GOSPEL MEDITATION THE DEDICATION OF THE

LATERAN BASILICA JOHN 2:13-22

When I was 22, I entered Saint Peter's Basilica for the first time. It floored me. I could hardly take it in, its grandeur, majestic arches, vibrant colors, and the light that danced through its high windows. Somehow, amidst such splendor, I felt an overwhelming sense of belonging, as if I had finally come home.

Jesus reorients how we Catholics see sacred buildings. In today's Gospel He says, "Destroy this temple, and in three days I will raise it up" (John 2:13-22). His riddle implies, shockingly, that His own body is now the fundamental dwelling place of God and humanity. The temple in Jerusalem has been superseded.

In our churches today — whether they mirror the basilica's grandeur or embrace humble simplicity — we experience architectural symbols of Christ's risen body. It is no accident we call them "churches": they make visible in brick-and-mortar

Christ's body which is made up of the living stones we call Christians. Each church building, like Saint John Lateran in Rome, or Saint Peter's, or any other, is meant to be a vibrant sign of Christ's resurrected body. We should cherish and protect our churches as places where heaven touches earth, where we, as a community, are raised to the fullness of life in Christ.

Mulch This Fall to Protect Air Quality

Fall leaves are beautiful - until they pile up in your yard. But don't send those precious nutrients up in smoke. Burning creates a serious air quality issue, especially harmful to children, the elderly, and those with breathing problems. Instead, your leaves can nourish your lawn or garden.

Try mulching:

- Mow leaves along with the grass during fall. Leave the finely chopped material on your lawn as a natural fertilizer that adds organic matter to enrich your soil.
- Use excess leaf mulch around garden and landscape plants. Benefits include weed suppression, moisture conservation and moderation of soil temperature.
- For the best mulching result, wait until leaves are dry and crispy. Remember not to pile leaves directly against the stem of any plant or tree.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

May God's richest blessings be with you and your loved ones. We present to you the Parish Financial Statement for the past fiscal year (July 1, 2024 – June 30, 2025). As you know, this has been a very active year for us, particularly with the kick-off of the Generation-to-Generation campaign, spearheaded by the Archdiocese of Chicago. Once again, Saint George stepped up.

Our ministries continue to expand, thanks to our pastoral staff and countless volunteers who bring blessing upon blessing to the sick, our young people and all in need. Families continue to see the value of a Catholic education, both in our school and Children's Faith Formation Program, where parents have increased their involvement.

As you can see from the statement, our finances are healthy. Though the parish overall ended the year with a slight deficit (under \$10,000), our reserves are strong enough to cover that. The school had a deficit of \$112,000, which reflects the parish subsidy. This is well within a reasonable commitment.

The Generation-to-Generation campaign is a major effort to support ministries across the Archdiocese and in our parish. Our parish projects are critical to the safety of our parishioners: updating our church fire suppression system and repaving the parking lot. We are air conditioning more of our classrooms and expanding our school fine arts program. All contributions to the campaign are split 50/50 between the Archdiocese and Saint George. Since we exceeded our goal, from now on the split is 80/20 in the parish's favor. Thank you to those who made this possible! To those who have yet to step up, your participation counts even more now. As of October 2025, over \$228,000 in pledges have been fulfilled.

Our faith calls us to show our gratitude to God for His many blessing by being generous to those in need. Your regular, sacrificial giving to Saint George makes that a reality. I urge you to consider giving electronically. This helps with parish cash flow and makes it easier for you. God bless you for the gift you are!

JUBILEE YEAR OF HOPE CHICAGO PILGRIMAGE

2025 was designated by Pope Franics as "The Jubilee Year of Hope." As such, the Holy Father offered a plenary indulgence. That may be an unfamiliar term to many. According to the Catechism of the Catholic Church, a plenary

indulgence "is a remission before God of the temporal punishment due to sins whose guilt has already been forgiven..." That pertains to the sins which we have confessed and have been forgiven yet we still live with the lingering effects of those sins. This would include an unhealthy attachment to sins. In other words, those sins to which we can become slaves. The object of a plenary indulgence is to be rid of those sins and their effects.

Certain conditions must be met in order to gain the indulgence. In addition to being in the state of grace, a person must have the interior disposition of complete detachment from sin, even venial sin; have sacramentally confessed their sins; receive the Holy Eucharist; (these last two should be done shortly before or after the pilgrimage) and pray for the intentions of the Holy Father.

In order to help facilitate those who wish to receive the indulgence, Saint George will sponsor a pilgrimage to several churches in the City of Chicago on Friday, November 21. We will begin with Mass at 8:15 AM, then board a bus that will take us to Holy Name Cathedral, Saint Clement Church, Saint Alphonsus Church (Chicago) and Our Lady of the Lake Church. All of these are among the gems of the Archdiocese of Chicago, renowned for their beauty and prayerful atmosphere. If you have never seen any of these churches, you are in for a treat! You might want to Google them, just to take a look at some of the pictures and history of each church.

The cost for the luxury bus and lunch will be \$35 per person. It is important that pilgrims know there will be some steps, so it is necessary that walking not be too big an issue. Space is limited to 55 people, so make your reservation today!



Impact of 40 Days for Life

The Fall 2025 40 Days for Life vigil at abortion facilities ran from September 24 through November 2 at over 700 locations in over 30 nations. Based on reports received from all vigil locations so far, over 400 babies and their mothers are known to be saved from abortion during this vigil. This 40-day vigil also motivated at least seven abortion workers to guit their jobs. These vigils also have a history of seeing abortion facilities close permanently with 20 more closing this time. Since 2007, 182 abortion facilities have closed, 275 abortion workers have left their jobs, and 25,795 babies have been saved from abortion (that are known of).

One of these vigils took place at Planned Parenthood in Flossmoor. At least five mothers have changed their minds and not allowed their babies to be aborted. Please continue to pray for mothers who are considering abortion that they find the help they need before making this terrible mistake.


