

Message from Father Paul



"Today's first reading begins with the words, "Woe to the complacent!" To be complacent means to be smugly selfsatisfied with

one's own situation, achievements, or abilities, often to the point of being unaware of potential dangers or deficiencies and feeling no need to improve or change. It can include seeing things that need to be changed but doing nothing about it.

We see that in today's Gospel, as the rich man enjoys his comfortable life with no regard for poor Lazarus who sits just outside his gate. It is a complacency that says, "I'm fine. Anyone else's problems don't concern me."

There are times when our own life circumstances can tempt us to withdraw, to cocoon and concentrate on ourselves. And sometimes that is fair. When someone is sick in our family, we have to expend our energies on that person. When we are engaged in important work, we concentrate our efforts in that direction. When we look in the mirror and think we are the only important person, our own cares are worse than anyone else, and no one else matters, then we have a problem. This is a serious and dangerously sinful situation.

Complacency can become a perilous combination of egotism and selfishness. How we perceive

the world loses its value because the world is one person --- me! That brings us to a dark place and can lead to dark actions. In the case of the rich man in today's Gospel, he sins through neglect, inaction. He is aware of Lazarus, he knows his plight but he doesn't care. This is a sin of omission. That means we see something or someone who needs to be looked after but we choose to do nothing about it. This can come from attitudes ranging from, "It's not my problem!" to "Let them pull themselves up by their own bootstraps!" (with the underlying conceit of "...like I did!" which is a delusion. No one does it all by themselves.) This is the rich man's attitude.

Sins of commission, those committed by someone as a direct or indirect action against another, are more obvious. When we strike out against perceived enemies, when we purposely hurt another person by word or action, these are offenses against God and our brother or sister. It all comes back to that egotism and selfishness I mentioned earlier. So it leads us to ask necessary questions. These can be asked as an individual or society: Who do I ignore? Who do I turn away from who needs me? Who do I demean as a pest or an undesirable? Who is the Lazarus at the gate who I pretend is not there?

This being a Christian stuff ---- not easy.



Please Consider a QCD gift for Our Parish

You can make a gift from your individual retirement plan (IRA) that benefits you and our parish. A qualified charitable distribution (QCD) allows individuals age 70½ or older to authorize their IRA administrator to make a direct transfer of funds from their IRA to qualified charities, tax-free.

There are three main benefits of giving with a QCD:

- If you are 73 years old or older, the amount you transfer can satisfy all or part of your required minimum distribution.
- The amount transferred directly to charity does not generate taxable income, which may reduce your annual income level. This may help lower your Medicare premiums and decrease the amount of Social Security that is subject to tax.
- Your gift will be immediately used, allowing you to see the impact of your gift now.

It is truly a miracle to have people brought into your life who you know undoubtedly are gifts from God. It is truly a miracle to feel God so really present, even when heartache lingers. Thank you for praying for my family and for each other. God loves to listen to us no matter what our heart carries. He is so real, so present, and so deeply and profoundly good all of the time.


TMIY continues this weekend as we welcome back Michael (Gomer) Gormley, one of our most popular speakers from last year.
