

FROM THE PASTOR



Welcome to Lent! Not the usual way to greet a person, is it? Lent is often thought of as a dry time, one of sacrifice and self-deprivation. And I suppose it can be those things. Once in a while it is a healthy spiritual exercise to put aside our usual habits and look at life with a fresh perspective. If that hasn't happened for you yet, it isn't too late!

On Ash Wednesday, Jesus gave us three particular avenues of renewal. They are prayer, fasting and almsgiving. Prayer keeps us in touch with God. Fasting puts us in contact with our inner self. And almsgiving connects us to the world around us, most especially the poor and needy.

Much has been made of Pope Leo XIV's choice of name. As the first American pope, he might have chosen a name more identified with the USA as his native country (Pope George as in Washington????). Instead, he chose Leo. The last pope with that name, Leo XIII (1810-1903) reigned from 1878 to 1903. Among the many concerns Leo XIII dealt with was social justice and the rights of workers. Many of his writings are still foundational to the Church's teachings today.

Leo XIII was also a spiritual man. On October 1, 1884, Leo XIII had just finished Mass in his private chapel when he had a mystical experience. He heard two voices, one of Our Lord and the other, Satan. Satan told Jesus, "Give me 75 or 100 years and I will destroy the Church." Jesus response was essentially, "Just try it." Immediately after, Leo went to his office and composed what we know as the Prayer to Michael the Archangel. The original prayer was ten times longer than the one most often used. Here is the short version:

*Saint Michael the Archangel,
defend us in battle.
Be our defense against the wickedness and snares
of the devil.
May God rebuke him, we humbly pray,
and do thou,
O Prince of the heavenly hosts,
by the power of God,
thrust into hell Satan,
and all the evil spirits,
who prowl about the world
seeking the ruin of souls. Amen.*

This powerful prayer may not be part of your regular routine. In these times, perhaps this would be a worthy prayer for us to offer. Many people use it at the end of the rosary. Maybe cut it out and tape it to your mirror or put it on the refrigerator. It might be just the prayer you've been looking for!

THE DISCIPLE MAKER INDEX SURVEY IS OPEN THIS WEEK!

Our parish is on a journey to know, love, and serve Christ as a parish community. Together we must embrace Christ's vision for missionary discipleship so our parish can thrive and be a place for others to grow together in faith.

The very first step in this process involves assessing our greatest strengths and opportunities, and that is where the Disciple Maker Index (DMI) comes in! The DMI is an important survey tool that invites you to reflect on your discipleship journey here at Saint George.

Take the DMI survey today. It will ask you to reflect on your own spiritual growth and enable you to provide your perspective on our parish's efforts to help you grow in relationship with Christ. All responses will be confidential, and the parish will only receive information about the community as a whole.

The 10-15 minute survey can be accessed through March 29 at <https://portal.catholicleaders.org/dmi/survey/p509c8> or through the QR Code. Paper surveys will also be available in the church narthex and the parish office for those who do not have the ability to complete the survey online. On the weekends of February 28-March 1, and March 7-8, computers will be available to help those who would like assistance with the online version.



If you prefer a paper copy, you may pick up your survey after daily and Sunday Masses in the church narthex, and in the parish office. Completed surveys can be dropped off at the church entrances in the narthex in boxes labeled "Parish Survey Drop Off", or the parish office.

Your input helps strengthen our parish, and the results will help leadership prepare for the future.

At Saint George, we are blessed in so many ways. Together, we will identify our strengths and opportunities in greater detail as we strive to grow in missionary discipleship.

Please continue to pray for this intention and for the growth and protection of our parish.

LENTEN REGULATIONS



Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years old and older on all the Fridays of Lent. Fasting is to be observed on Good Friday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 59. Those who are bound by this may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted. The special Paschal fast, as well as abstinence is also encouraged for Holy Saturday.


THE CHALICE PROJECT - PRAY FOR VOCATIONS

In her book, *Restore*, a guided Lent Journal for prayer and meditation, Sr. Miriam James Heidland (SOLT) shares: “The season of Lent stirs many things in our hearts, and I often wonder what is being engaged at the deeper level of our hearts.”

Over and over again this season, we will be reminded of God’s mercy, love, compassion, and protection. We will see love poured out and a heart pierced for our offenses. And over and over again, God will invite us to turn away from our sins and idols, from fragmentation, darkness, death and all things that break us and lead us away from salvation.

Jesus is inviting us into His life- how He lives, thinks, and loves. He is showing us what it means to be truly alive and truly human. Jesus is inviting us into His heart so that he can reveal ours and bring us into communion.” For many, Lent is a healing journey and an intimate encounter with Jesus. During this Eucharistic Adoration Hour, we will pray Father Boniface Hicks’ Litany of Healing and Repentance.

Through this litany, we will open our hearts to Jesus’ healing presence. Through this litany, we will experience Jesus’ invitation to come into His heart so that He can reveal ours and bring us into communion.

On March 3, this Litany of Healing and Repentance will be offered during the evening Eucharist Adoration Service. On your Lenten journey, you are invited to find healing in Jesus! Create in me a clean heart, O God... Restore to me the joy of your salvation. (Psalm 51)

STATEMENT OF CARDINAL CUPICH CALLING FOR AN APOLOGY FROM THE WHITE HOUSE FOR A RACIST SOCIAL MEDIA POST

Portraying human beings as animals – less than human – is not new.

It was a common way in past centuries for politicians and others to demean immigrant groups as each arrived, the Chinese, Irish, Italians, Slavs, Jews, Latinos and so on. Cartoons, "news" articles, even theatrical productions carried the message that these "others" were worthy of ridicule.

It made it easier to turn a blind eye to their privation, pay them pitiful wages and mock their "foreign" religion even as the country needed their labor. It immunized the national conscience when we turned away shiploads of refugees, lynched thousands and doomed generations to poverty.

We tell ourselves that those days belong in the past – that even sharing that history is harmful to the fantasy of equality we strive to create.

A few days ago, we saw that in the White House such blatant racism is not merely a practice of the past. If the President intentionally approved the message containing viciously racist images, he should admit it. If he did not know of it originally, he should explain why he let his staff describe the public outcry over their transmission as fake outrage.

Either way he should apologize. Our shock is real. So is our outrage. Nothing less than an unequivocal apology – to the nation and to the persons demeaned – is acceptable.

And it must come immediately.
