

FROM THE PASTOR



This weekend, we welcome Father Steven Olds who is with us for our multi-parish Lenten Mission. I am very grateful for Father Steven's generous offer to do our mission after the death of Father Jerry Kaywell. At a time of mourning at the death of his friend, Father Steven has worked hard to prepare for his time with us.

We will be at Saint Elizabeth Seton, starting this Sunday at 7:00 PM and will continue at the same time on Monday and Tuesday evenings. His theme is, "Memory, Mystery and Mission." We will have hospitality after each evening, so please come and plan to stay and meet people from Saint George, Saint Stephen, Saint Julie and Saint Elizabeth Seton. Looking forward to seeing you there!

The United States is at war. I write this on Monday, which means all kinds of things could have happened by the time you read this. The world will not miss the ayatollah. He was not a good man. Many Iranians both in Iran and across the world are glad to see him gone. President Trump and Prime Minister Netanyahu chose to make this offensive without gaining support of the United Nations or our allies. What is the endgame. What is the goal?

These are deeply moral questions. Our young men and women of the armed forces are being put in harm's way. Iran has been responsible for terror and death, including to their own people. That's how despots work. So how do we morally respond to that kind of evil?

Pope Leo said, "I am following with deep concern what is happening in the Middle East and Iran at this dramatic time. Stability and peace cannot be built through mutual threats or with weapons that sow destruction, pain and death. They can only be achieved through reasonable, genuine and responsible dialogue. Faced with the possibility of a tragedy of enormous proportion, I address a heartfelt appeal to the parties involved to assume moral responsibility to stop the spiral of violence before it becomes an irreparable abyss."

Just as the drug cartels sought revenge after the Mexican government killed one of the worst drug lords in the world, Iranian-sponsored terrorists may do the same. Iran has bombed several neighboring countries because of their cooperation with Israel and the United States.

We live in tense times. We can feel at the mercy of old men who send young people into war. Our most powerful tool for building peace is prayer and standing for our moral convictions. Together, we pray for and work towards a more just and peaceful world. We pray for all those serving our country here and abroad. Saint Michael the Archangel, intercede for them.

LENTEN REGULATIONS



Abstinance from meat is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years old and older on all the Fridays of Lent. Fasting is to be observed on Good Friday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 59. Those who are bound by this may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted. The special Paschal fast, as well as abstinence is also encouraged for Holy Saturday.


His doctoral thesis was awarded summa cum laude. He has extensive experience serving in parishes, giving retreats and serving as a spiritual director.




THANK YOU SAINT GEORGE PARISH

work across journalism, film, music, aviation, architecture, real estate, and politics has uniquely informed my ministry. Ordained over 30 years ago, I have served and mentored both youth and adults. My wife of 20 years, Dr. Kirsten, together we are proud parents to Savannah and Savoy—our greatest joy (and expense). My guiding belief: “Sometimes the only Jesus someone may see is the Jesus in you.”



A STORY OF HOPE FROM GUATEMALA

In the town of Janlay, Guatemala, the streets are filled with people wearing bright, colorful clothes that stand out against the bold green of the surrounding mountains. Many in the community are talented weavers—like Maribel, who creates traditional güipiles, the embroidered blouses worn by Indigenous women in Central America.



Maribel, 22, weaves traditional güipiles, embroidered blouses, to sell at the market near her home in Guatemala.

Maribel is also mom to a cheerful little girl named Juana, who—like many toddlers—keeps Maribel on her toes. “She’s a very healthy little girl. She loves running around the house. She’s the one who brings happiness to our home,” Maribel says.

But they face challenges too. When Juana was just four months old, Maribel’s husband had to travel far to find work. Maribel stayed home with Juana, doing her best to take care of her. She needed help. Then she joined a CRS program that offered nutrition classes, where she learned how to make healthy food choices for her family. Her family was used to eating chips and drinking soda, which made them feel tired and unwell. But after making changes to their diet, their health is improving.

Now, Maribel feeds Juana fruits, vegetables, eggs and hot cereal full of vitamins and protein. She also makes her own drinks instead of buying soda.

“The moment we stopped drinking soda, my mom started to feel better,” Maribel says. Now, her mom’s hands don’t hurt when she knits and she can stand up to wash clothes.

Maribel also learned that it’s important for her to take vitamins, like iron, because Juana receives them through her breast milk. “We learned that we need to stay healthy for our children, and not just as mothers. It’s important for all girls to take their vitamins so that we are well,” she says.

The program also taught families—and the whole community—how to save money and build better habits for everyday life.

Today, Maribel is thankful for the program. She says, “For all the support they’ve given us, we feel very grateful. Through healthy eating and the practice of saving, we have been able to improve our family’s health, nutrition and financial well-being.”






