

FROM THE PASTOR



Soon we begin the season of Lent on Ash Wednesday. That is this week already! Lent is a time of prayer, fasting and almsgiving. Please join us for the many prayer opportunities during this holy time. And mark your calendar for our Tri-Parish Mission at Saint Elizabeth Seton on the evenings of March 15, 16 and 17. Father Jerry Kaywell of Punta Gorda, Florida will guide us. Not to be missed!

Three years ago, Saint George participated in a parish survey conducted by the Catholic Leadership Institute, called the Disciple Maker Index. It was an interesting time in our history because between the time you made your responses and the time we received the results, we had made many changes in the parish! We are doing the survey again this Lent. Having new data and using the old survey as a baseline, will give us a good indication as to the direction of the parish.

But the survey will only work if you take it! It will take only 10 to 15 minutes. It can be accessed at www.catholicleaders.org/chicagodmi starting Ash Wednesday. All responses are confidential and the parish will receive only information about the community as a whole. We will have paper copies available in church and at the parish office. To submit the completed paper survey, please drop it off at the parish office. We will also have people with computers available on upcoming weekends who can help you with the online survey.

Last time, we had a very good response. This year it will be even more helpful to have strong participation. This information will be invaluable to me and the whole staff and parish leadership as we plan our future ministry. Thank you for helping us with this important project!

A couple weeks ago, I preached about a movie called "Truth or Treason" the true story of Helmut Hubener, a teenager in Nazi Germany who dared to speak out against Adolph Hitler. It is a stirring film. Some people asked where it could be found. As I write this, it is currently available on Amazon Prime Video. I highly recommend this movie that tells an important true story of courage, conviction and sacrifice.

As you read this, I am in Mexico City, visiting some friends and spending some time at the beautiful Shrine of our Lady of Guadalupe. If you don't know the story of Our Lady of Guadalupe, I urge you to google it! That may whet your appetite to learn more of this beautiful story. Our Lady of Guadalupe is the patroness of the Americas. She watches over all of us in the Western Hemisphere from the North Pole to the South. And there are a lot of people all in between! I will be praying for all of you before the beautiful image of her that has been preserved for 500 years.

Saint George is on a journey to know, love, and serve Christ in our parish community. Together we must embrace Christ's vision for missionary discipleship so our parish can thrive and be a place for others to grow together in faith.

The very first step in this process involves assessing our greatest strengths and opportunities, and that is where the Disciple Maker Index (DMI) comes in! The DMI is an important survey tool that invites you to reflect on your discipleship journey here at Saint George. The Disciple Maker Index is designed to:

- Invite parishioners to reflect on their journey of discipleship.
- Enable parish leadership to make data-driven decisions.
- Help parishioners grow in their faith.

The 10–15-minute survey can be accessed through an online link from February 18 through March 29, and will ask you to reflect on your own spiritual growth and enable you to provide your perspective on our parish's efforts to help you grow in relationship with Christ. All responses will be confidential, and the parish will only receive information about the community as a whole. The survey can be accessed through (<https://portal.catholicleaders.org/dmi/survey/p509c8>) or the QR Code below. The link will be active on Wednesday, February 18. Paper surveys will also be available for those who do not have the ability to complete the survey online.

On Wednesday, February 18, we begin the holy season of Lent. Ash Wednesday provides an opportunity for everyone to come to pray and receive ashes. These forty holy days are intended for us to focus on prayer, fasting and almsgiving, as the readings on Ash Wednesday teach us. That day, the collection will go to Aid for the Church in Central and Eastern Europe per archdiocese instructions. Please come and begin your Lent well – pray with us!

ASH WEDNESDAY - FEBRUARY 18

Masses with ash distribution will take place at 8:15 AM and 7:00 PM. A prayer service with ash distribution is scheduled at 3:30 PM.



LENTEN REGULATIONS

Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years old and older on Ash Wednesday and on all the Fridays of Lent. Fasting is to be observed on Ash

Wednesday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 59. Those who are bound by this may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted. The special Paschal fast, as well as abstinence, are prescribed for Good Friday and encouraged for Holy Saturday.



THE LITTLE BLACK BOOK - LENT 2026



Books will be available at all Masses this weekend.

How to use the "Little Black Book"

Imagine the tiny mustard seed that matures into a massive plant providing a home for the birds of the sky. That is what the Lord wants to do with our faith. Whatever effort we put in to growing our relationship with Him this Lent—big or small—God always puts in more.

This Little Black Book will help you dedicate six minutes each day (more if you like) to spend some quiet time with the Lord. It may not sound like much, but just picture the mustard seed. There is no telling how much God will enrich your faith by Easter.

The centerpiece of each day (except Sundays) is the Passion according to Mark, which is on the right-hand page. We will

walk through the whole Passion a little bit at a time and other reflections and prompts to help you become more familiar with hearing the Lord's voice in your life.

On the left-hand pages you will read stories of holy women and men, as well as interesting information about our Faith, and traditions.

We will not start reading the Passion until Ash Wednesday, but we will start being intentional about deepening our relationship with the Lord on Sunday, February 15 (the Sunday before Ash Wednesday). That gives us three days to prepare for a fruitful Lent.

Remember, whatever amount of time you give the Lord each day, he will never be outdone in generosity. Find a time that works for you and stick to it. There is no telling what transformation God may do in us over these next six weeks.

THE CHALICE PROJECT - PRAY FOR VOCATIONS



Saint George started the Chalice Project on Sunday, November 30. Each week at Mass, a family can volunteer to take the gifts to the altar during the Offertory.

At the end of Mass, the family will be invited by the priest to come forward to receive the chalice and a blessing.






