FROM THE PASTOR



Last week, over 300 Chicago priests gathered for our semi-annual convocation. We heard wonderful talks, prayed several times each day together, and had a lot of laughs. It is also an opportunity to meet priests we don't know or to reconnect with friends. One priest who has a special place in the heart of Saint George is Father Chris Doering, who recently retired from

his military duties and has returned to parish life. It was an honor to give him one of our veteran's appreciation tokens. He was very touched. In the picture, you can see Father Chris hasn't changed! The young man to the left is Justin, who we met and is a reservist Marine. He is studying to become a Greek Orthodox priest. Keep both of these vets in your prayers for their future in ministry.



The talks we heard were very interesting and inspiring. They were intended to help us think more about how we can make synodality a reality on the parish level. OK, I know I may have lost you on that one. "Synodality" simply refers to how we can create an environment in the Church on a universal, diocesan and parish level to encourage greater communication, participation and co-responsibility between the clergy and laity. The notion of co-responsibility is to bring about a deeper sense of lay involvement and assistance in the ministry of the parish. You will be hearing more about this as time goes on.

Among the exciting things happening at Saint George is the infusion of new blood on our parish team. Next week you'll see more information about them but for now, let me introduce them. Barb Black has been assisting us with funerals for several months. Barb has vast experience in parish work. Her volunteerism is an inspiration. She meets with the families and helps them choose the readings, songs and other details of the liturgy. She also speaks with them to get details about the deceased's life. Barb is a gem!

Rosemary Sportiello has worked at Saint George in Children's Faith Formation as administrative assistant. She has a great deal of experience in retail management and customer service. She will be moving to the parish office as the lead receptionist (which has many more duties than just answering the phone!). Rosemary is a parishioner and has worked on many parish events.

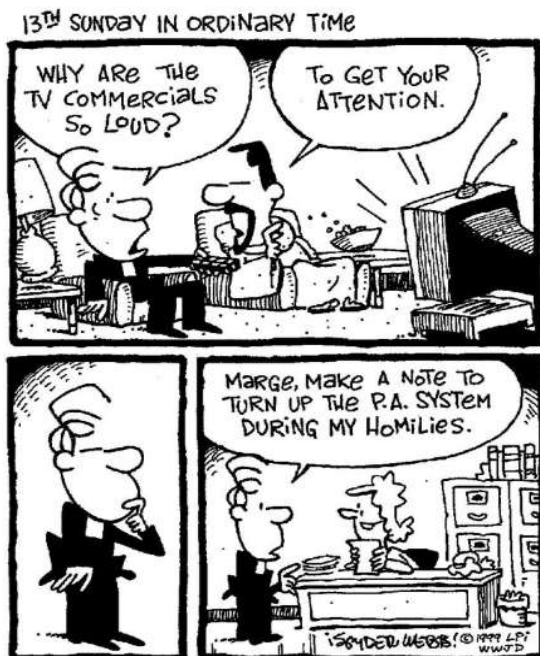

CREATION CARE CORNER

COOL EFFICIENTLY

Nearly half of the energy used in your home goes to heating and cooling. So making smart decisions about your home's heating, ventilating, and air conditioning (HVAC) system can have a big effect on your utility bills – as well as on fossil fuel energy consumption and Creation Care! Cooling tips include:

- Cover windows with drapes or shades especially on south and west facing windows.
- Weather-strip doors and windows, then add adequate insulation to keep the heat out.
- Regularly maintain home HVAC equipment and change filters. Programmable thermostats also save money.
- During the hottest part of the day, turn off anything that produces heat such as stoves, dishwashers, lights, etc. Also, consider turning up the thermostat temperature several degrees.
- If your AC is old, consider replacing with an Energy Star rated unit. Better yet, see if replacing it with a highly efficient heat pump will work for you (which can both heat and cool your home). For more info:

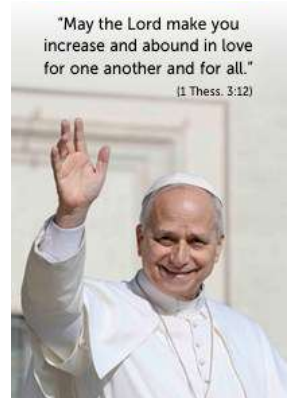

Our next meeting will be on Tuesday, July 7 at 6:30 PM in the Cahill Center- MRI. We hope to see you there!

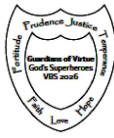

DISCERNMENT

Discernment, Explained!

We most often hear the term "discernment" when a man or woman prayerfully considers a religious vocation. This is a helpful context in which to think of the virtue of discernment, which all Christians are called to develop, lay and religious alike.

When a person hears a "call," he cannot simply go — he must first figure out where the call is coming from. It's not enough to simply have an idea of becoming a priest, a sister, a missionary, a husband, a wife — the idea needs a good, thorough background check. This is discernment, which "unmasks the lie of temptation, whose object appears to be good... when in reality its fruit is death," says the Catechism. (CCC 2846)

We run this background check of discernment on our feelings, our intentions, and our inclinations under the guidance of the Holy Spirit and through a diligent regimen of prayer and reflection. "The Spiritual Exercises of Saint Ignatius" is highly regarded as a useful tool for spiritual discernment.

PARISH INFORMATION

BAPTISMS will take place at 1:00 PM on the first Sunday of the month and at the 11:30 AM Sunday Mass on the third Sunday of the month. The family must be registered. A baptismal preparation program is obligatory in advance; please call the parish office to register and for more [information](#).

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION FOR ADULTS is a program for anyone inquiring and seeking information about entering the Catholic faith. Contact the parish office.

WEDDING arrangements must be made four months in advance of the wedding date. You must be a registered parishioner for six months prior to making arrangements. Please schedule your church date before reserving your hall.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK / RECONCILIATION can be arranged by contacting the Parish Office to have a priest celebrate the sacraments with the person who is seriously ill or homebound.

HOSPITAL VISITS can be made by our priests or deacons, if notified by family members or friends. Although sacramental needs of patients are administered by the hospital chaplain or by a local priest, in an emergency, Saint George clergy will respond to sacramental needs.

MINISTRY OF CARE: Mandated Agape Ministers of Care are available to visit, pray with, and bring Holy Communion to those who are sick and unable to attend Mass. Notify the parish office when this service is needed.

REGISTRATION: We welcome new members with open arms. Please call the parish office for additional information.

FUNERALS, BAPTISMS AND WEDDINGS: To make arrangements, please call the parish office at 708-532-2243.

STEWARDSHIP involves your time, talent and treasure. Contact the parish office for assistance in getting started in any of the Parish's ministries and organizations. Please remember Saint George Parish when planning your estate or preparing your will.

MASS: Each week, we celebrate a Sunday Vigil Mass on Saturday at 4:00 PM, and three Masses on Sunday — 7:30 AM, 9:30 AM and 11:30 AM, as well as a weekday Mass Monday through Friday at 8:15 AM.

The 4:00 PM Mass on Saturday and the 9:30 AM Mass on Sunday are broadcast via 101.7 FM to the parking lot. Please park on the east side of the parking lot by 175th Street. Communion will be brought to your car.

The Saturday 4:00 PM Anticipated Mass is live streamed on Facebook.

RECONCILIATION: Every Saturday from 3:00 PM to 3:30 PM

PRAY THE ROSARY: Please join us to pray the Rosary before morning Mass Monday through Friday starting at 7:45 AM.

ADORATION AND PRIVATE PRAYER: In church every Tuesday from 6:00 PM to 7:00 PM. 11:00 AM to Midnight Monday through Friday in the Adoration Chapel. You may come and go as is convenient for you during this time.
