FROM THE PASTOR

Last week I had the opportunity to go to the funeral for my friend, Father Jerry Kaywell. It was held at Sacred Heart Church in Punta Gorda, Florida, where he had ministered as pastor for twenty-two years. If you are ever in that area, I highly recommend you stop by for Mass. The wake and funeral were truly beautiful with wonderful music and many priests were there along with the bishop to concelebrate Mass. Our mission speaker, Father Steven Olds, preached at both services.

The one thing that stands out the most was how friendly people were to me. I was obviously a priest, and obviously I knew only a few people. I was approached by at least ten people who introduced themselves, asked how I knew Father Jerry, and were very generous in their concern for me in my grief, even as they grieved their pastor. I was deeply touched and grateful for their natural desire to make me feel at home.

It was clear that this is a community that takes welcoming the stranger very much to heart. It made me think of the many times I have heard from visitors to Saint George how welcome they feel here. That is because of YOU. When you greet someone who seems to be a new face, when you have a friendly conversation, when you invite them to join you in your pew---those are the times when people feel the warmth of God's People. Do not ever underestimate the impact you can make by simply making someone feel at home at Saint George.

On Monday at 7:00 PM, we will be celebrating God's infinite love for us in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. I urge you to join us for this beautiful gift of God's forgiveness. I especially invite those who have not been to the sacrament for a long while. Feeling the embrace of God's love and the support of the Church is a renewing and profound moment. Please join us Monday at 7:00 PM.

On Tuesday at 7:00 PM, we are extending a special opportunity. Father Kevin McCray and I will be leading a pilgrimage to northern France this coming September. Among the places we will see are Chartres, home of a 1000 year old cathedral, known for its magnificent stained glass windows; Giverny, the village where the Impressionist painter Monet got his inspiration; Lisieux, home of Saint Theresa of the Holy Face of Jesus, better known as the Little Flower; the beaches of D-Day at Normandy; and Paris! LENTEN REGULATIONS



Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years old and

older on all the Fridays of Lent. Fasting is to be observed on Good Friday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 59. Those who are bound by this may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted. The special Paschal fast, as well as abstinence is also encouraged for Holy Saturday.

EMBRACING GOD’S LOVE: LESSONS FROM STORIES OF HOPE

In the book of Genesis, we learn that God created man and woman in his image, reminding us that every person is sacred and reflects God’s love. Each of us has a purpose, woven into God’s plan. As children of God, all people deserve respect and care—especially those who are most vulnerable.

When we reflect on the challenges faced by our sisters and brothers in Ghana, Guatemala and Timor-Leste, we see how their resilience and courage helped them overcome adversity. Their stories remind us to treat every person with dignity and compassion.

In Ghana, Georgina lives in a rural area where poverty makes it difficult for families to get health and nutrition services for their children to grow healthy and strong. When a clinic opened to help mothers and children, it

helped kids reach important milestones. Georgina’s children are now learning their ABCs and counting. She uses her knowledge at home and shares it with others. Thanks to this support, children in Walewae have a brighter future.

In Guatemala, Maribel and her family didn’t eat healthily and felt unwell. After learning about the importance of nutritious foods in a CRS program, her family began adding fruits, vegetables, protein and vitamins into their daily routine. Now their health is improving.

In Timor-Leste, malnutrition is common among young girls because families have limited access to nutritious food. That makes it even more important for them to learn about nutrition and self-care. Through CRS nutrition classes, Adriana learned how iron prevents conditions like anemia and how protein and carbohydrates help her brain grow.

As we continue our Lenten journey, let us reflect on these Stories of Hope and consider where we fit into their broader story.

Do we see the face of Christ in others? What keeps us from recognizing others as God’s children? How can we respond with love?
