FROM THE PASTOR



Last Sunday afternoon, Saint George hosted the Southwest Interfaith Team (SWIFT) forum. We had three representatives from the Jewish, Christian and Muslim faiths. Their theme is, "One God, Three Faiths." The session was very well-attended with people from a variety of places of worship in our community. I must admit, I felt a certain pride in our Christian representative who happened to be Catholic. She spoke about interfaith dialogue

very well, leaning into the documents of Vatican II which call for all people to respect each other's approach to God, even, and perhaps especially, when it doesn't coincide with our own. The Muslim representative was very engaging and informative. He is a far cry from the religious fanatics we see paraded on the news. The Jewish representative was the only Jew attending, and I think she may have felt a bit intimidated facing our crowd.

It is most important to understand that, regardless of what name is used, (i.e., God, Yahweh, or Allah) they all refer to the same God we call Our Father. All three of these faiths find their roots in Abraham and see themselves as sons and daughters of him. So our roots are inextricably entwined.

For several decades, Christians were viewed as a sort of sect within Judaism. With the destruction of the Temple of Solomon by the Romans in 70 AD, the split occurred. As is human nature, people blamed each other for this catastrophe. The Jews blamed the Christians as unfaithful, and the Christians blamed the Jews for rejecting the Messiah.

Muslims see Mohammad as the final prophet of Allah (God). He had visions of the angel Gabriel in 610 and began preaching in 613. Like Jews and Christians, Mohammad preached one God. The pillars of the Muslim life are: Testimony (living the words of Allah), Prayer, Fasting, Almsgiving and Pilgrimage. These are not far from Catholicism, are they? The one who believes in Allah and the hereafter, and does good deeds has nothing to fear (meaning no fears of hell).

The bitter truth is that none of our religions practice our faith as completely as we should. The Crusades were a terrible effort that started with at least some virtue but soon degenerated into pillage and robbery and violence. We see today's violence of Islamic terrorists. The horror of Nazism and the Holocaust are evils perpetrated against religions that stain all the children of Abraham.

We have much to learn. Last Sunday was a good conversation. It may not seem like much but if we are not willing to learn about each other, we lose the ability to find common ground. And that's where God lives.

CALCULATE YOUR CARBON FOOTPRINT.

Popes Leo XIV, Francis, Benedict XVI and John Paul II have all spoken of the need to address climate change. Climate is impacted by the amount of heat-trapping CO2 and other greenhouse gases (GHGs) in the atmosphere. Small increases in atmospheric GHG content can have a significant impact on Earth's temperature. That temperature rise can contribute to an increase in costly extreme weather events, harming the poor and future generations. Every day, what we do and consume contributes to GHG emissions. Calculators can help us better understand how much carbon is produced by different household activities. Then, if you decide to reduce your emissions, you'll know where you can generate the biggest impact. This link is easy to use:

ORGANIC DRIED MANGOS

Equal Exchange is inspired by Gebana, our primary partner for these mangoes. Gebana is one of the largest alternative traders in the world, consistently taking risks to support small farmers and help them gain control in the market. In Burkina Faso, the farmers who

grow the mangoes are organized into co-ops and the factory owned by Gebana, employs hundreds of local workers. These endeavors help the farming communities build a better economic future.



PALESTINIAN MEDJOOI DATES

These exceptionally large, luscious Medjool dates are soft and chewy with strong caramel notes. Enjoy as a sweet, healthy snack or add to recipes while cooking or baking.

These dates are grown by a 12-member farmer cooperative in the Jordan Valley, established in early 2000. Water shortages in the area forced farmers to seek out crops that needed less water to grow. Medjool dates not only require less water but can grow using the slightly salty water that sits under reservoirs of fresh water. These farmers work closely with the Palestinian Agricultural Relief Committee (PARC) who provide technical assistance, processing facilities, quality testing, and exporting services to get their dates inspected, cleaned, sorted, graded and packaged. PARC is a nonprofit organization that promotes the sustainable economic development of 41 farmer cooperatives, helps to improve water supply and critical infrastructure, and provides social services for women, children, and families in the West Bank.

LET CHICAGO’S POPE KNOW WE STAND BEHIND HIM!

WHAT IS THE HISTORY BEHIND THE FEAST OF THE EXALTATION OF THE HOLY CROSS?

Emperor Constantine’s mother, Helena, is credited with having discovered the true cross around 330. She traveled to the Holy Land and uncovered the places associated with Jesus’ life. Legend has it that Helena uncovered three crosses but was not able to detect the true cross until each of them was laid on a leper. Only one of them cured the leper, proving it to be the true cross. A great church was built at the site, and soon various portions of the cross were sent to other churches as relics to be venerated.

The day after the dedication of the Church of the Holy Sepulchre, September 14, 335, the actual cross was displayed for veneration. Egeria, a women traveler to Jerusalem around the year 386, kept a diary that has survived. She tells of the unique veneration of the wood of the cross that took place on Good Friday, something maintained ritually to this very day.

The Exaltation of the Holy Cross focuses on the gift of love that Jesus manifested by his total gift of self, offered for all. The cross, the ultimate form of capital punishment in its day, has become for us the ultimate symbol of love and triumph over evil and death.

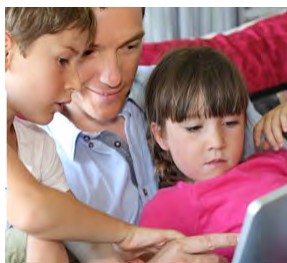
