

MESSAGE FROM FATHER PAUL



The month of October honors two different but related cornerstones of Catholicism. This is Respect Life Month and it is the month of the Rosary.

The Rosary came to us from Saint Dominic, who popularized and spread the devotion. Prayer beads had been used for centuries for different purposes, including praying the 150 psalms. It now consists of Our Fathers, Hail Marys, Glory Be's, as well as the Apostles' Creed and Hail Holy Queen. The repetition of the prayers become a sort of mantra for our reflection on the particular mystery for that decade. The four groupings of the Rosary are the Sorrowful, Joyful, Glorious and Luminous Mysteries.

In praying the Rosary, we honor Our Blessed Mother, asking her intercession for the good of the world and our own particular needs. Pope Leo XIV has asked all Catholics to pray the Rosary during the month of October for the intention of world peace. He especially asked that prayers be offered for peace in Gaza and Ukraine.

The goal of peace is a primary Right to Life issue. Clearly, the mass killing of other human beings is an offense against God and humanity. Related to that is the right to life of the unborn. I recently had a conversation with two young women who expressed the opinion

that if women made the laws, abortion would be widely accepted. I responded that while it may be true that mainly men are our elected representatives, that is a secondary issue. The primary issue is what happens in an abortion. There is no doubt that in an abortion a life ends just as surely as it does in our violence in our streets. The difference is that the unborn person is unknown and unseen. The born person is one known and seen, therefore more readily recognized for their humanity. Either way, a life ends. We must do what we can to make abortion better understood for what it is, and at the same time. decrease the causes of them.

Similarly related life issues are how we treat each other. Violence in the streets or in the home cannot be tolerated. Proper health care cannot be limited to the wealthy. Physician-assisted suicide may sound compassionate --- until it's not. Regulating borders is a right but how we do it should be governed by our understanding of what we have to share and how we got here in the first place. Homelessness is, in some way, a symbol of our system's failure.

Let us pray that through the intercession of the gentle Virgin Mary, Mother of God and mother of us all, we can work by God's grace for the right to life in all its stages, from conception to natural death.

The location assigned to Saint George is the north side of 159th Street in front of Harbor Freight (7520 W. 159th St.). Parking is available near 159th Street in Harbor Freight's parking lot. Gather there to obtain signs. To allow time for distribution of signs, we recommend that you arrive by 2:00 PM. Prayer Vigil in Orland Park

Please plan to join a prayer vigil to be held at Orland Park Planned Parenthood. We will gather along the public sidewalk extending from 14470 LaGrange Road in Orland Park. This vigil will take place from 3:00 PM to 4:00 PM on Monday, October 6, 2025. Parking is available in the Orland Chateau lot (14500 S. LaGrange Road), but please park in the back. Even if you can only stop by for a short time, please join us. Show your concern to protect our teenagers from Planned Parenthood. Pray for the conversion of Planned Parenthood's staff.

Flossmoor 40 Days for Life Vigil

Please join the 40 Days for Life vigil at Planned Parenthood in Flossmoor on any Thursday from October 9 through October 30. These are known abortion days so Saint George Pro-Life is encouraging on-site prayer on these days for the victims of abortion. Saint George will focus on 10:00 AM to 11:00 AM, but choose any hour from 7:00 AM to 6:00 PM to pray on site at the Planned Parenthood abortion facility at 19831 S. Governors Highway in Flossmoor. This vigil is part of the national call for 40 days of prayer and fasting for an end to abortion running from September 24 through November 2 and is one of over 600 locations in 30 nations. During these 40 days, please make an extra effort to pray and fast for the end of abortion in our nation (e.g. make extra visits to Holy Family Chapel and/or attend weekday Mass). You can schedule your vigil time at 40daysforlife.com/local-campaigns/ flossmoor/. Public parking is available 1/2 block north of the Planned Parenthood site on 198th Street which goes west from Governors Hwy., or along the alley that runs east from Governor's Hwy., behind the Vollmer Road strip mall (parking spots facing Planned Parenthood). Each school in the Archdiocese of Chicago conducts a yearly Religion Assessment. Saint George School is in a program with Sadlier (a Religion Publisher) to take this assessment three times a year. This is a way for all of us to focus on our Catholic faith and to prepare all our students for a life filled with the seven virtues. Two of Saint George School teachers were recently interviewed for the Archdiocese Catholic Schools newsletter regarding the Religion Assessment Program at Saint George.

Both Kelly and Julie grew up in the southwest suburbs of Chicago. Kelly attended Elmhurst College where she double-majored in Elementary Education and Music Education. Julie studied elementary education at Saint Xavier University and earned a Master's degree from Governors State University in special education. Kelly has taught in the classroom and has served as a principal and assistant principal. In addition to teaching at Saint George School, Julie also serves the parish in a variety of liturgical ministry roles and as a religious education teacher.



What value does the annual religion assessment bring to you as a teacher?

Kelly: The annual religion assessment provides a clear picture of my students' understanding of our Catholic faith and where they need deeper formation. While the data is valuable, the greater purpose is to connect that knowledge to the truth that God is present with us always. Students need to see that our faith is not just something we study—it's a relationship with God that is lived daily. The assessment serves as one tool to help me guide students toward giving their struggles, joys, and uncertainties to God, trusting that when we seek Him, our lives become more fulfilled.

Julie: The annual religion assessment is valuable because it gives me concrete data about my students' understanding of their faith. It helps me see the concepts they have mastered as well as areas where they may need additional support. That information guides my instruction and allows me to be more intentional in reinforcing key teachings. It also helps me ensure that I am closely aligned with the curriculum standards. Beyond the data, I appreciate that the assessment highlights students' growth from year to year, which is very affirming both for them and for me as their teacher.

How does your classroom data inform your planning and instruction of religion throughout the year?

Kelly: The data helps me identify topics that require more time, discussion, and hands-on exploration. If I see gaps, I incorporate more open dialogue where students can ask questions—sometimes difficult ones—and we explore together. When answers require deeper insight, we reach out to our pastor, showing that the Church is a living resource. Data also reminds me to weave faith practice into all parts of the day, not just religion class.

Julie: The data helps me plan lessons that meet students right where they are. For example, if I notice students are still developing their understanding of the Sign of the Cross, I can build in extra practice through songs or visuals. I also always encourage students to ask questions and then have a class discussion where everyone can answer.

What did you appreciate about Sadlier's "We Believe: Full Access" assessment that supports your students' growth in religious knowledge?

Kelly: I appreciate that Sadlier's We Believe: Full Access aligns well with our religion standards and provides a clear, structured way to see student progress. Its format helps pinpoint strengths and areas for growth so we can reinforce those truths in a way that connects to life. It's not just about memorizing facts—it's about knowing God is with us and learning how to respond to His presence with love, prayer, and service in every situation.

Julie: As a first-grade teacher, I appreciate that We Believe: Full Access offers assessments that are age-appropriate, clear, and accessible for young learners. I can see what my students understand and better support their growth in faith and knowledge. I especially value how the questions connect directly to the religion standards and to what we are already practicing in class. The digital format also gives me quick feedback, which helps guide my instruction and support each child's growth in religious knowledge.

What are some other ways that you engage your students in practices of their faith and as scholars in religion?

Kelly: We integrate faith into every corner of our day—beginning with prayer, reflecting on Scripture, practicing virtues, and looking for moments to "give it to God," whether we are struggling or celebrating. We do hands-on activities like touring the church to see and understand sacred spaces. Faith becomes second nature when it's not confined to class or Mass but flows into every conversation, subject, and moment of our school day.

Julie: I make faith part of our daily routine with prayer, songs, and simple reflections that first graders can really connect with. I also encourage them to think like young scholars by asking 'wonder questions,' having them explain what they remember, and giving them chances to express their understanding through art or writing. My goal is to help them live their faith joyfully while also learning to think and reflect about it.

What advice would you give to Catholic school teachers as they work with our religion curriculum standards and prepare for assessment this year?

Kelly: Remember that our ultimate goal is not only to prepare students for an assessment, but to prepare them for a life of faith. Sharing the love of God with others openly is crucial—it helps students identify who they are as followers of Christ and inspires them to live out their faith daily. Our students today are building habits that will serve them both now and in the future.

Julie: Approach the religion standards with the goal of making them meaningful and lived experiences for my students. As we prepare for the computer based assessment, help students to feel confident and comfortable with the format so that the technology does not become a barrier to showing what they know. We should also remember that the assessment is only one measure of growth. The most important evidence of student learning is how they express, understand, and live out their faith each day. When we hold all these together, we give students the best opportunity to grow as both disciples and scholars.
