information](#).

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION FOR ADULTS is a program for anyone inquiring and seeking information about entering the Catholic faith. Contact the parish office.
