

FROM THE PASTOR

I have some sad news. Our mission speaker, Father Jerry Kaywell, passed away on Sunday night. He was a friend, and I was anxious to share his rich faith and sparkling personality with you. This came very suddenly, so let's also keep his parish, Sacred Heart in Punta Gorda, Florida in our prayers. Father Jerry's very good friend, Father Steven Olds, who worked with Father Jerry for many years, has offered to

step in for us. Father Olds is a brilliant speaker and writer. So please do plan on joining us March 15, 16, and 17 at 7:00 PM at Saint Elizabeth Seton Church, 9300 167th Street. And please pray for Father Jerry.

I don't read much fiction. Fiction is worthwhile. It takes us to a different time and place, different situations. It can be good just to get your mind off all the things we worry about. Fiction can be very therapeutic. I just don't use it. I find history and biographies much more interesting. Most people complain about having to study history but if I tell someone about a movie and mention it is based on a true story, that tends to spark their interest.

For us as Catholics, we have many biographies worth reading. They are the lives of the saints. The saints can be a tremendous source of inspiration for believers. I hope you have a favorite saint and I hope you know all about them. You'll be amazed at what saints lived through --- sometimes very difficult and heroic, others much more ordinary, surprisingly similar to our own.

One of my favorites is Saint Bernadette. Growing up, I became familiar with her story mainly through the old movie, "The Song of Bernadette." It is still worth watching. She became even more important when my sister Gail chose it as her confirmation name.

Bernadette was anything but outstanding. Not very smart, not rich, not known for much except the occasional snappy comeback. And yet, the Blessed Virgin Mary appeared to her. A miraculous stream of water sprang up and still flows today.

Bernadette's story is told again in "Bernadette The Musical." It has gotten very good reviews. Saint George is sponsoring a bus to see the play in the city. I would urge anyone interested to be sure to get your tickets while they are still available. It will be a nice time in Chicago and a wonderful Lenten experience. Stop by at the office. Tickets are limited. And if you can't, there's always the old movie!

LENTEN REGULATIONS



Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics
14 years old and older on all the Fridays of Lent. Fasting is
to be observed on Good Friday by all Catholics who are 18
years of age but not yet 59. Those who are bound by this
may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are
permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs,
but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted. The special
Paschal fast, as well as abstinence is also encouraged for Holy Saturday.







A STORY OF HOPE FROM GHANA

The one thousand days: From conception to a child's second birthday, every day is vital for their development. But in rural Ghana, poverty prevents access to essential health and nutrition services, causing children to miss critical milestones. This can lead to serious health issues, academic struggles and limited job opportunities in adulthood.

To address this, Catholic Relief Services teamed up with the Sisters of Charity of Saint Anne on a project in Walewale, Ghana, to help children up to three years old live happy and healthy lives by improving early childhood development.

The project began more than four years ago when the sisters met with the chiefs and elders of the community about establishing a space at the Our Lady of Rocio Clinic to provide mothers and children with health education services and early childhood development activities. Today, the space teaches caregivers new ways to support their families, offers mental health services for moms, empowers communities through savings groups and strengthens families to build a brighter future together.

As part of the project, community volunteers were trained in skills like making early learning toys and starting savings and lending groups. Some of the toys the mothers learned to make include sensory shakers crafted from plastic bottles and stones or buttons, and fabric balls from scraps around the home.

Sister Yvonne says that a sensory shaker is like music for a child. "It helps the child develop mentally and build muscle strength," she adds.

Georgina was one of the first volunteers and is now a lead mother in her community who trains female neighbors in what she has learned. A mother of three, Georgina brings two of her children to the space to learn how to make simple, inexpensive toys that engage children's senses and stimulate learning and development. She says that her children are seeing the benefits.

"They teach them how to count: one, two, three. ABCs," Georgina says. "Compared to those in the house that I live with [who don't attend the space], they are very smart indeed."

Sister Yvonne emphasizes, however, that early childhood development cannot stop at the walls of the center. Mothers must make play spaces at home for their children and volunteers must teach new mothers what they've learned so that this knowledge will spread and other children can thrive.

"This program has helped us change our lives and our children," Georgina says.

AN INVITATION TO FIND HEALING IN JESUS: EUCHARISTIC ADORATION MARCH 3 (6:00 PM)

In her book, *Restore*, a guided Lent Journal for prayer and meditation, Sr. Miriam James Heidland (SOLT) shares: "The season of Lent stirs many things in our hearts, and I often wonder what is being engaged at the deeper level of our hearts."

Over and over again this season, we will be reminded of God's mercy, love, compassion, and protection. We will see love poured out and a heart pierced for our offenses. And over and over again, God will invite us to turn away from our sins and idols, from fragmentation, darkness, death and all things that break us and lead us away from salvation.

Jesus is inviting us into His life... how He lives, thinks, and loves. He is showing us what it means to be truly alive and truly human.
